Production history

These recordings were collected by Jon C. Altman between May 1979 and November 1980 in North Central Arnhem Land during anthropological fieldwork. The main purpose of the fieldwork was to examine the economic system of Aboriginal outstations. Altman also attended numerous ceremonies with his hosts, some of which are captured on these tapes. Included are part of a Midjan ceremony, Mamurr ceremonies, a Gadigadi (Sea-bird) song, a Mimi (Spirit people) song, a Bongolingbongoling song cycle, a Marradirri song cycle, a Bukabut ceremony and a Lorrkun ceremony. The main singers are Jimmy Bungurru, Kevin Djimarr, Frank Gadigadi, Caruso Guningbal, Les Midiguria, George Smith Mibaralla, Jacki Marbuma and Dick Budji. During his fieldwork, Altman primarily resided with eastern Gunwinggu people at Momega outstation, but the ceremonies on these tapes are representative of numerous cultural groupings from Central Arnhem Land.

Jon Altman was a PhD candidate at the time the recordings were made. He is now Professor and Director of the Centre for Aboriginal Economic Policy Research at the Australian National University. The collection was deposited at AIATSIS on 18 September 1984.
