

Correlation Table

The fields of Legislation, Statutory Interpretation, and Election Law have much overlap, but likely no single course covers all the material in this book (and no doubt, some courses in these areas cover issues that are not described in this book). On the next two pages, you will find a table that matches up the material in this book with the chapters in most of the casebooks in the Legislation and Election Law fields.
