

MIFF LAUNCHES INTO ITS FINAL WEEK WELCOMING ALEX ROSS PERRY, JONATHAN GOLD, DU HAIBIN AND PLENTY MORE GUESTS

EXTRA SCREENINGS ANNOUNCED INCLUDING JUSTIN KURZEL'S MACBETH

MELBOURNE, 10 AUGUST 2015 – The **2015 Melbourne International Film Festival** (MIFF) is entering its final week with a inviting line-up of films, events and festival guests, including a surprise screening of Justin Kurzel's highly anticipated new feature, *Macbeth*, starring Marion Cotillard and Michael Fassbender.

This week MIFF welcomes **Alex Ross Perry** (*Listen Up Philip*, MIFF 14) to present **Queen of Earth**, a psychological drama about an unravelling friendship between two women, starring *Mad Men's* Elisabeth Moss; Chinese director **Du Haibin** (*1428*, MIFF 2009) is in town to promote his ideological existentialist **A Young Patriot**; and Filipino filmmaker **Khavn de la Cruz**, with his dialogue-free, most ambitious film to date, **Ruined Heart: Another Love Story Between a Criminal and a Whore**.

MIFF also welcomes the world's only Pulitzer prize-winning food writer, **Jonathan Gold**, who stars in the culinary tour across Los Angeles, **City of Gold**; Iranian director **Nima Javidi** with his feature film, **Melbourne**, a psychological drama in which good people are forced to confront troubling circumstances; and Australian war correspondent **Michael Ware** delivers a gripping, sometimes brutal document of the past in **Only the Dead**.

Two films supported by the MIFF Premiere Fund will receive their world premieres at the festival this week: Lawrence Johnston's (Fallout, MIFF 2013) Neon, a documentary celebrating the beauty, romance and art of neon lighting; and Richard Lowenstein and Lynn-Marie Milburn's (Autoluminescent, MIFF 2013) Ecco Homo, a portrait of provocateur, artist and performer Troy Davies. MIFF welcomes the directors to the festival.

Marking 17 days of film, MIFF's **Closing Night** celebrations will include a screening of **Mistress America**, the irresistible new feature from director **Noah Baumbach** and actor **Greta Gerwig**. Spinning from idiosyncratic buddy flick to all-out screwball farce, the film sees Baumbach and Gerwig working together again following the success of *Frances Ha* (MIFF 2013).

MIFF is thrilled to present the Australian premiere and a surprise screening of *Macbeth*, following its world premiere at the Cannes Film Festival. *Macbeth* screens 4pm Sunday 16 August at Hoyts.

Directed by MIFF Accelerator alumnus **Justin Kurzel** (*Tim Winton's The Turning*, MIFF 2013 and *Snowtown*), *Macbeth* stars a brilliantly imposing **Michael Fassbender** in the title role, with **Marion Cotillard** extraordinary as Lady Macbeth. A radical adaptation of the Scottish play, it transforms the Bard's bloody tale of unchecked ambition into a brutal psychological study of grief and trauma. Shot on location in Scotland, the film's ominously purgatorial atmosphere is rendered exquisite by *Snowtown* cinematographer and MIFF Accelerator alumnus **Adam Arkapaw** (who also lensed *Animal Kingdom* and *True Detective*), while The Mess Hall's **Jed Kurzel** re-joins his brother to provide the evocatively moody score.
