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#### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

**Date:** 1965-1966

**Extent:** 6 sound tape reels (ca. 60 min. each) : analogue, 3 3/4 ips, mono. ; 5 in.

#### **Production history**

These recordings were collected by AIAS grantee Janet Mathews between 9 November 1965 and 26 July 1966 on the South Coast of New South Wales. They feature brief interviews with Wally Monsally, Percy Mumbulla, Sid Duncan, Frank Cooper, Micky Drew, Reg McLeod, Alice Kearns, Agnes Harrison, Mrs Thomas, Celia Bond, Sister Bernice Smith and Percy Davis. The interviews focus on vocabulary elicitation, interspersed with some oral history and cultural discussions.

The collection was deposited at AIATSIS by Janet Mathews on 16 September 1966.

#### **ARCHIVIST'S NOTE**

This finding aid was compiled from information contained in documentation provided by Janet Mathews and audition sheets prepared by AIATSIS staff. Relatives of Alice Kearns contacted AIATSIS in January 2011 and confirmed that her language was in fact Southern Ngarigo. Mrs Kearns was also recorded in 1963 and 1964 by Luise Hercus, who called the language Southern Ngarigo. The language appears as Birdawal on Mathews' original field tape report sheet, but this appears to be incorrect.

The recordings are not in strict chronological order and some announcements have clearly been added later.

Notes:	Another man, by the name of Bruce, is announced at 00:57:22, but he is not listed on the field tape report sheet and his surname is difficult to make out on the recording. It doesn't sound like he contributes to the discussion. Janet Mathews comments that Frank Cooper speaks Dharawal, possibly with some Wiradjuri (or Ngunawal or northern Ngarigo?) words learnt from his father, who was from Yass.

Notes:	Janet Mathews comments that Frank Cooper speaks Dharawal, possibly with some Wiradjuri (or Ngunawal or northern Ngarigo?) learnt from his father, who was from Yass. Mickey Drew identifies as <i>Keepara</i> , which could be a reference to the word used for initiations on the mid-North Coast of NSW, also referred to in the recording. He mentions two other people from Burnt Bridge who speak his language: Chris de Silva and Len de Silva. There are various recordings of Len de Silva in the AIATSIS Audiovisual Archive; he identifies as a Gumbaynggir speaker. Gumbaynggir is closely related to Dhanggatti, which is the main language around Kempsey, where Mr Drew was from originally.
