# **Production history**

These recordings were collected between 14 October 1990 and and 20 June 1991 by Danielle Flakelar near Narrabri and Dubbo, NSW. The field trips were funded by a grant from the Australian Institute of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies (AIATSIS) and the purpose was to document the interviewees' history, experiences, achievements and poetry. The speakers who participated in this research are Terry Doolan, Bill Reid, Jean Hamilton and poetry readings by Frank Doolan. The collection was deposited with AIATSIS on 30 April 1993.
