Production history

The recordings were collected between 1976 and 1985 by musicologist Douglas Myers during fieldwork at South Pacific Festivals of Art at Rotorua, New Zealand, Port Moresby, Papua and New Guinea and Tahiti, French Polynesia. Music from Mornington Island, Queensland, is also recorded. The purpose of the field trips was to document the traditional music Indigenous Australians and other Pacific countries. Performers include Djoli Laiwanga, Long Lin, Long Stephen, Hickey Hood, Lofty, David (Blanasi ?), George (Jangawanga ?) and many unidentified participants during the festivals. The collection was deposited with AIATSIS on 19 May 2016.
