"Copyright"

'The exclusive right to copy, publish, adapt or authorise use of copyright works'

Notice to all users of Copier/Printers

AUT staff and students must comply with the provisions of the Copyright Act 1994 and the Privacy Act 1993.

Where copying of copyright works is not covered by any of the exceptions provided in the Act (should these be detailed?), then clearance must be sought from the copyright owner or from the appropriate licensing body.

AUT has a licence with Copyright Licensing Limited (CLL), which provides for the copying of extracts from hard copy printed published works for students for the educational purposes of AUT. These copies may be included in course-packs or compilations, distributed either in hard copy or electronic format to enrolled students and staff involved in the particular course of instruction.

Course Materials sold to students must have included a Bibliography(s) or References.

Every course-pack produced and distributed, whether in hard copy or electronic format, must be accompanied by the following copyright warning notice:

Licence Coverage	Excluded Works
The limits of copying of copyright material pursuant to this Licence shall be:	The following materials may not be copied under the licence:
 Up to 10% or one chapter of a work, whichever is the larger; Up to 15 pages of all or part of a single work in a collection of works even if the works are published separately; One or part of one article from a periodical publication, or additional articles if they are on the same subject; An artistic work (such as an illustration) published within a textual work; An out of print work, by photocopying only, where the work is out of print or unavailable in sufficient quantity within a reasonable time at the normal price (subject to prior written approval from CLL); A repeat copy from a work within 14 days provided that this is not made by the same staff member for the same class or course of study. 	 Works downloaded from the Internet; Printed music (including the words); Loose maps and charts; New Zealand newspapers; Works stipulating that they may not be copied under a copyright reprography licence of this nature, where appropriate specific permission should be obtained from the copyright owners; Photographs and/or illustrations published separately from a work; Privately owned work issued for tuition purposes and limited to a clientele who pay fees; Unpublished religious orders of service; House journals (publications for employees); Theses, dissertations and student papers; Any materials designed for delivery in an institution overseas.
