

DID YOU KNOW THAT...

- 1. "Theft of services" or "farebeating" now makes up the highest number of arrests by the NYPD -- over 29,000 in 2015 & **92% involving people of color**
- 2. Many if not most farebeating arrests occur when officers (including plainclothes cops) hide in places on subway platforms outside people's line of vision & emerge when someone tries to sneak onto the train
- 3. The theft of services arrests frequently result in **the defendant spending a day or two in jail. At arraignment the judge often imposes a fine** that the defendant likely cannot pay, which adds to her/his economic stress
