Production history

These recordings were collected by David Hopkins in 1980 on the north coast of New South Wales. They document oral histories about the Yellow Rock Mission in NSW, including race relations, the Aboriginal Protection Board, Legal Aid, housing, comparisons between Indigenous and non-Indigenous value systems, contemporary problems, several personal histories of the Huskisson and Yellow Rock Mission areas, beliefs, information on rations, health issues, land control and ownership, and early life, as given by interviewees Richard Kelly, Mrs Stewart, Joyce Knox, Andrew Pacey, Lenard D'Silva, Norman Pacey, Robert D'Silva, Bob Roberts and Patricia Ann Roberts. The collection was deposited with AIATSIS on 23 March 1980.
