Production history

These recordings were collected by Carl Georg von Brandenstein between 15 July 1971 and 29 March 1976 in the Pilbara and Goldfields area, Western Australia, and in northern New South Wales. Von Brandenstein obtained a grant from the Australian Institute of Aboriginal Studies in 1970/1971 to investigate the languages of western and south-western Western Australia. Some of the earlier recordings in this collection may have been created as a result of that grant. The collection features narratives and songs in various Pilbara languages, including Jiwarli, Ngarluma, Nyiyaparli; songs in Ngiyambaa, Bundjalung and other languages, recorded in northern New South Wales; and three songs recorded in the Goldfields area of Western Australia.
