- 2. The space available

- 4. The availability of qualified and other personnel to handle the collection



We have worked with divers institutions and individuals, tailoring our methods to accommodate each. Typical methods have included:


- In some select cases we have purchased entire libraries, sorted through them, supplemented them with books from our store and other purchases, and sent the result, a newly constituted and sizable library, to the new institution.
- In the case of smaller institutions, particularly religious houses, we very often can constitute an entire library simply from our present holdings.
- In other situations, we have agreed on a monthly or annual budget with an existing library. We then select books both from our store and as we newly acquire them. The selection is based on the fittingness of particular books to the library's collection and whether the library already possesses the books. This method allows a library to acquire good and relevant books with minimal expenditure of effort. In effect, we work as an acquisitions agent for the library.
- In the event the institution is possessed of an acquisitions librarian or bibliophilic scholar, we often will host him at our premises and assist him in the selection of books.

These are but a few of the more common scenarios. But whatever the situation, we are ready to work with you to design and build a library suited to your needs.
