Capital and the State are spreading devastation into every corner of the globe, poisoning those lands they haven't yet stolen where a few still manage to create their lives on their own terms. Just as the homeless are not simply individuals who love sleeping in doorways and under bridges, so immigrants are not just carefree nomads wandering for the love of adventure; migration across national borders is a strategy for attempting to take back control of one's life. The fact that these people then find themselves undocumented, facing travel bans and border walls, is the most blatant expression of the precarity that capitalism is imposing on all of us. Those who respond by refusing to submit to borders drawn by our rulers find themselves criminalized, defined by racist propaganda as dangerous and criminal elements.

In every country, capitalism needs cheap labor. The most desperate, those who live in daily fear of capture and deportation, are the most easily blackmailed. If they don't accept the worst conditions at the lowest pay, they become disposable and can be turned over to the authorities. In turn, politicians present these immigrants to local workers as a threat to their own precarious jobs, using this as blackmail to enforce servility among all the exploited. Such racist and nationalist ideologies have always served to erode solidarity between immigrants and those "native-born" workers who persist in the delusion that they have more in common with the bosses who exploit them. This is the lie of the citizen and the "illegal."
