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5 **PREAMBLE**

6

7 SECTION A: MISSION, TAX STATUS & LOCATION

- 8 1. Mission: The Montana Democratic Party recruits, trains and elects Democrats to local,
- 9 statewide and federal office to ensure a government of the people, by the people, and for the
- 10 people of Montana.
- 11 2. Tax Status: The Montana Democratic Party is a 527 Political Non-Profit. The Montana
- 12 Democratic Party adheres to and follows all rules and regulations of the State of Montana and the
- 13 United States Federal Government.
- 14 3. Location: The headquarters of the Montana Democratic Party is located at 303 North Ewing
- 15 Street, Helena, MT. The location of this entity is determined by the Executive Board. Additional
- 16 office locations may be determined by the Executive Director.
- 17

18 SECTION B: STRUCTURE OF THE ORGANIZATION

- 19 1. All public meetings of the Democratic Party are open to all members of the Democratic Party
- 20 of Montana regardless of race, creed, sex, age, national origin, religion, ethnic identity, economic
- 21 status, sexual orientation, gender identity, or philosophical persuasion. Members of the
- 22 Democratic Party are defined as any individuals who are supportive of the Democratic Party's
- 23 mission and values, without test of membership or oath, and are in good standing with the
- 24 organization. All members of the Democratic Party of Montana shall be encouraged to
- 25 participate in party affairs.
- 26 2. The time and place for all meetings of the Democratic Party of Montana shall be publicized
- 27 fully and in such manner to assure timely notice to all interested persons. Such meetings shall be
- 28 held in places accessible to all Party members and large enough to accommodate interested
- 29 persons. Specific notice requirements and timelines are listed throughout the document under
- 30 their appropriate headings.

1 3. The Democratic Party of Montana shall publicize a complete description of the qualifications

- 2 for the procedures to elect officers of the Montana State Democratic Party. Such publication
- 3 shall be done in a timely fashion so prospective candidates or applicants for any elected or
- 4 appointed position will have full and adequate opportunity to compete for office.
- 5 4. The Montana State Central Committee and county central committees are encouraged to
- 6 expand their membership, register new voters and engage in field activities that advance the
- 7 mission of the Democratic Party.
- 8 5. Use of the term "Executive Board district" in these rules, including Montana's Presidential
- 9 Delegate Selection Plan, means the allocation of Montana's counties in the following manner:
- 10 Western District: Beaverhead, Broadwater, Deer Lodge, Flathead, Glacier, Granite,
- Jefferson, Lake, Lewis & Clark, Lincoln, Madison, Mineral, Missoula, Pondera, Powell,
 Ravalli, Sanders and Silver Bow Counties
- 13 Eastern District: Big Horn, Blaine, Carbon, Carter, Cascade, Chouteau, Custer, Daniels,
- 14 Dawson, Fallon, Fergus, Gallatin, Garfield, Golden Valley, Hill, Judith Basin, Liberty, McCone,
- 15 Meagher, Musselshell, Park, Petroleum, Phillips, Powder River, Prairie, Richland, Roosevelt,
- 16 Rosebud, Sheridan, Stillwater, Sweet Grass, Teton, Toole, Treasure, Valley, Wheatland, Wibaux
- 17 and Yellowstone Counties
- 18 RULE 1 MINORITY INCLUSIVITY
- 19
- 20 1. It shall be the duty of the Party officers, to encourage persons from every income level, young
- 21 people, women, persons of minority races or ethnicities, senior citizens, LGBT persons, and
- 22 other under-represented and minority groups to participate in and seek selection as delegates to
- 23 Party conventions and as members of Party committees.
- 24 2. The Montana Democratic State Central Committee shall adopt an affirmative action plan to
 25 ensure equal participation in Party affairs, including delegate selection, in keeping with State
- 26 Party rules and rules adopted by the Democratic National Committee. When adopted, such plan
- 27 is fully enforceable as a rule of the Montana Democratic Party.

- 30 RULE 2 CITY-COUNTY CENTRAL COMMITTEES
- 31

1 SECTION A: STRUCTURE & TERMS OF A CITY-COUNTY CENTRAL

2 **COMMITTEE** 3 1. The city, county, and Montana State Democratic Central Committees shall be organized as 4 provided in the laws of Montana and in these rules. 5 2. In each county of the state there is a Democratic county central committee which consists of 6 the duly elected or appointed precinct committeemen and committeewomen of each precinct. 7 3. Precinct committeemen and committeewomen hold such position for terms of two years from 8 the date of their election, or in the case of appointment, until the next regularly scheduled 9 election. 10 4. Those committeemen and committeewomen who reside within the limits of any incorporated 11 city or town shall constitute ex-officio the city central committee and shall have the same power 12 and jurisdiction as the Democratic Party in such city affairs as the county central committee has 13 in county matters, except to fill vacancies as provided in Rules 7, 13, 14, 15 and 16. 14 15 SECTION B: COUNTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE CONVENTIONS & ELECTIONS 16 1. The county central committee shall meet in county convention between April 15 and May 31 17 of each odd-numbered year and elect the following officers: 18 a) a county chair and vice chair, one of whom shall be a woman, and one of whom shall 19 be a man; 20 b) a state committeeman and a state committeewoman; 21 c) four state central committee alternates, two of whom shall be women and two of whom 22 shall be men. These officers serve as alternates to the chair or vice chair, or state 23 committeeman or woman. State central committee alternates shall replace members of the 24 same sex whenever possible. The county convention shall designate first and second 25 alternates; 26 d) a secretary and a treasurer. 27 2. Only precinct committeemen, precinct committeewomen, and current county central 28 committee officers may vote for officers at the county convention. Officers are not required to be 29 precinct committeemen or precinct committeewomen. The officers elected by the county 30 convention shall constitute the executive committee of the county central committee and are 31 charged with the execution of the county party's policies and programs between meetings of the

1	full committee. They shall be entitled to full voting privileges at all other meetings of the county
2	central committee.
3	3. Appointed precinct committeemen and committeewomen shall have the same rights,
4 5	privileges, duties and responsibilities as elected precinct committeemen and committeewomen.
5 6	SECTION C: DCCC VOTING RIGHTS
0 7	1. The county central committee may not adopt any rules or regulations that conflict with the
8	laws of Montana, the rules of the Montana Democratic Party or the rules of the national
9	Democratic Party.
9 10	Democratic Farty.
10	RULE 3 PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS
12	1. The Montana Democratic Party seeks to engage partner organizations that share our
12	Democratic Values.
13	2. Partner organizations must receive a 2/3 vote by the Executive Board of the Montana
15	Democratic Party to be recognized as a partner.
16	3. The Montana Democratic Party may rescind partner relationship with a 2/3 vote of the
17	Executive Board at any time.
18	4. Partner organizations will be granted one voting member at the Officers Convention and five
10	voting members from each Executive Board District at the Platform Convention.

20	RULE 4 STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE
22	
23	SECTION A: MEMBERS OF THE STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE
24	1. The Montana Democratic State Central Committee consists of:
25	a) all voting members of the State Party Executive Board, as defined in Rule 6;
26	b) the county chair and vice chair of each county, or, in their absence, the state central
2 7	committee alternates;
28	c) the state committeeman and state committeewoman from each county, or, in their
29	absence, the state central committee alternates;
30	d) the president (or, if absent, the vice president) of any partner organization of the
31	Montana Democratic Party; and
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- e) Democrats holding the positions of Lieutenant Governor, Clerk of the Supreme Court
 or Public Service Commissioner.
 3
- 4 SECTION B: OFFICERS OF THE STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE 5 1. The officers of the Montana Democratic State Central Committee are the State Chair, Vice 6 Chair, National Committee Members, Secretary, Treasurer and the non-votingExecutive 7 Director. 8 2. The election procedures for officers of the Montana Democratic State Central Committee are 9 provided in Rule 8. The selection process for an Executive Director is provided in Rule 5. 10 3. It is the duty of all officers to support the platform adopted at the Platform Convention and the 11 Democratic Party nominees who support the Democratic platform. The specific duties of the 12 Party's officers include: 13 a) State Chair: The State Chair shall 14 • issue calls for and preside at all meetings and conventions of the State Central 15 Committee and the Executive Board: 16 • act as a resource for Democratic Party members, organizations, political 17 candidates and campaigns; 18 raise funds for the State Democratic Party; • 19 serve as a spokesperson on issues with the advice of the Executive Board; • 20 work with the Treasurer and Executive Director to oversee finances of the • 21 organization; 22 ensure decisions of the Executive Board are carried out; • 23 appoint committees on finance, rules, and personnel; • 24 • appoint other committees as needed; and 25 perform such other duties as the Executive Board may assign. •
 - The State Chair shall be paid a monthly stipend in recognition of the time and effort required to fulfill the responsibilities of the position. This stipend will be set and approved by the State Executive Board.
- b) State Vice Chair: The State Vice Chair shall
 preside at meetings in the absence of the State Chair, or where action by the Chair
 would constitute a conflict of interest;

1	• assist the chair in undertaking the responsibilities of the Chair;
2	• assist the Chair and Executive Director in raising funds for the State Democratic
3	Party; and
4	• perform such other duties as the Executive Board may assign.
5	c) Secretary: The Secretary shall
6	• take, distribute and maintain minutes of meetings of the Executive Board;
7	• work with the Executive Director and Chair to prepare agendas for Executive
8	Board meetings;
9	• work with the Executive Director and Chair to ensure proper notice be made
10	available in compliance with these rules; and
11	• perform such other duties as the Executive Board may assign.
12	d) Treasurer: The Treasurer shall
13	• ensure the Executive Board is meeting fiduciary responsibilities;
14	• be responsible for accurate reporting required by federal and state law;
15	• serve as Chair of the Finance Committee; and
16	• perform such other duties as the Executive Board may assign.
17	e) National Committeeman/Woman: The National Committeeman/Woman shall
18	• serve as a liaison between the Democratic National Committee (DNC) and the
19	Executive Board;
20	• are expected to attend and participate fully in the meetings of the DNC: the
21	Winter Meeting, Summer Meeting and the meeting of the Western Caucus;
22	• submit a written report, in a timely manner, to the Executive Board and report in
23	person at the Executive Board meetings subsequent to the DNC Meetings; and
24	• serve as unpledged delegates to the National Presidential Convention every four
25	years.
26	SECTION C: STRUCTURE, TERMS & NOTICE
20 27	1. The Montana Democratic State Central Committee is the permanent party authority in the
27	State of Montone. The committee is outhorized to adopt and monoplaste all personant wheefor

28 State of Montana. The committee is authorized to adopt and promulgate all necessary rules for

29 the conduct of party affairs.

1 2. Meetings of the Montana Democratic State Central Committee may be called by the Chair, the

2 Executive Board, or 20% of the State Central Committee. Members of the State Central

3 Committee shall be notified at least 10 days prior to State Central Committee meetings.

4 3. At any meeting of the Montana Democratic State Central Committee, 50% of registered

- 5 members in attendance shall constitute a quorum.
- 6

7 <u>RULE 5 EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR</u>

8

9 SECTION A: HIRING & TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT

10 1. The Executive Board shall, in its sole discretion, employ an executive director at such rate ofcompensation as it shall determine appropriate.

12 2. The contract of employment shall be in writing, shall embody all of the terms and conditions

of employment, and shall be approved by the Personnel Committee and ratified by the ExecutiveBoard.

- 15 a) **Selection Process:** An opening for the position of the Executive Director shall be
- 16advertised by the State Chair. Applicants shall be considered by the Personnel

17 Committee. The Personnel Committee shall submit a list of approved candidates to the

- 18 Executive Board, in priority order. The Executive Board shall approve or disapprove the19 nomination with a majority vote. If the Executive Board approves the nomination, the
- 20 nominated person shall be offered the position of Executive Director.
- 21 b) **Dismissal Process:** An executive director who has been hired may be dismissed by a
- 22 2/3 vote of the total membership of the State Executive Board at a special meeting called
- 23 on 15 days written notice. The notice shall contain the performance issues and be signed
- by the Chair and 25 percent of the members of the Executive Board. Prior to the vote, the
 Executive Director shall be given a full hearing and the opportunity to address personnel
- 26

issues.

27

28 SECTION B: EX-OFFICIO EXECUTIVE BOARD MEMBER

29 1. The Executive Director shall serve as a non-voting, ex-officio member of the State Central

30 Committee and Executive Board; however, she or he is not authorized to be present in any

31 executive session without specific approval of the body.

1	
2	SECTION C: OPERATIONS, FINANCES & MANAGER OF STAFF
3	1. The Executive Director shall provide overall supervision and leadership to the staff of the
4	Montana Democratic Party and shall be responsible for the day-to-day administrative operations
5	of the corporation.
6	2. The Executive Director shall obtain or provide expertise as is necessary to raise revenue,
7	oversee all financial records, and meet compliance requirements of State and Federal law, work
8	with the Chair, the Treasurer, and Finance Committee to submit quarterly financial reports to the
9	Executive Board, and inform the Executive Board on the of the organization's financial status.
10	3. The Executive Director shall comply with all adopted financial controls and policies per the
11	Executive Board.
12	
13	SECTION D: AUTHORITY & ACCOUNTABILITY
14	1. The Executive Director shall be accountable and report to the Executive Board and shall
15	assume such responsibilities and perform such duties as may be assigned by the Chair or the
16	Executive Board, but not by individual members of the Board.
17	2) The Executive Director may hire additional staff as necessary to achieve the goals of the
18	organization. The Executive Director shall have power supervise, to hire, and fire staff within
19	policies outlined by the Executive Board.
20	3) The State Chair shall appoint a Personnel Committee responsible for providing guidance and
21	oversight in staff policy and staff grievances.
22	
23	RULE 6 EXECUTIVE BOARD
24	
25	SECTION A: ROLE OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD
26	1. The policies and programs of the Montana Democratic State Central Committee will be
27	directed and conducted by the Executive Board according to these rules and the Montana
28	Democratic State Central Committee including the Presidential Delegate Selection Plan.
29	
30	SECTION B: MEETINGS & NOTICE

1	1. The Executive Board shall hold regular meetings at least four times a year. Special meetings
2	may be called by the State Chair or by any five members of the Executive Board.
3	2. Members of the Executive Board shall be notified at least 10 days prior to Executive Board
4	meetings.
5	3. A quorum shall consist of 50% of the Executive Board.
6	
7	SECTION C: MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD
8	1. Members of the Executive Board are:
9	a) the State Chair and State Vice Chair;
10	b) the immediate past State Chair and immediate past State Vice Chair (a person holds
11	one of these offices if he or she (1) is the person who most recently served as State Chair
12	or Vice Chair in the preceding two years, and (2) does not hold another office entitled to
13	vote, has not been removed from office pursuant to Rules 6 or 7, and did not resign the
14	office of State Chair or Vice Chair);
15	c) the Treasurer and Secretary;
16	d) the National Committee Members;
17	e) four district chairs, consisting of one male and one female county central committee
18	chair or vice chair from each Executive Board district;
19	f) eight district members, consisting of two men and two women from each Executive
20	Board district;
21	g) Democratic legislators holding the positions of Speaker of the House, President of the
22	Senate, and Majority Leader of the House and Senate; or the Minority Leader and Whip
23	of the House and Senate;
24	h) Democrats holding the offices of Governor, Secretary of State, Attorney General, State
25	Auditor and Superintendent of Public Instruction; and
26	i) The Montana Democratic members of the United States Senate and United States
27	Congress.
28	j) The officials enumerated in (h) and (i) may designate a representative to act in their
29	absence.
30	k) In addition, the Executive Director shall be a non-voting, ex-officio member of the
31	Executive Board.

1	
2	SECTION D: COMMITTEES
3	1. The three standing committees of the Executive Board are Finance, Personnel, and Rules.
4	a) Finance Committee: The Treasurer of the State Central Committee shall serve as the
5	Chair of the Finance Committee. The State Chair shall appoint other members to the
6	committee.
7	b) Personnel Committee: The State Chair shall serve as the Chair of the Personnel
8	Committee. She or he shall appoint six additional Executive Board members to the
9	Personnel Committee, three of whom must be Democratic incumbents holding state or
10	federal elective offices (or their designated representatives).
11	c) Rules Committee: The State Chair shall appoint a Rules Committee.
12	2. The State Chair shall appoint other committees as needed.
13	
14	SECTION E: REMOVAL FOR ABSENCE
15	1. Any executive committee member who fails to attend any three successive meetings of the
16	Executive Board, after proper notice being given of those meetings, shall be dropped from
17	membership on the Executive Board, unless a satisfactory excuse is provided and accepted by a
18	majority vote of the Executive Board.
19	2. This rule does not apply to members listed in Rule 6, Section C, #1(g), (h), (i), or (j).
20	
21	RULE 7 VACANCIES & REMOVAL OF OFFICERS
22	
23	SECTION A: VACANCIES
24	1. A vacancy exists whenever a precinct committeeman or woman, officer or member dies,
25	resigns, becomes permanently incapacitated or fails to maintain the qualifications of the office. A
26	vacancy also exists whenever the State Chair, State Vice Chair, or any permanent, paid employee
27	of the Montana Democratic Party becomes a candidate for or holds any state or national office,
28	excluding the office of state legislator.
29	2. Unless specified otherwise in this rule, or in law, vacancies on any committee or board shall
30	be filled by election by members of such committee.
31	3. Vacant positions shall be filled as follows:

- a) Precinct Committeemen and Committeewomen: Remaining members of the county
 central committee shall elect a precinct resident to fill the vacancy.
- b) Officers of City or County Central Committees: Vacant seats for officers not filled
 by an appropriate alternate already provided in these rules shall be filled by a person
 having the necessary qualifications for the vacant seat and shall be elected by the county
 central committee, except as provided in Rule 7, Section A, #3(e).
- c) Executive Board Members: If the State Chair position becomes vacant, the State
 Vice Chair shall become Chair. Vacancies in the positions of State Vice Chair or board
 members, including National Committee Members, shall be filled by a vote of the
 Executive Board, subject to the notice requirements in Rule 6, Section B, #2.
 Nominations must be made by Board members, and candidates for vacancies must meet
- the same qualifications as the person formerly occupying the position. Election shall be
 by majority vote of the board members present and voting.
- 14 d) Immediate Past State Chair & Vice Chair: Vacancies in the position of immediate
 15 past State Chair and immediate past State Vice Chair shall not be filled.
- e) No Established Central Committee: If there are no elected or appointed precinct
 committee persons serving in a county, the State Chair shall appoint, with the approval of
 a majority of the Executive Board, county central committee officers to form a new
 committee. The appointed officers, who must be residents of the county, may then fill
- 20 vacant precinct positions as provided in Rule 7, Section A, #3(a). The appointed officers

shall serve until the next county convention.

21 22

23 SECTION B: REMOVAL

1. Members of the Executive Board, except the National Committeeman and Committeewoman,
may be removed from office for cause by a 2/3 vote of the Executive Board at a special meeting
called on 15 days written notice. The notice shall contain the issues and be signed by 25% of the
members of the Executive Board. Prior to the vote, the member shall be given an opportunity to
address the matters of concern.

29 2. City or county central committee officers may be removed from office according to rules

30 established by each county central committee, or, in the absence of county rules, by a 2/3 vote of

31 the total membership of the committee.

2 **<u>RULE 8 CONVENTIONS</u>**

3

4 SECTION A: STATE PLATFORM CONVENTION

5 1. Date: The State Chair shall call the Platform Convention after the primary election and no
6 later than September 15 in even-numbered years to formulate the state platform of the
7 Democratic Party and perform such other business as may properly be brought before such a
8 meeting.

9 2. Delegates:

10a) Delegates to the State Platform Convention shall include the Montana Democratic

- 11 State Central Committee, the Democratic nominees for all state elective offices, the
- 12 United States Senate, the United States House of Representatives, and both Democratic
- 13 incumbents and nominees for the Montana Legislature.
- b) Partner organizations of the Montana Democratic Party are also entitled to five
- 15 delegates from each Executive Board district. Each partner organization shall nominate
- 16 delegates to be elected at the Platform Convention. Prior to the Platform Convention,
- 17 partner organizations shall present any nominations to the State Executive Board for
- 18 verification that such nominations were properly made under the rules of the respective
- 19 chartered organization.
- 20 c) Persons serving as delegates may hold only one delegate position. Persons eligible to
- hold more than one delegate position must designate the position for which they desire to
 serve as a delegate. Vacant positions may be filled by an eligible alternate.

3. Quorum: At the State Platform Convention, 40% of the delegates eligible to attend and voteshall constitute a quorum.

26 SECTION B: STATE OFFICERS CONVENTION

1. **Date:** The State Chair shall call the State Officers Convention between July 1 and October 31

28 of each odd numbered year to elect a Chair, Vice Chair, Treasurer, and Secretary of the State

29 Central Committee and members of the Executive Board.

1	2. Delegates: Delegates to the State Officers Convention shall include all members of the
2	Montana Democratic State Central Committee and Democratic incumbents of the Montana
3	Legislature.
4	3. Quorum: At the State Officers Convention, 40% of the delegates eligible to attend and vote
5	shall constitute a quorum.
6	4. Terms of State Officers: Officers and Executive Board members shall hold office for a term
7	of two years or until a successor is elected.
8	
9	SECTION C: NATIONAL COMMITTEE MEMBERS ELECTIONS
10	1. Election Procedure:
11	a) At each state convention to elect delegates to a national Presidential Nomination
12	Convention, a number of National Committeemen and National Committeewomen, as
13	determined by the Democratic National Committee, shall be elected.
14	b) The persons eligible to vote for these officers and the manner of their election, shall be
15	as provided in Rule 8, Section B.
16	c) The State Chair shall file the names of the National Committeeman and National
17	Committeewoman with the Democratic National Committee no later than five days from
18	the date of their selection.
19	2. Terms of National Committee Members: The National Committeeman and National
20	Committeewoman shall serve four-year terms commencing on the day the national convention
21	adjourns and terminating on the day the next national convention adjourns.
22	
23	SECTION D: CONVENTION RULES
24	1. Registration: For both the Platform Convention and the Officers Convention, delegates must
25	register according to procedures established by the State Chair.
26	2. Rules: All matters pertaining to any state convention not provided for by law or these rules
27	shall be governed by rules adopted by such conventions.
28	
29	RULE 9 PROXIES
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31	1. No proxy vote will be recognized at any county, city, district, or state Democratic meeting.

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- 2 RULE 10 PRE-PRIMARY & CANDIDATE ENDORSEMENT POLICY
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4	1. During a statewide or federal election campaign, the Montana State Democratic Party shall
5	expend no funds and provide no tactical support for any candidate. The Executive Board may by
6	2/3 vote authorize the expenditure of funds and tactical support for proven incumbents who have
7	consistently demonstrated support of the Party platform and issues for incumbents who are
8	running unopposed.
9	2. Absent Executive Board support of a proven statewide or federal incumbent, the State Chair,
10	Vice Chair, Executive Director and paid party staff shall maintain neutrality throughout any
11	contested primary.
12	3. The Executive Board may expend Party funds during a primary campaign for the
13	entertainment of visiting dignitaries from outside the state who may have been invited to appear
14	in the state at the request of the State Central Committee or the Executive Board.
15	4. The State Chair, Vice Chair, Executive Director and paid staff of the Montana Democratic
16	Party shall resign these positions if they file to run for elective office in a contested primary.
17	
18	RULE 11 RULES OF ORDER
19	
20	1. "Roberts Rules of Order, Newly Revised (RONR)," shall govern the proceedings of all
21	meetings existing under these rules, except as provided in Rule 8, Section D, #2.
22	
23	RULE 12 AMENDMENTS TO THE RULES
24	
25	1. Voting: These rules may be amended at any meeting of the Montana Democratic State Central
26	Committee by a 2/3 vote of those present.
27	2. Notice: Fifteen days written notice of the proposed change shall be given to Montana
28	Democratic State Central Committee members. Notices may be delivered by email.
29	3. Quorum: At any meeting of the Montana Democratic State Central Committee, 20% shall
30	constitute a quorum.
31	

<u>RULE 13 PROCEDURES FOR FILLING A VACANCY FOR A DEMOCRATIC</u> <u>CANDIDATE FOR AN OFFICE WITHIN ONE COUNTY</u>

4 1. Vacancies occurring among Democratic candidates that by law are to be filled by action of the
5 county central committee shall be filled according to the provisions of this rule insofar as they do
6 not conflict with state law.

7 2. Appointment of a person to fill the vacancy shall be by a majority vote of the precinct 8 committeemen and committeewomen present at a meeting called for that purpose and publicized 9 throughout the county. The county chair shall provide reasonable written or email notice to 10 committee members unless the deadline for filling the vacancy as determined by the election 11 administrator precludes such notice, in which case notification by telephone shall be required. 12 3. At the meeting, nominations of persons qualified to fill the vacancy may be made by precinct 13 committeemen or committeewomen. Following the close of nominations, an election shall be 14 held with each precinct committeeman and committeewoman voting for one person. (If more 15 than one vacancy is to be filled at the meeting, separate votes shall be taken for each vacancy.) 16 The person receiving a majority of the votes cast shall be reported by the county chair to the 17 election administrator as the party nominee. If no person receives a majority of the votes cast on 18 the first ballot, the name of the person receiving the fewest votes shall be stricken from 19 subsequent ballots until one person receives a majority of the votes cast. 20

21 <u>RULE 14 SPECIAL NOMINATING CONVENTION TO FILL A VACANCY FOR A</u> 22 <u>CANDIDATE FOR A MULTI-COUNTY OFFICE</u>

23

1. In the event the Democratic Party shall have to nominate a candidate for a multi-county

25 district office, the procedures for such nomination shall be as provided in this rule.

26 2. The State Chair shall call a nominating convention. The State Chair or his or her designee

- 27 shall preside. The convention shall choose a secretary and may adopt rules for nominating
- 28 speeches, candidate presentations and other procedural matters.
- 29 3. The precinct committeemen and committeewomen from precincts within the district shall be
- 30 delegates to the nominating convention.

1 4. The State Chair shall issue a convention call to the county chair of each county within the

2 district. The call shall be issued so as to provide reasonable notice to the delegates. The call shall

3 include at least the following:

- 4 a) the time, date and place of the nominating convention;
- 5 b) a list of the counties and precincts within the district;
- 6 c) the procedures for certifying the identity of precinct committeemen and
- 7 committeewomen eligible to participate; and
- 8 d) the qualifications required of the person to be nominated at the convention.
- 9 5. Any delegate may nominate any Democrat meeting the qualifications provided by law for the10 vacancy being filled.

11 6. The delegates shall cast ballots using weighted votes. Each delegate shall cast a weighted vote

12 equal to one-half the votes cast in his or her precinct for the Democratic candidate for U.S.

13 Representative in the most recent general election.

14 7. The person receiving a majority of the total votes cast shall be declared the Party's nominee. If

15 no person receives a majority of the votes cast on the first ballot, the name of the person

16 receiving the fewest votes shall be stricken from subsequent ballots until one person receives a

17 majority of the votes cast.

18

19 <u>RULE 15 SPECIAL NOMINATING CONVENTION TO FILL A VACANCY FOR A</u> 20 CANDIDATE FOR A STATEWIDE OFFICE

21

1. In the event the Democratic Party shall have to nominate a candidate for statewide office, theprocedures for such nomination shall be as provided in this rule.

24 2. The State Chair shall call a meeting of the Montana Democratic State Central Committee.

25 Reasonable written notice of the meeting shall be issued unless deadlines imposed by the

26 Secretary of State, the laws of Montana, or other authority shall necessitate shorter notice by

- 27 telephone. The notice of the meeting shall include:
- a) a statement that the purpose of the meeting is to fill a vacancy for the Democratic
- 29 Party's candidate for statewide office, and naming the office;
- 30 b) the date, time and place of the meeting;
- 31 c) the procedures by which the nominee will be chosen at the meeting;

- d) the procedures for certifying the election of State Central Committee members not
 already on record with the State Chair; and
- 3 e) the qualifications required of the person to be nominated at the meeting.
- 4 3. Only members of the Montana Democratic State Central Committee shall be entitled to
- 5 participate in the meeting, except that the State Central Committee may adopt rules allowing
- 6 nominating speeches by other persons and may agree to hear presentations by candidates for the
- 7 nomination. Following the close of nominations, the members of the Montana Democratic State
- 8 Central Committee shall vote. The person receiving a majority of the votes cast shall be declared
- 9 the Party's nominee. If no person receives a majority of the votes cast on the first ballot, the
- 10 name of the person receiving the fewest votes shall be stricken from subsequent ballots until one
- 11 person receives a majority of the votes cast.
- 4. The State Chair and Secretary shall sign a certificate of nomination naming the person selectedand shall deliver the original to the Secretary of State.

14 <u>RULE 16 SUBMISSION OF RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FILLING A VACANCY IN</u> 15 <u>THE LEGISLATURE OR IN A BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS</u>

- 16
- In the event the Democratic Party shall have to recommend to county commissioners a list of
 candidates to fill a vacancy in the legislature, or in the office of county commissioner, as
 provided by law, the procedures for compiling such list (and a second list, if needed) shall be as
 provided in this rule.
- 21 2. Vacancy in a district entirely within one county.
- a) following any necessary consultation with the county commissioners, the county chair
 shall call a meeting of the county central committee, providing reasonable written or
 email notice, or notifying members by telephone if four days written notice cannot be
 afforded.
- b) at the meeting, precinct committeemen and committeewomen shall nominate a
- 27 minimum of three persons qualified to serve in the vacant office. Following the close of
- 28 nominations, each committeeman and committeewoman shall cast a ballot, voting for no
- 29 more than three candidates and not more than once for any one candidate. The names of
- 30 the three persons receiving the most votes shall be certified to the appropriate body by the
- 31 county chair as the recommended candidates of the Democratic Party.

1 3. Vacancy in a district comprised of two or more counties. 2 a) following any necessary consultation with the county commissioners, the State Chair 3 shall call a nominating convention in a convenient location in one of the counties 4 comprising the district. 5 b) reasonable written or email notice of the meeting shall be provided to all delegates; 6 notice by telephone will be required unless at least four days written notice can be 7 provided. 8 c) precinct committeemen and committeewomen from precincts within the district shall 9 be delegates to the joint meeting. The State Chair or his or her designee shall preside at 10 the joint meeting. 11 d) delegates shall nominate a minimum of three persons qualified to serve in the vacant 12 office. 13 e) each delegate shall cast a ballot, voting for no more than three candidates and not 14 voting more than once for each candidate. The weight of each delegate's vote shall be 15 equal to one-half the votes received in that precinct at the last election by the person 16 vacating the office. (The State Chair shall have final authority to assign weighted votes in 17 instances where precinct lines, or district lines may have changed since the election, or 18 other circumstances dictate.) Ballots marked with the proper weighted votes shall be 19 distributed by the presiding officer through a roll call of the counties and their precincts. 20 f) the names of the three persons receiving the most votes shall be certified to the county 21 commissioners by the State Chair as the recommended candidates of the Democratic 22 Party. 23

24 RULE 17 APPEALS

25

1. In all cases where application of these rules is contested, the aggrieved party must file a

- 27 timely, written protest with the State Chair, Vice Chair, and Executive Director.
- 28 2. The State Chair will call on the state Rules Committee to investigate and resolve the conflict.

29 The Rules Committee's decision is final, unless overruled by a 2/3 vote of the Executive Board.
