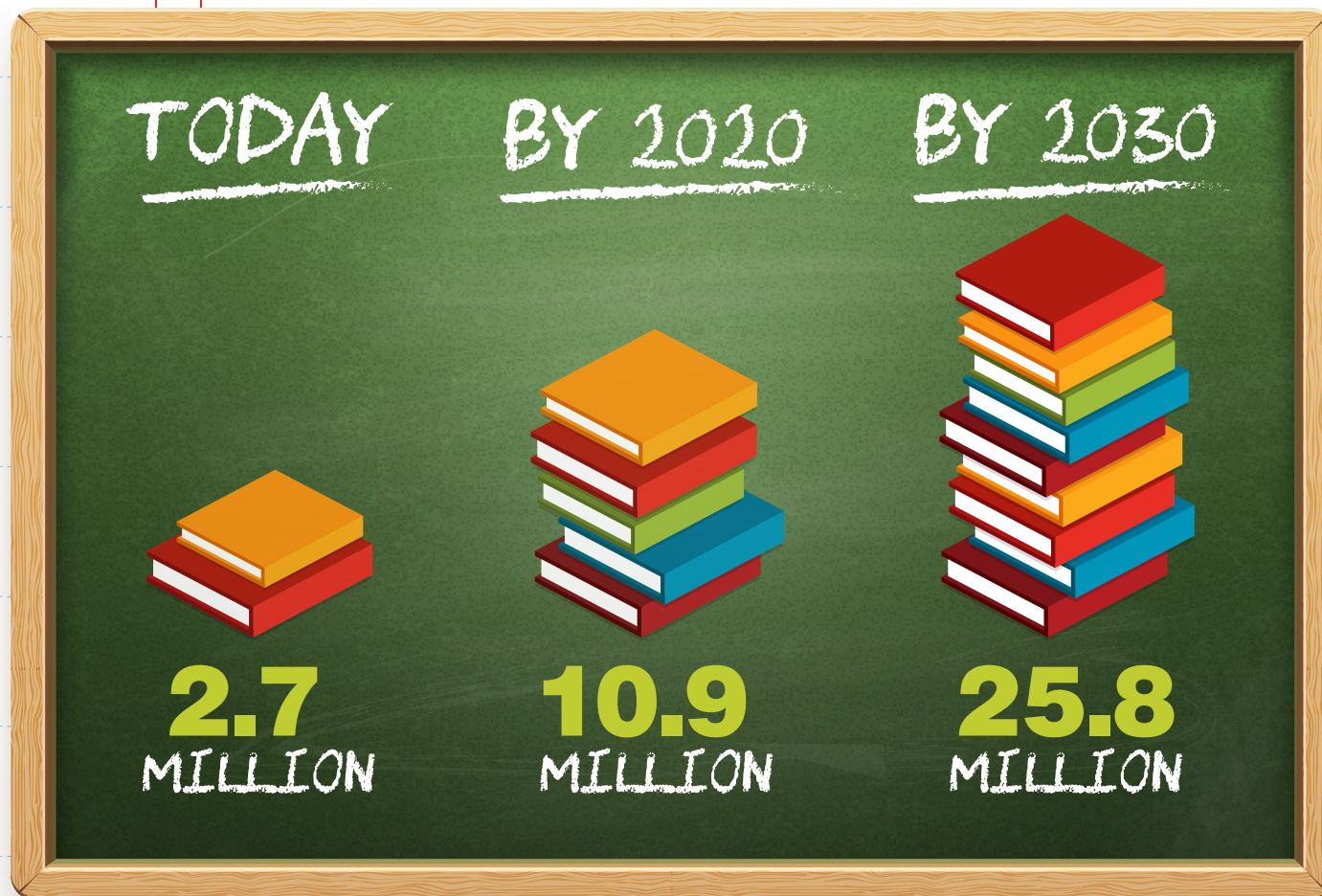


HOW MANY TEACHERS ARE NEEDED TO PROVIDE EVERY CHILD WITH A PRIMARY EDUCATION?

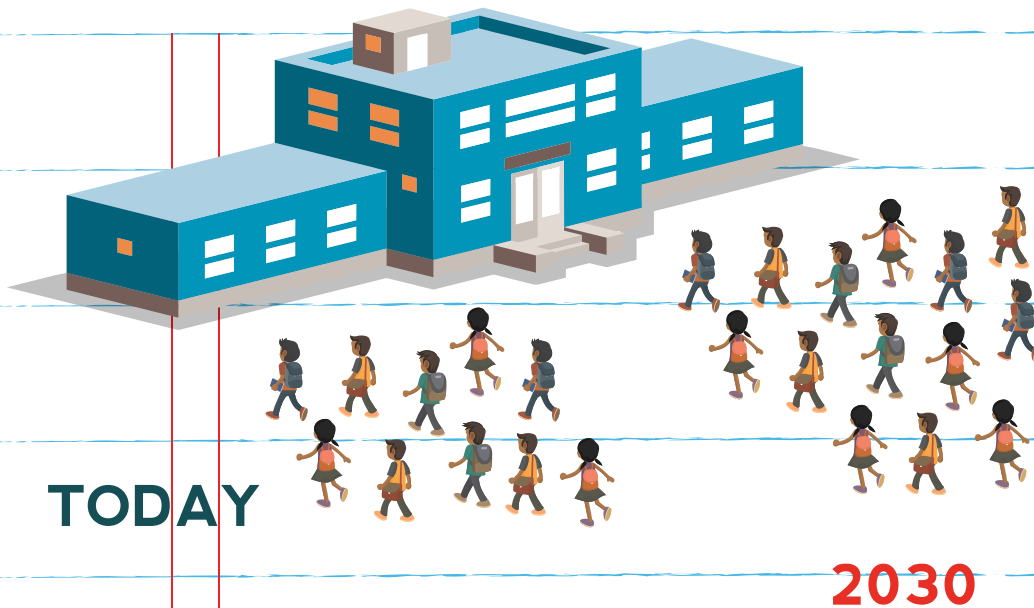

For every **100 children** of age to start school today, there will be **142 in 2030**.

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EDUCATION 2030: CANNOT HAPPEN WITHOUT TRAINED TEACHERS IN CLASSROOMS
