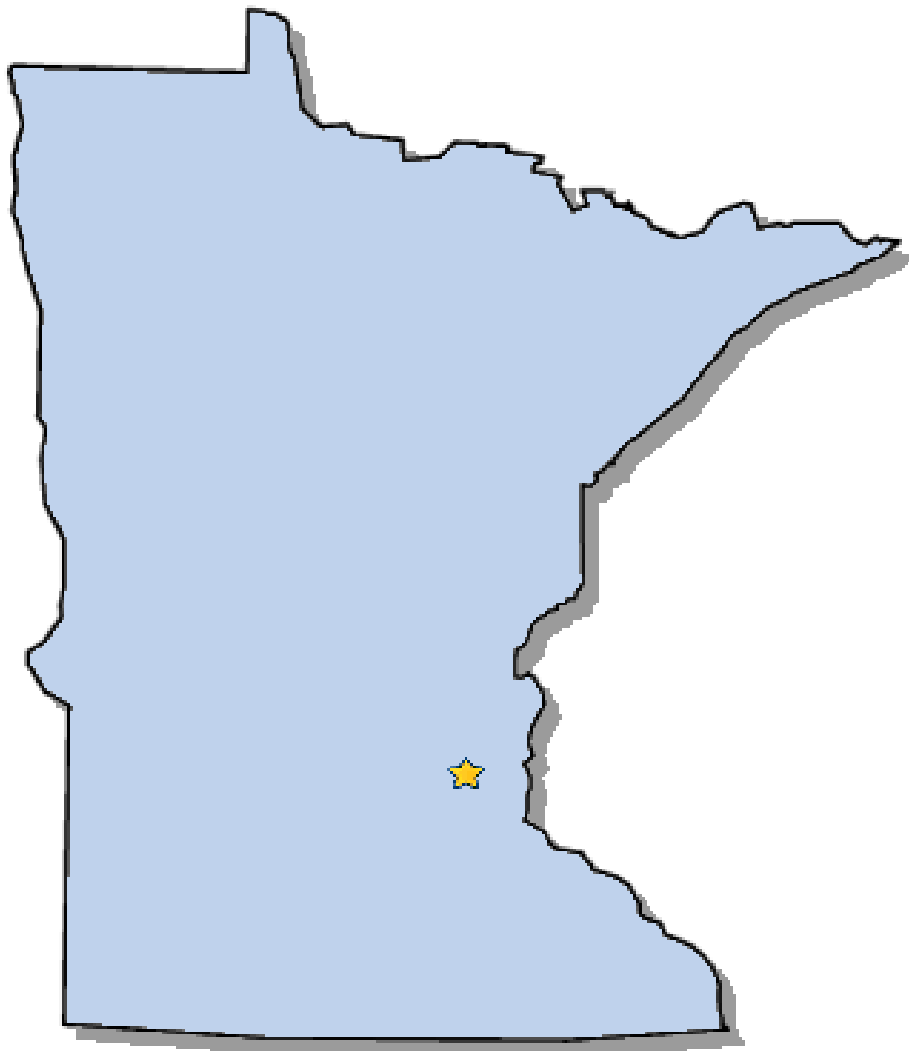


AFSCME Council 5 2015 AND 2016 LEGISLATIVE VOTING RECORDS

An examination and explanation of votes taken by your elected officials - crucial votes, impacting the lives of workers across Minnesota.



2016 Minnesota Legislative Session

House

1. BANNING PRIVATE PRISONS

- House Amendment to Omnibus Public Safety Bill to ban private prisons. The amendment would prohibit the State of Minnesota from housing inmates in a privately owned correctional facility.

A “Yes” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

2. RATIFYING OUR STATE CONTRACT

- House bill to ratify AFSCME contracts. The bill also contained several “Right to Work” provisions.

A “No” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

3. REMOVING DESTRUCTIVE PROVISIONS TO RATIFY CONTRACT

- House amendment to contract ratification bill. The amendment would put all contracts into one bill for a clean vote on the House Floor.

A “Yes” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

4. PROTECTING OUR PENSIONS

- House amendment to preserve cost of living adjustment to pension plans for retirees. The amendment would maintain the COLA of 2% for public employees.

A “Yes” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

5. BONDING TO PRESERVE AND BUILD OUR STATE

- The House bonding bill did not include the Department of Natural Resources full request.
- The House did not include the full request of the Department of Corrections.
- The House did not include the full request for the Department of Human Services.

A “No” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

SENATE

1. FUNDING FOR SAFE STAFFING AND STATE AGENCIES

- The Senate's supplemental budget included money to fund the deficiency within State Operated Community Services, money for the Minnesota Security Hospital, and money to increase beds and staffing within Direct Care and Treatment.
- The bill funded the Department of Corrections increased staffing levels as well as an appropriation of \$10,442,000 to cover the increased costs of compensation.
- The bill included an increased appropriation of \$5.1 million for Parks and Trails Management.

A "Yes" vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

2. RATIFYING THE STATE CONTRACT

- This vote was to ratify our Labor contract.

A "Yes" vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

3. IMPOSING COLLECTIVE BARGAINING RESTRICTIONS

- This amendment would have required all future labor contract settlements to not exceed the appropriation provided by the Legislature to the relevant agency in a given year. This would have inserted the Legislature directly into the negotiation process and diminish our Union's ability to collectively bargain.

A "No" vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

4. BONDING AMENDMENT

- The amendment would have diverted funding from Corrections, Health & Human Services, Courthouse Security, Transportation, Higher Education and Natural Resources to fund partisan projects.

A "Yes" vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

5. SLASHING FUNDING FOR STATE AGENCIES AND EDUCATION

- The amendment eliminated the appropriations for HHS, Public Safety, E-12 Education, Higher Education and Natural Resources and appropriated over \$463 million in cash for earmarked transportation projects rather than the historical practice to bond for transportation projects. A dangerous precedent.

A "No" vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

2015 Minnesota Legislative Session

House

1. MINIMUM WAGE CUT

- The bill attempted to repeal, lower, and even freeze minimum wage for workers who earn a portion of their wages from tips.

A “No” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

2. HOUSE OMNIBUS HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES BILL

- The House made drastic cuts and left out crucial spending pieces. In the end, they passed an unbalanced bill that left working Minnesotans behind.
 - i. Minnesota Care – Cut affordable health insurance for nearly 100,000 low-income, working Minnesotans.
 - ii. Child Care Assistance Program – Cut nearly \$23 million for working Minnesotans from the Senate’s bill
 - iii. Cost of Living Increases - Did not even include a modest cost of living increase for state employees at the Minnesota Sex Offender program and State Operated Services. Cut over \$14 million from the Senate bill.
 - iv. Minnesota Security Hospital – Cut the \$11 million needed to make corrections under the conditional license.
 - v. Phantom Savings – Included hundreds of millions of dollars in “fake savings” by using legislative gimmicks. As a result, the budget passed by the House was not even balanced.

A “No” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

3. PROVIDING BENEFITS FOR WORKING PARENTS

- An amendment was authored to include provisions of the Working Parents Act which included Earned Sick and Safe Time and Paid Family Leave. On a procedural vote, the amendment was ruled out of order. AFSCME supports the Working Parents Act.

A “No” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

4. OPPOSING CORPORATE TAX CUTS

- a. The House tax bill had a total cost of \$5.6 billion for the 2016-17 biennium. It is a bill that largely benefited the wealthiest Minnesotans. The three most egregious provisions:
 - i. **LGA Reduction**- \$82.6 million over the 2016-17 biennium (This is revenue that Minneapolis, St. Paul, Duluth and other communities rely on to pay city employee wages).
 - a. Minneapolis - \$34.4 million cut
 - b. St. Paul - \$30.2 million cut
 - c. Duluth - \$29.9 million cut
 - ii. **Elimination of Statewide Property Tax for C&I Property** - \$1.7 billion over the 2016-17 biennium. This was the largest of the tax giveaways and it benefited large, metro corporations. There was nothing for homeowners.
 - iii. **Estate Tax** - \$318 million over the biennium. The provision was targeted to the highest valued estates.

A “No” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

5. HOUSE OMNIBUS HIGHER EDUCATION BILL

- a. This bill would have severely underfunded Minnesota’s State Colleges & Universities and the University of Minnesota. It would have forced massive increases in tuition.

A “No” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

SENATE

1. **OMNIBUS TAX BILL**

- LGA increased by \$21.5 million over the 2016-17 biennium.
- CPA increased by \$25 million over the 2016-17 biennium.
- Closed corporate loopholes.
- Targeted property tax refund. The threshold would have been lowered from 12% to 10%. This is the property tax refund, with no income cap, for people whose property taxes saw a big jump over one year.
- Increased the budget reserve by \$250 million.
- No significant changes in the Estate Tax. The changes that were included were technical in nature with a minor fiscal impact of \$50,000/year.

A “Yes” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

2. **OMNIBUS E-12 BUDGET BILL**

- Increased funding for Minnesota’s public schools.

A “Yes” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

3. **OMNIBUS HIGHER EDUCATION BILL**

- Increased funding for Minnesota State Colleges & Universities and the University of Minnesota.

A “Yes” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

4. **OMNIBUS TRANSPORTATION BILL**

- The bill provided a long-term, sustainable, and comprehensive statewide transportation package.

A “Yes” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.

5. **OMNIBUS HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES BILL**

- In the Senate, a thoughtful and balanced Health and Human Services bill was crafted and passed. In an effort to lift up Minnesotans, it included the following important spending initiatives:
 - i. **Minnesota Care** – Continue to pay for Minnesota Care so that working Minnesotans have access to affordable health insurance.

- ii. **Child Care Assistance Program** – Appropriated nearly \$20 million to help reduce the waiting list for the Basic Sliding Fee so low-income, working Minnesotans can afford to put their children in child care.
- iii. **Cost of Living Increases for State Employees** – Over \$14 million for state employees at the Minnesota Sex Offender Program and State Operated Services was appropriated for increases to wages and benefits.
- iv. **Minnesota Security Hospital** – Included over \$11 million in funding for the Minnesota Security Hospital conditional license corrections.
- v. **Phantom Savings** – The Senate’s budget was well-balanced and did not include any gimmicks to create “fake savings.”

A “Yes” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME position.
