Production history

These recordings contain oral history interviews of Indigenous people from Kuranda and the surrounding area, including Ngoonbi Farm, Mantaka, Mona Mona, and Cairns.

The recordings were collected during the 'After 200 Years' photographic project by Luke Taylor and AIATSIS in 1986.

Speakers include Rhonda Brim, Lyn Hobbler, Erna Hunter, Judy Enoch, Lance Riley, Tasman Snider, Charity Mango, Elaine Chookie, Willie Brim, Myrna Hobson, Sherry Anne Diamond, Peter Diamond, and Finlay Grogan.

The recordings were collected during the 'After 200 Years' photographic project by Luke Taylor and AIATSIS in 1986. The 'After 200 Years' project took place over three years in the 1980s during which over 50,000 images were collected. Photographers and AIATSIS staff worked in collaboration with twenty communities for periods of up to two months each. Their aim was to create a partnership in which the diversity of contemporary life for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in Australia was documented, counter to a prevailing and often rigid and negative documentary photographic tradition.
