STEVE SHELDY INTERVIEW

INTERVIEW AND PHOTOGRAPHS FROM THE PERTH BIG DAY OUT BY GUY, YOUR PERTH CORRESPONDENT

This interview was recorded at the end of the Big Day Out in Perth on January 30th. It was interrupted at various times by Nick Cave and Matt Lutkin from Mudhoney having a wrestling match, Lee Ranaldo grabbing hold of the microphone and screaming his lungs out and the Disposable Heroes of Hiphoprisy bursting in and attacking everyone with water pistols. I didn't mind...

woozy: Why is 'Dirty' better than 'Nevermind'?

STEVE: Because you hear most of the songs off 'Nevermind' on the radio for free? You might as well spend your money on something that isn't on as much. I mean 'Nevermind' is a great record too, but it did get to a point where we had all kind of heard it a lot. Nevertheless, it's a great record.


woozy: Do you think that each of your side-projects, like Kitten, the Dim Stars and Mosquito, have helped keep the band together for so long?


STEVE: Yeah, they definitely have. It's good to be able to go off and play with other people and get away from the people you usually play with. You learn a lot, you discover things that maybe you wouldn't come across when you're in a familiar situation. It definitely adds a lot of new life to the band.

woozy: How do you think this acceptance of "underground" bands by major labels will affect the small indie labels all these 'next big things' are being taken from?

STEVE: I think it's going to clean them out for a while, cause it's true in a way the majors have taken all the hot indie bands, hoping to make some money off them, but I think ultimately it'll be good.

A lot of the bands will be taken in a new context, some of them will succeed, a lot of them will fail and break up, take the money and run, that sort of thing. But again, ultimately, it'll be really good for the indie scene, in that a new unknown thing will happen there - like in the States right now, we have bands like Sebadoh and Pavement and Royal Trux. They're really great bands, and they don't show any signs of being on major labels just yet. It's still a healthy scene indie-wise, there are good bands on major labels now, and there are still a lot of good bands that are still too far out for the majors.





WOODY: Well, it's obvious at the moment that all the majors are looking to the indie labels now for the wonderful shining next big thing, but all they're taking on board are more Nirvana-likes and Sonic Youth-likes.

STEVE: Yeah, well those will also be the worst discoveries, the next Sonic Youth and the next Nirvana. It's the next band that you didn't expect, that's what's going to be great.

WOODY: Is America a sick place?

STEVE: Yes. Sick and beautiful.

WOODY: How do those two qualities come together?

STEVE: Well, they don't. They're like opposites. It is sort of so perverted in some ways that it's beautiful, if you have a perverted sense of humour, or a sense of irony.

WOODY: What do you think, then, when you play outside of America and see people jumping around blindly to your songs which seem so obsessed with this American sick beauty?

STEVE: It probably means something different to us, but we're not writing just for New Yorkers, or just for Americans even. The music is for anybody, and hopefully everybody

gets something different from it.

WOODY: You seem to be one of the few bands who haven't suffered a big backlash after their transition from credible indie to major label status. Why do you think that is?

STEVE: We did in a way. Maybe not here, because we haven't been here as much, but in England they gave us a lot of boloney. They're real hypocritical there about the major label thing. All the indie bands there are signed to majors in the States, so they all like to have it both ways. There is a bit of a backlash. I don't think we necessarily deserved it. I mean, we still make records like we want to and tour how we like to. We're always doing things our way.

WOODY: What's the happiest song Sonic Youth have ever written?

STEVE: Happiest song? 'Teenage Riot' is one of them maybe. That's a pretty upbeat song.

WOODY: I've heard that you're all talent spotters for David Geffen now.

STEVE: Yeah, we signed this band Cell, who are coming out here real soon, and this band St. Johnny. It has always happened, with all the labels, like when we went to SST we brought Dinosaur and the TV Babies with us, and when we went to Blast First Dinosaur followed us there too. We turned Paul Smith onto Big Black and the Butthole Surfers. We've always been bringing bands that we like with us, and now it's just a little more official, like if we sign someone we actually get something for it, which is cool. Also Thurston and I are putting out records by other people all the time. My label's called Smells Like Records, and the first record is by Jon Barlow from Sebadoh, and the second is a Bad Fair single, from Half Japanese. ★

The following interview took place between WOODY and Australia's only official representative of the Church of the SubGenius: Rashauni Archaeopterix and L."Ron" Dunning.

Woozy - Could you explain the origin of the Church of the SubGenius and shed a little light on your own involvement?

Rashauni - The Church was founded by J.R. "Bob" Dobbs in 1953 after he was contacted by superior beings from the Planet X, or "Xists". Their supercomputer MWOWWY, (which is as big as the average star system and uses a complex arrangement of still-living but tormented brains torn from the skulls of lesser creatures as its database), had predicted that a series of great catastrophes would befall Earth in the 1990s. "Bob," being the compassionate, wonderful man he is, decided to devote the rest of his life to teaching people how to tap into their Hidden Powers so that the Xists would recognise us as a race worth saving from disaster. This great work still continues today.

L."Ron"- That's right. Of course "Bob" is also a great salesman, ready to capitalise on the gullibility of weak minded fools. Most people such as these change their minds after they have visited DobbsTown, our spiritual "refining" centre located very near the Australian Continent. Because of its nature, the Church also attracts outstanding and unusual people to its ranks, of which Rashauni and I are examples.


Rashauni - Yes. I spent nearly a year in DobbsTown being cleansed of my Conspiracy programming and learning the meaning of Slack. This would have been back around 1982, 83. I used to be a total Conspiracy dupe. I mean, I had a job, and I went to church regularly every Sunday, and I believed the television news... I even thought in my heart of hearts that "Bob" was nothing more than a stupid cartoon face with a pipe! I would never have been "saved" if it hadn't been for the efforts of the SubG Love Through Coercion team. They kindly took me to a dark cellar and lovingly forced me to ingest drugs until I

passed out. When I woke up I was in DobbsTown. By means of Acupuncture, Diarrhetics, and sheer pain I learned to love "Bob" over the next 11 months. Then I was "initiated" by "Bob" himself and his lovely wife Connie for ten consecutive nights, and returned home a new person with an endless choice of Short Duration Personal Saviours to call upon.

Woozy - How does the notion of Short-Duration Personal Saviours work?

Rashauni - We have ShortDurationSav because "Bob", as saviour of the SubGenius Race, is too busy to be a personal saviour to any individual. So instead we worship an endless, ever-changing sequence of Guardian Objects. They can be



anything: toasters, cars, leaves, soft drinks, mapping pins, dogs, neon signs, clouds... even people. I'm currently worshipping a lady who gives belly-dancing lessons in my area. She doesn't know she's a ShortDurationSav, but that doesn't matter. And it has to be temporary; if you want to worship somebody permanently, you might just as well become a Christian.

Woozy - Who are the Pink Boys and how can they be dealt with?


Rashauni - The Pink Boys - and Pink Girls - are the Normals of this world, the poor fools who are forever slaves to the Conspiracy without even knowing it exists. They can never become true SubGenii, no matter how much money we let them donate to the Church.

L."Ron"- No, and when they DO donate money and think that they're SubG they're called "bobbies". These are people who try to be SubG because it's HIP! A true SubGenius is someone who is SubG because they couldn't possibly be anything else. As far as "dealing" with Punks - "Fuck 'em if they can't take a joke!"

Woozy- How does one organise a proper Revival?

Rashauni- Well, actually the term "a proper Revival" is misleading. Abnormality is a prerequisite for SubGeniusians, and our only orthodoxy is heresy, so every Revival is different from any other one. But there are some things you must have. First of all, a real ranting and raving SubGenius preacher to preach the Gospel of Slack and



perform holy ceremonies: Memory Editings, Before Life Healings, the Launching of the Head, etc. (If you're lucky, he or she might even become possessed by the spirit of Dobbs right there on stage!).

Secondly, music. The Church is strongly anti-music because music is a wicked mindtrap engineered by the Anti-Bob Himself, so you must get the WORST POSSIBLE bands to play at your Revival: C&W, thrash, folk, old-time dance bands, pop, New Age hippie bullshit... have 'em all play at once and make up hymns to "Bob" as they go along. Make a noise to cause the Punk braincells to RUPTURE. REAL SubG "Doktormusik" causes bugs to fall from the air dead. If you can't

get live bands, play a lot of DEVO. They're a SubGenius group.

Thirdly, drugs. "Bob" has approved the use of certain mind relinquishing substances such as frog and Dr Dobbs' Pills (tm) for Revivals. If you have difficulty getting supplies of these, use whatever local substitutes are available.

Fourth, audience participation. Encourage people to come forward and give rants, testimonies, and denunciations. You might like to stage a Mass Suicide like the Rev. Jim Jones did, but this is only a good idea if you have guaranteed media coverage. If not, make 'em drink Kool-Aid and tell them it's poisoned. Apart from that, do whatever you want. If you're a SubGenius at heart, it'll come naturally.

Woozy- Australia is renowned for its lack of UFO sightings; how do we fit in with the coming "End Times"? L."Ron"- I'm sorry but you have been misled by the Conspiracy on this one. There are millions of UFO sightings in Australia every year (mostly Ricks doing a bit of advance scouting, or Nazi Hell creatures) but the Conspiracy-controlled media just covers it up or explains it as "swamp gas". It is thought by most Church intellectuals that Australia will be a staging area for SubGenius rescue on X-day.

Rashauni- John Spencer's "UFOs: The Definitive Casebook" has a whole chapter on Australian UFO activity ranging from 1942 to 1988. Look it up! The Bass Strait is famous for UFOs. Haven't you heard of the Valentich case? The Nazi Hell Creatures who live beneath the surface of our world have a major exit point at the South Pole. Their standard flight-path to Washington via Canberra takes their saucers right over the Bass Strait and South-Eastern Australia. The Church maintains a tracking station on the Ross Ice Shelf just to keep an eye on the bastards.

Woozy - Who is "Bob" Dobbs? How does he fit into the Church and how does his death affect it?

Rashauni - "Bob" is the Living SlackMaster. He is our High Ego, our Primordial, our guide to Surfing the Luck Plane, and the only existing Sex God. His death in 1984 - he was shot by Doug Manwood

Atwell, one of his closest friends - had the effect of splitting the Church into several splinter-groups. There were the Reconstructionists, who believed that "Bob's" death signified the end of the Church era and that the Conspiracy had won, yet maintained belief in their own Abnormality. There were the Seekers of "Bob", who thought that "Bob's" death was a ruse to test their Slack or to fool the Conspiracy. Like the "Deaths" of JFK, Elvis,





and Walt Disney. They vowed to spend the rest of their lives tracking him down. I myself belong to the Re-Erectionists. We were proved right in 1985 when "Bob" arose from the dead with a hard-on the size of a laser-cannon and proceeded to fuck some much-needed neoSlack into all of us.

Woozy - Don't you think you're being a little bit paranoid?

L. "Ron" - No, a lot. The gods have a name for human consciousness. They call it paranoia.

Rashauni - Look, I have enough to deal with without that sort of thing. I have to direct our Mission to Worthless Scum singlehanded. I'm High Priestess of this Clench, and one of "Bob's" concubines. My neighbours are just agents trying to fry my brain daily with VLF

Rashauni - Also, you must follow the Eightfold Path of Least Resistance, quit your job for "Bob", develop your Abnormality Potential, seize the reins of evolution, achieve Slack, and be born with the extra "scorn chromosome" that only true Subgenii have. Or kill me.


Woozy - What is SLACK and how is it to be obtained?

L. "Ron" - This is a difficult question to answer. Slack is NOT money, power, love or sex! Any yet in a way it is all of these things. Slack is: the sound of one hand wanking; the use of time control to avoid THEIR traps; that which remains when all that is not-Slack is.

removed. The Conspiracy would deny you slack because THEY want you to play THEIR games and THEY don't want you to know that it can get any better!

Woozy - What are the basic beliefs of the Church?

Rashauni - ... I'm sorry, but I can't answer that question. Our basic beliefs, known as "The Prescriptures," are too esoteric to be discussed publicly. What if some poor normworm or Pink were to read this? At best he would suffer myriad microscopic wounds as the Conspiracy-implanted germs in his body reacted to the influx of Dobb's Truth and bored



their way to freedom through his living flesh, leaving a million necrotic trails of suppuration as they went. At worst, he might start thinking! No, we can only reveal our beliefs to those who are prepared to take the risk, and show it by sending us two dollars for our introductory booklet, "The World Ends Tomorrow and YOU MAY DIE!"

Woozy - Have there been many attempts to infiltrate and destroy the Church by the Conspiracy? If so, how have you responded?

L. "Ron" - We suspect the so-called "devival" at the Hellfire Club was an attempt to infiltrate and interviewed by iain

A FEW GOOD BOOKS


DO IT!-Jerry Rubin(1969/7?)(36A4 P Boot Leg) STEAL THIS BOOK-Abbie Hoffman (1971)(48A4 PP)(Both \$4 Aus PP)

The Yippies were the kick ass end of the American hippies in the late sixties/70's combining cultural and political revolution and organizing and inspiring drug fuelled riots, guerilla theatre, Rallies, "Be ins", E.t.c. Combining a sense of the Absurd with a hatred of Authority the yippies fought generational warfare against a repressive system to create one of the most inspiring and hilarious movements of the times. Although largely largely ignored by the mainstream media today in favour of the more commercialized Flower power trend Woozy considers (apart from occasional sexism) the yippies definitely worth remembering. We've gotten a hold of a stack of bootleg copies of two of the best booklets of the time, written by two of the most famous yippies, Jerry Rubin and Abbie Hoffman and are making them available at no profit.

Rubins DO IT!

Follows the rise of the yippies from student protests and the early Berkley counterculture to the Levitation of the Pentagon and the Chicago riots and beyond. All the famous pranks are detailed here with force and hilarity (including throwing cash into the stock exchange and running a pig for president). Rubin also outlines the basic tenets of yippiedom (Fun + Drugs + Rock'n'roll + Revolution) and the encroachment of boring liberals and hippy capitalists who along with the F.B.I. strangled any possibility for more than a change in fashions and record charts. A great story.

Rubin sold out badly, but not the late Hoffman and in 1971 wrote the archetypical scammer and yippie survival manual, STEAL THIS BOOK, banned by many booksellers and by not a few foreign countries in its time. Steal this book, although outdated in some respects is still a great manual for getting by on nothing, ripping off big business/The state and generally being a political troublemaker. Like Do it! it's chock full of ideas so get a hold of it and get working.

POLLTAX REBELLION-Danny Burns (202A5 PP, ATTACK International)(Aus \$10)(1992) A brilliant and inspirational book chronicling the British revolt against the polltax. Utilising the voices of people involved as well as his own research and experiences, Burns details how a massive movement involving seventeen million at its peak broke a tax that most couldn't afford and brought down Thatcher with it. It discusses how a multitude of tactics from riots and bashing sheriffs/bailiffs to boycotts, rallies and petitions worked together to succeed rather than counteracting each other. It also shows how this was accomplished at the community level without the aid (and in fact with attacks from) of political parties and unions plus without the leaders or hierarchies socialists tried to impose. What is remarkable about this book and the whole struggle is that it shows how ordinary people can and have organized in their own communities to fight exploitative taxes and resist cutbacks, which is heartening to see in this time of wagecuts, property taxes and rightwing backlash. Easy to read with inspiring photos, Polltax rebellion is available at low profit from JURA Books.

THE ADVENTURES OF TIN TIN: BREAKING FREE - JACK Daniels (176 PP, ATTACK International)(Aus \$5)

Tin Tin like you've never seen him before- rioting, fighting yuppies, shoplifting, looting and helping organize a strike that eventually topples the British State. Based loosely on "THEFREE", this book wrests Tin Tin from original author Herges' pro-fascist fantasies into an anarchist future. One of the best comix I've read, both on the level of out and out subversive piss-taking and as inspiring radical fiction. A few years old now, the British gutter press had field day with it even implicating Russian spies in its creation. Grab it from JURA. Bloody funny, but where's snowy?






J Church-This Song is (7" E.P) for Kathi (BROKEN REKKIDS)

J Church is the new band for Lance and Aaron of CRINGER and so far they've pumped out two great singles of the best high energy political poppy power punk around. Their first E.P "She Said" was great and this one whilst not as good maintains their user friendly standards. Great artwork and great tunes although at times Lance tries to fit too many words into one sentence.



Christbait-Yeast (CD)(DRJIMS)

A fantastic debut. Equally as good as their amazing live shows with world class production and songs. Christbait are about as metal as HELMET, but that's the label they get tagged with. Slow intense and grinding this CD is full of enuff dynamics not to get repetitious and the build ups are fucking brilliant. 
SPLatterheads - (reissue CD)

Dave Laing has really outdone himself with these two. Both are classic examples of Australian bands being influenced by O/S stuff, taking it, mixing it up and giving it their own hard edged flavour. The sunset strip are down to two original members plus friends. Its about time somebody took Joel Silbersher and teamed him up with a song worthy of what is one of the best gravelly, detroit style voices around, because his output since GOD has been a bit too predictable for me. The two versions of 'scrape it out' are excellent and Warwick Browns take on DINO JR "sooner than you think" is similarly impressive. As a bonus you get the original 1986 Version of

"The Rising Wind".

IF you've heard the Splatterheads before you'll know what to expect from this reissue of their first couple of E.P's and "Helen the viking". If not, grab this and get ready for some of the best Australian garage driven HUSKER DU/DETROIT thrash around. High energy and aggressively catchy with great off key harmonies and vocals the splatterheads particularly power on the "INK from a madmans pen" part of the release. New albums are due out from both bands soon.




Various-Setition Fire (Dog Meat)






Bailter Space-Robot World (Flying Nun)

Perri - I think what got me into music was discovering there was more to life than top 40, An Alternative scene & the sex PISTOLS and PUNK music. IT seemed angry and messy and anyone could do it.

My first band was Delicatessens - it was an assortment of 14 or so people depending on how many turned up.

You weren't allowed to play an instrument that you could play. - There were always a fight on stage as to who was going to play what next.

It was a sent up of the ridiculousness of the music industry, we were originally going to get famous without playing a gig, but something happened & we played shows. The claim to fame the is NICK CAVE walking out on our version of "Shivers" (Laughter).

W - WHAT ARE YOUR LYRICS ABOUT

P - A mixture of things. The first song "Stingray" came from a nightmare, so some dream images come into it. Theres a lot of emotionally based lyrics...

S - Tension. Very Emotional.

P - Sometimes its thoughts that connect to each other that have nice images to them. Some of it is semi-political like "Mute" Which is about how people like Kennett, People in positions of power to lead so called democracies don't really listen to what the average persons position is, so most people are Mute aren't heard. "WITCH" is about women and oppression and images of women in magazines - the absurdity of the imagery of women. Then theres the ones about relationships (Laughter) . . .

You're floating in the sun at the edge of the clouds you're watching the sun, the sun at the edge.... you're floating free, free of the world.



Where DO THE EXTRA INSTRUMENTS COME INTO THINGS?

P- I guess that's what I was talking about before. For me, the idea of the punk era, that if you like something you just do it. I like the discord you can put into it.
You don't worry about whether you can play or not, you just pick up an instrument and do it. Sometimes we're fairly sweet and nice and it's like we need to put some dischord into it, create some tension within it. And it's boring to just stand on stage and sing, I enjoy picking up another instrument and getting some melodies out of it.

YOU DID A T-SHIRT GIVEAWAY A WHILE AGO, HOW DID THAT GO?

P- The T-Shirt and the first single were done as giveaways and other giggle stuff has been too. I think it's an effective way to get your music out to people and people love it.


A lot of people turn up and don't even realise they're getting something. It's such a classic that people have 490 records sitting under their bed for the rest of their threes.

If you can get 2-300 people to your show you've overnight moved 300 copies which is fantastic. It sits in peoples lounge rooms and most people live in share houses so you really far more people. It's more down to earth.

WHAT DO YOU THINK THE Effect of MORE WOMEN PLAYING IN BANDS IS HAVING?

A- It depends on what they do, if they're a drummer or a bass player, it's "OH YEAH, You're pretty good for a women!"

S- It's still really patronising, it's a strange attitude.



P- The music industry is male dominated and has been for ever. You don't see boys wanting to be like some women guitarist, I mean there's barely a women guitarist I could name, whereas it's like "I wanna be like Hendrix", There all these male role models and not many female ones. Which is not to say there aren't women who can play as well, they're just not in the lime light.



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W - DON'T YOU THINK THAT'S CHANGING
NOW WITH L7, CLOUDS, ETC?

P - What I think is good is that film clips, often women get used as sexual objects, whereas now they're not dressing women up so much, though that continues, they're allowed to wear what they wear. Bands like the clouds, I noticed were just there as women, as part of a band not separate entities.

W - WHERE DID THE BANDS NAME
COME FROM?

P - From a kids game. I liked the sound of the words together, I'm not sure what images been or those games which mystify me as to how anyone wins it. It seems really cruel. The person you don't like, you make 'it' and there it forever....

A - Because no one wants to crawl through their legs to set them free.

M - It sums up our childlike attitude towards the music.....(laughter)

Q: How's the Qld Music Scene at the Moment?



Q: Are you sick of mangoes yet?



Q: Have S.W.E any plans for world domination?


A: Well, I don't have plans to move away from this general area but I like the idea of travelling to some nice spots. The main thing now is to keep the band going for more than a few months every couple of years.


SQUATTING ...

HOMELESS? UNEMPLOYED? POOR? CAN'T AFFORD TO PAY RENT AND FEED YOURSELF? WELL, SQUATTING COULD BE JUST THE THING FOR YOU.

THERE ARE THOUSANDS OF EMPTY HOUSES, FLATS AND WAREHOUSES TO BE FOUND ALL OVER MELBOURNE. OBVIOUS SIGNS OF AN EMPTY CAN BE OVER-GROWN GARDENS, JUNKMAIL OVERFLOWING FROM THE LETTERBOX, BOARDED UP WINDOWS OR BLINDS ALWAYS DRAWN, MISSING ELECTRICITY/GAS METERS. ONCE YOU ARE CERTAIN A BUILDING IS EMPTY GET INSIDE AND CHECK IT OUT. YOU MAY HAVE TO BREAK IN BUT CLEAN UP AFTERWARDS AND DON'T EVER ADMIT TO HAVING DONE IT - IF ANYONE ASKS SAY A DOOR WAS OPEN.

IF YOU DECIDE TO MOVE IN YOU CAN FIND OUT WHO THE OWNER IS BY DOING A SEARCH AT THE LAND TITLES OFFICE OR COUNCIL RATES DEPARTMENT. YOU MAY WANT TO CONTACT THE OWNER BEFORE YOU MOVE IN TO FIND OUT WHAT THE PLANS ARE FOR THE BUILDING AND NEGOTIATE STAYING THERE. BUT MOST PEOPLE CHOOSE TO MOVE IN FIRST AND WAIT UNTIL THE OWNER FINDS YOU THERE - THIS CAN TAKE DAYS, WEEKS, MONTHS OR EVEN YEARS!!

SQUATTING IS A BIT OF A GAMBLE REALLY. YOU MAY SQUAT A HOUSE AND BE EVICTED WITHIN DAYS OF MOVING IN, OR YOU MAY BE LUCKY AND FIND A HOUSE THAT LASTS FOR MANY MONTHS OR YEARS. A LOT OF PROPERTY OWNERS WHO LEAVE BUILDINGS EMPTY ARE SELFISH AND UNREASONABLE AND WILL EVICT YOU AS SOON AS THEY FIND YOU THERE, BUT SOME WILL BE HAPPY TO FIND YOU LOOKING AFTER THEIR PROPERTY AND YOU CAN NEGOTIATE STAYING THERE FOR FREE OR BY PAYING A MINIMAL RENT.




MOST EMPTY HOUSES WILL BE IN SOME STATE OF DISREPAIR, SO YOU'LL PROBABLY FIND YOU NEED TO DO A BIT OF WORK TO MAKE THE PLACE INTO YOUR HOME. GETTING WATER, GAS, ELECTRICITY AND TELEPHONE CONNECTED CAN BE AS SIMPLE AS MAKING A PHONE CALL, BUT IF METERS/PIPES/WIRING ARE MISSING OR FAULTY YOU MAY NEED TO GET A TRADES PERSON IN BEFORE SERVICES



CAN BE CONNECTED . YOU DON'T HAVE TO TELL PEOPLE YOU'RE SQUATTING. (PARTICULARLY NOT GAS & FUEL OR ELECTRICITY DEPARTMENT AS THEY WILL MAKE YOU PAY A BOND TO HAVE A SERVICE PROVIDED) IT'S A GOOD IDEA TO KEEP A RECORD OF ALL THE WORK YOU DO ON THE BUILDING AND MAYBE PREPARE A LETTER TO GIVE TO THE OWNER WHEN SHE/HE APPEARS , EXPLAINING YOUR SITUATION, BENEFITS OF YOU BEING IN THE BUILDING, ETC. YOU MAY CHOOSE TO TALK TO NEIGHBOURS AND/OR PREPARE A LEAFLET ABOUT SQUATTING TO DISTRIBUTE IN YOUR AREA , AS COMMUNITY SUPPORT MAY BE HELPFUL AT EVICTION TIME .

ALL SORTS OF PEOPLE SQUAT AND THERE ARE MANY DIFFERENT ATTITUDES TO SQUATTING. SOME PEOPLE THINK ANY SQUAT IS AN OPEN HOUSE WHERE ANYONE SHOULD BE WELCOME TO STAY AS LONG AS THEY LIKE. BUT REALLY EACH SQUAT IS DIFFERENT AND HOW IT OPERATES AS A HOUSEHOLD SHOULD BE DEFINED BY THE PEOPLE WHO SET IT UP AND LIVE IN IT. YOU DON'T HAVE TO OPEN YOUR HOUSE TO EVERYONE WHO KNOCKS ON YOUR DOOR AND SAYS THEY HAVE NOWHERE TO STAY - JUST AS YOU HAVE TAKEN THE INITIATIVE TO FIND A HOUSE AND SQUAT IT SO CAN ANYONE ELSE .




Imagine all the concrete, around your house producing fresh organic vegetables or growing native plants. To do this you first need to produce soil, something which only take and hour of easy labour to do. It doesn't take much space to produce all the herbs required for cooking and there are lots of vegetables that take up little room.

GROW YOUR OWN
THE FOLLOWING METHOD OF GARDENING WORK JUST AS WELL ON DIRT OR CONCRETE. IT IS EASY SO ANYONE FROM KIDS TO THE ELDERLY CAN DO IT.

GUIDE TO BUILDING A NON DIG GARDEN SOIL

Organic

1. FIND YOUR SPACE. YOU NEED TO CONSIDER THE SHADE, TEMPERATURES, SPACE & WATER NEEDS OF THE PLANTS YOU WANT TO GROW.
2. LAY DOWN SOME CARPET, THEN CARPET UNDERH BOTH CAN BE OBTAINED FOR NOTHING FROM A CARPET LAYING COMPANY WHO USUALLY THROW OLD STUFF OUT ALTERNATIVELY USE NEWSPAPER, CARDBOARD OR HESSIAN BAG
3. NOW ADD A THIN LAYER OF SOIL - 1cm OR SO. IF NO SOIL IS AVAILABLE DON'T WORRY, BUT IT HELPS BREAK DOWN OTHER MATERIALS.
4. NEXT THROW SOME VEGETABLE SCRAPS, WEEDS OR A THIN SPRINKLE LEAVES ON TOP OF THE PREVIOUS LAYER. THEN SCATTER ANIMAL MANURE OVER THAT. MANURE CAN BE FOUND AT FRIENDS PLACES IF THEY HAVE CHICKENS, AT HORSE RACING TRACKS OR SLAUGHTER YARDS (YUK!!). SOIL, ORGANIC FERTILIZER OR WORMCASTING CAN ALSO BE USED.
5. NOW PUT DOWN 10-30cm OF HAY PADS (CUCENE, PEAD OR CROP STRAW OR SEAWEED). THEN ADD A THIN LAYER OF PAPER & WATER THE LOT.
6. REPEAT STEPS 4 & 5 until you HAVE AROUND 2X THE SOIL DEPTH REQUIRED FOR GROWING THE PLANTS YOU HAVE CHOSEN AS THE MATERIALS WILL SHRINK AS THEY BECOME SOIL.
7. NOW ADD 10cm of SOIL COMPOST OR WORM CASTINGS. YOU CAN NOW PLANT MOST SEEDLINGS, BUT SOME MAY HAVE TO WAIT UNTIL THE SOIL PROCESS IS COMPLETED IN A MONTH OR SO.

Beginnings?

EMMA: The actual group started about 4 years ago. There was 7 people (3 in the present line-up). Raz joined after a year. We went from 7 to 3 to 4 to 5 to 7 then finally settled on this combination about a year and $\frac{1}{2}$ ago.

Explain the name?

RAZ: I think it was Sue Lin (one of the original members). When she originally heard the harmonies for one of our songs, said it was so beautiful it was like running around in the rain naked - so it was like "nude rain".

EMMA: And nude rain became a catch-cry for good things...

All female members - has it always been like that?

EMMA & RAZ: Yes and it always will be.

You perform a lot of f's only shows....

EMMA: Without sounding really opportunistic it is a really good market for us because they are really receptive audiences.



RAZ: They are really fun gigs.

EMMA: Our music isn't just politically about women - our music is very broad - but still there are songs that are specifically about womens issues.

RAZ: All of us have our own view point on this so its kind of hard to speak as a group - but I think basically we all believe in f's only gigs. There is a definite need for them as they provide something good for women but at the same time its also frustrating when guys have wanted to see us - and sometimes I find that within myself its a bit of a conflict sometimes I get frustrated and feel its kind of separatist ...

What other places have you performed?

RAZ: Different places like uni's, art galleries lots and lots of pubs and functions and launches.... oh and shopping centres, we have done lots of shopping centres!



Busking?

RAZ: We busked over Xmas a couple of years ago to get some cash

EMMA: Its good, but we don't busk regularly anymore because its pretty hard work. But we did come 2nd in the open section of the Melbourne Busking competition last year.

Sydney....

RAZ: The first gig in Sydney was at the Sandringham. It was really hot and quite a hard pub to sing in. Then we did a night at the Harbourside Brasserie with 2 other a cappella groups.

EMMA: It was the total other end of the spectrum.

Advantages / disadvantages of being a cappella ... ?

RAZ: One really good thing is that we don't have to have lots of equipment - but at the same time its almost frustrating because ...

EMMA: You don't get roadies!

RAZ: Sometimes people expect that if there is a party that "Nude Rain" will be there and just assumes that we will get up and perform.

The tape is ready !!! "Kupah"

EMMA: Fresh off the press - its basically the same as one tape we did about 8 months ago which is now a bit stale to us

RAZ: And really not a good recording.

EMMA: This one's got pretty much the same songs on it but this time we're a lot happier with how we've sung and how we've been recorded.

RAZ: We just used one stereo mike and we all sang around it - quite nice natural acoustics. We liked the sound of that better.


Where will you sell it ?

THE FOLLOWING INTERVIEW IS AN EDIT VERSION OF ONE CONDUCTED WITH RONOTSE (AKA VITAMIN C) BY KAREN LENG AT 3RRR JUST PRIOR TO THEIR AUSTRALIAN TOUR !!!!

Woozy: It's interesting that with the song "TELEVISION", both the Original with the BEATNIGS but more particularly with the recording by the DISPOSABLE HEROES that you've attracted so much airplay. It seems you've struck a real nerve with that song.

Rono: YEAH, I think that everybody can identify with "TELEVISION", whether it's in America or Melbourne or New Zealand. Television plays really strong roles in our lives and we may not know it. I'm a TV junkie you know and I think it's important that we understand that television is just technology and that it's here to stay and it's not bad, but that all stations especially in America are controlled by private corporations, they don't give you different views on things and big companies like 'SHELL', an oil company, wouldn't sponsor say, a show on saving the ocean from oil spills. It's important that we understand what we're watching and that when do have access to directing and programming that we put out different views and ideas.

Woozy: Did that song receive much commercial airplay over in the states? For instance, did MTV pick it up and if they did do you think they caught onto the irony of it?


Rono: Well MTV have their own agendas and ratings. Yes they caught onto it, but it wasn't played in mainstream time or pushed. Our whole album in America is not being played on mainstream radio stations and that's how America is. Radio stations are very segregated and unless you play a hit song, it won't be played!

Woozy: I get the impression that both you and Michael have arrived at the kind of styles you're working with in HIPHOPRISY - broadly a dance / rap style, but you seem to have come from a unique angle in that with the BEATNIGS you seemed to be fuelled as much by hardcore and punk as by black musical tradition.

Rono: Well, the BEATNIGS come from our own experiences. With punk, we weren't in it, I wasn't involved with the punk era 'cos I grew up with a lot of black kids that listened to straight hip hop or soul and R&B music. With HIPHOPRISY, my agenda and the reason why I'm doing it is I love music, but there's a lot of my friends who aren't doing too well back in the states. A lot of them are selling drugs or dead 'cos of crazy stupid violence and I want to reach these people I know and the only way I can do this is by making music they can identify with, that they can groove to the music that's in their heart and their spirit, so HIPHOPRISY has its own vision and direction as to where we should put our music too, but different rappers like ICE CUBE, ICET even TRIBE CALLED QUEST, they have their own and that's what's great about rap music. It's such a large area across music that you can't pinpoint in to one single rapper!

Woozy: How do you ensure though that your kind of music is heard by those you want to hear it most and not by a bunch of middle class white kids at universities??

Rono: (LAUGHTER). There's nothing wrong with white kids, yellow kids, orange kids, green kids listening. I think everyone should listen to music and enjoy it, but I think that everytime a group of people feel they need to reach THEIR people. I think the way to do this is



not just doing concerts, but also going to schools, the communities, the people you grew up with - You speak with them about everything, not just music, but history, the future, what's going on. We're here for such a short time and we don't communicate enough and that's why you see a lot of violence in America 'cos half the time the brothers there don't even understand what's going on.

Woosy: To what extent do you think music can address these problems though?

Ronjo: It's limited in 1 way when you're just dancing and having a good time. I think that's great and that's what music should be - it's a spiritual and emotional thing. But if you want to go deeper into it and raise some questions and help the brothers out I think we have to follow up with different discussions. To set up organizations where you can get these people to come in and speak with one another. If we can identify with the music then I think we can identify with other types of issues!

Woosy: So what's the response been to this album in general in the states? I notice you had an address in the CD to which people can send comments. Have you had much response to that?

Ronjo: YES! We've had lots of feedback, ranging from "I hate your music" to "Right on, everything you're doing I agree with". And it's been really good. People have been really supportive of what we do and I think it's good to have a communication line with the people who are buying your work and you need to know what they think of it!!!

Woosy: What sort of response have you had outside of America because in many ways this record is very culturally specific.

Ronjo: Outside of the U.S people are more open minded. They don't shut off right away. People in Europe and New Zealand have been really supportive of what we do. Our music is growing constantly, we made that record a year and a half ago and the new music I've been writing has new beats that will make people dance. I think one of the things that has been criticized about our music is that it wasn't really danceable for our audience.

Woosy: What's your role in the band. You're credited as a percussionist and dancer, can you elaborate on that??


Ronjo: I run around on stage going crazy. I try to stay in control, except for tax time (laughter). I try to hype up and pump up the audience. I add certain phrases to the lyrics, I'm constantly flowing with what's going on. I make a lot of instruments out of tyre rims, out of found objects. I have a grinder that makes sparks off for theatrical excitement. I do a lot of Hip Hop dancing because I love dancing, I've been trying to apply a lot of West African and Haitian dancing because that's where Hip Hop and all music came from.

Woosy: It sounds like you're a bit of a scavenger. Do you go around to various junk yards in the towns you're in and find more junk metal to play???

Ronjo: I used to do that all the time, but I don't have a big crew and the more stuff I get the more the crew members get upset at me. But one thing I do do is meet all the DJs, meet all the people doing music and exchange ideas and that's one important thing that as an artist and a human being I can do is exchange ideas.

Woozy: How do performers like say ICE CUBE and the kind of agendas and at times violence they're pushing sit alongside the philosophies of the DISPOSABLE HEROES because one might assume they're pretty different really?


RoNO: Well, I grew up with a lot of ICE CUBES, a lot of ICE T's, I myself was a very violent person and I can relate to a lot of brothers out there and what they're doing, but the thing is we can't go out and say there's only one method, only one way of reaching young brothers. Everyone has to do their jobs. People might criticize the muslims for being too militant, but they're reaching to people we might not reach. We should criticize each other, but at the end of the day we're trying to save lives and make people come together have good health, have good education and these are the basic things we need to survive in America and this world!

Psychogeography is the study and mapping of urban environments based on emotion and atmosphere, or ambience. It has nothing to do with the distribution of psychopaths in a given neighbourhood, although maps telling us where psychopaths live would indeed be useful; we could then make sure we did not move in next door to them.



Most people will be aware that different parts of the urban landscape evoke different feelings in the person passing through the area. A tree lined street, blocks of flats, a shopping precinct, an administrative or business district, abandoned docksides, or run down industrial areas—all these places convey a different feeling. It is the sum of all

gothic monoliths of a city centre business district to a quiet, sunlit street with unimposing little houses may actually be fatal for the average person if he or she enters the sunlit street too suddenly.

A psychogeographical map would lead the person from one area to another without drastic shocks, so that moods can be maintained or modified at a rate which does not cause unnecessary stress on the heart.

Unfortunately the pioneers of psychogeography are now all gone and only a few of their maps remain. Psychogeography never looked likely to become part of the school curriculum, however, as it basically advocates a subversive approach to the city, that is; wandering through it in a thoughtful and critical manner.

Psychogeography

these feelings that really describes an urban environment, a psychogeographical map would tell us far more about the mood of a place and the moods of the people who inhabit it than a conventional, two-dimensional street map.

On a psychogeographical map physical distances are abandoned in favour of emotional distances. What may be round the corner on an ordinary street directory may well be a great distance on a psychogeographical map due to the shift in emotional state caused by the different area. Turning the corner from the dark mysteriousness and

Psychogeographers abhorred waged labour, paying bills, town planners, and meaningless existence, they dreamed of turning our living spaces into areas for play and useful work.

I recently tried to follow one route on an old psychogeographical map of Oslo, but after only twenty minutes I found myself hopelessly lost inside a large public toilet. Since then I have stuck to using conventional maps and the public transport system.


