Answer: We do have inmates with HIV. The Galveston County Jail works with the Galveston County Health District to identify HIV for treatment and the vendor provides the HIV medication.

Answer: There is an infection control coordinator onsite 40 hours per week. There is also a county agreement with the Galveston County Health District and Galveston County Jail to provide public health issues.

Answer: Under the current/temporary MOU, the county is responsible for these costs; however, at the end of the MOU there is a true-up process where these costs will be taken into account to ensure the county is made whole.

Question #74: *Please describe the main job responsibilities for the mental health professionals (MHPs) and please be as specific as possible with describing their delivery of services.*

Answer: There is an onsite MD 16 hours per week to provide psychiatric services, a license Master Social Worker 40 hours per week to do evaluations and see mental health inmates and refer psychiatric treatment as needed and a Mental Health RN 40 hours per week to transcribe order medications and perform wellness checks on mental health inmates.

Question #75: *What is the accessibility for inmates requiring acute psychiatric hospitalizations when care and treatment is beyond the scope of practice on-site? How many inmates were transferred to your acute psychiatric hospital(s) over the past 3 years (2012, 2013, and 2014) and 2015 to date?*

Answer: See Attachment entitled Amendment to Professional Psychiatric Services Agreement, Galveston County Jail

Question #76: *What is your process for inmates that meet requirements for involuntary hospitalization?*

Answer: All inmates are hospitalized by Doctor's order or Court ordered by a Judge.

Question #77: *Where does the county send inmates requiring inpatient Psychiatric treatment?*

Answer: It is the responsibility of Gulf Coast Center and they make the determination/based on charges

Question #78: *How many inmates were found Incompetent to stand trial over the past 3 years (2012, 2013, and 2014) and 2015 to date? What has been the average length of time inmates wait pending transfer to the state hospital? Is the county interested in an on-site restoration of competency, ROC, program as part of the mental/behavioral health programs and services?*

Answer: Determined by the Galveston County Courts.

Answer: Yes.

Answer: Family notification and if necessary transferred to the Emergency Room.

Question #82: *Which provider currently provides inmate pharmaceuticals and intravenous (IV) solutions to Galveston County? What has been the county's pharmaceutical and IV expenditure amounts over the past 3 years (2012, 2013, and 2014) and 2015 to date?*

Answer: Provider will secure on contracted pharmaceutical service.

Answer: Inhaler (Per MD order), Bacitracin Ointment, Neosporin, Tolnaftate, Hydrocortisone Cream

Question #84: *What type of pharmacy license does the county currently hold? Is it a custodial or clinic license, if it's a clinic license do you have a site DEA license?*

Answer: No.

Answer: Vendor is requested to contract own pharmaceutical service.

Answer: Walgreens.

Question #87: *Please provide the top 25 most prescribed pharmaceuticals. Please provide the 25 most prescribed psychotropic. Please provide dosage and annual pricing for each.*

Answer: Based on inmate diagnosis and provider order.

Question #88: *Does the county allow for inmates' family members to provide inmates' medications?*

Answer: Yes, until ordered by vendor.

Question #89: *Are the county's inmates provided a supply of medications upon release? If so, how much supply is provided and describe how this is managed?*

Answer: Yes, based on prescribed medication, released inmates may request a limited prescription be called in to the pharmacy of their choice for meds inmate was currently taking.

Question #90: *Are inmates charged a co-pay for medication, sick calls/doctors' visits? If so, how much are the co-pay amounts? How are inmate co-pays currently managed?*

Answer: Not currently.

Question #91: *Does the county or the current provider take part in a local methadone maintenance program that provides methadone to the county's incarcerated population?*

Answer: ONLY for pregnant females...

Question #92: *Are the medical offices and/or the infirmary equipped to provide OB-GYN services? Would the county like to see general and non-delivery based OBGYN services provided on-site?*

Answer: We have a Nurse/Mid-Wife onsite 2 hours per week. PRN or OB Physician provides delivery.

Question #93: *Page 36, section W. of the RFP requires TB testing to be conducted on correctional personnel, for the purposes of this RFP, how many should be considered?*

Answer: Pre-employment physicals and annual testing (Refer to RFP).

Question #94: *Which jail management system (JMS) is currently being utilized at the jail?*

Answer: JMS

Question #95: *Will the selected company have any financial responsibility for IT support, IT system operations, maintenance, upgrades or other costs associated with implementation or ongoing use of the CorEMR System?*

Answer: Galveston County provides computer hardware and network connectivity for our medical vendor. Any tie back to vendor headquarters would be at the vendor's expense.

Question #96: *Will the county entertain recommendations for changing to another EMR System if it can be demonstrated that a proposed alternative system would provide some significant advantages over CorEMR?*

Answer: No.

Question #97: *Please provide a copy of the current agreement between Gulf Coast and Boon Chapman for mental health services.*

Answer: Currently a nurse/mid-wife provides OB services two hours per week/PRN on site.

Question #99: *We were given the old 24/7 staffing schedule under the CONMED Contract, but it doesn't work for the current staffing levels shown on page 21 of the RFP. Please give us the current 24/7 staff scheduling plan.*

Answer: See Attachments entitled Administration Schedule and Clinical Schedule

Question #100: *How many inmate offsite cases over the past 3 years, by year, exceeded the \$100k offsite annual cap per inmate?*

Answer: None.

Question #101: *What is the average number of prescriptions filled per month for the past 12 months?*

Answer: The average number of fills is 1,552 for the last 12 months.

Question #102: *How many medications are or what percentage is dispensed as stock?*

Answer: All patient specific medications are filled in blister cards. The year ending April 2015, the percentage was 4.8%

Question #103: *Do you receive stock in 30-count blister cards? Or is all stock in manufacturers' bulk bottles?*

Answer: The facility uses manufactures' blister cards and bulk bottles.

Question #104: *What percentage of your inmates, if any, are Federal?*

**AMENDMENT TO
PROFESSIONAL PSYCHIATRIC SERVICES AGREEMENT
GALVESTON COUNTY JAIL**

THIS Amendment is made and entered into this 1st Day of March 2015, by and between THE GULF COAST CENTER, a community center and an agency of the State of Texas under the provisions of Chapter 534 of the *Texas Health & Safety Code Ann.* (Vernon 1992), as amended, (the "Authority") and BOON-CHAPMAN (the "Contractor"), for the purpose of providing specialized services currently not available to the Authority through its present staff of employees.

WHEREAS, the Gulf Coast Center and CareHere, a subcontractor performing services on behalf of Boon-Chapman entered into a Professional Psychiatric Services Agreement ("Agreement") effective October 1, 2013, for comprehensive psychiatric and mental health services and pharmacy services in the Galveston County Jail;

WHEREAS, both the Gulf Coast Center and Boon-Chapman desire to amend the original Agreement as indicated below:

NOW, THEREFORE for and in consideration of the foregoing and in further consideration of the mutual benefits, the parties agree as follows:

Pursuant to the terms of Agreement and Exhibit A.2, the Agreement is amended as follows:

I. The parties to this agreement shall be the Gulf Coast Center and Boon-Chapman who has the discretion to subcontract the provision services under this agreement as it did under the CareHere agreement.

II. Effective March 1, 2013, Exhibit A.2. is hereby revised and replaced with the following:

2. The Authority has agreed to fund sixteen (16) hours of psychiatric services coverage performed by a medical doctor, nurse practitioner or physician assistant as well as sixty (60) hours or 2 FTE for Licensed Professional Counselor/Mental Health Professional Staff position (employee) for Contractor. The primary responsibility of these individuals will include the screening, assessment, crisis intervention, patient education and psychiatric consultation of those individuals in the Galveston County Jail. There may also be a need for on call services including availability when not at the jail. The psychiatrist and mental health professional will be an employee and/or independent contractor of Contractor. Termination and/or discipline of these individuals rest solely with the Contractor.

The amendment specifically addresses the identity of the parties to the agreement as well as that a nurse practitioner or physician assistant is acceptable a provider of the psychiatric services coverage. All other terms and provisions of the Agreement not amended hereby shall remain in full force and effect. In the event of any inconsistency between the terms of this Amendment and the Agreement, the terms of this Amendment shall govern and control.
