# Murder

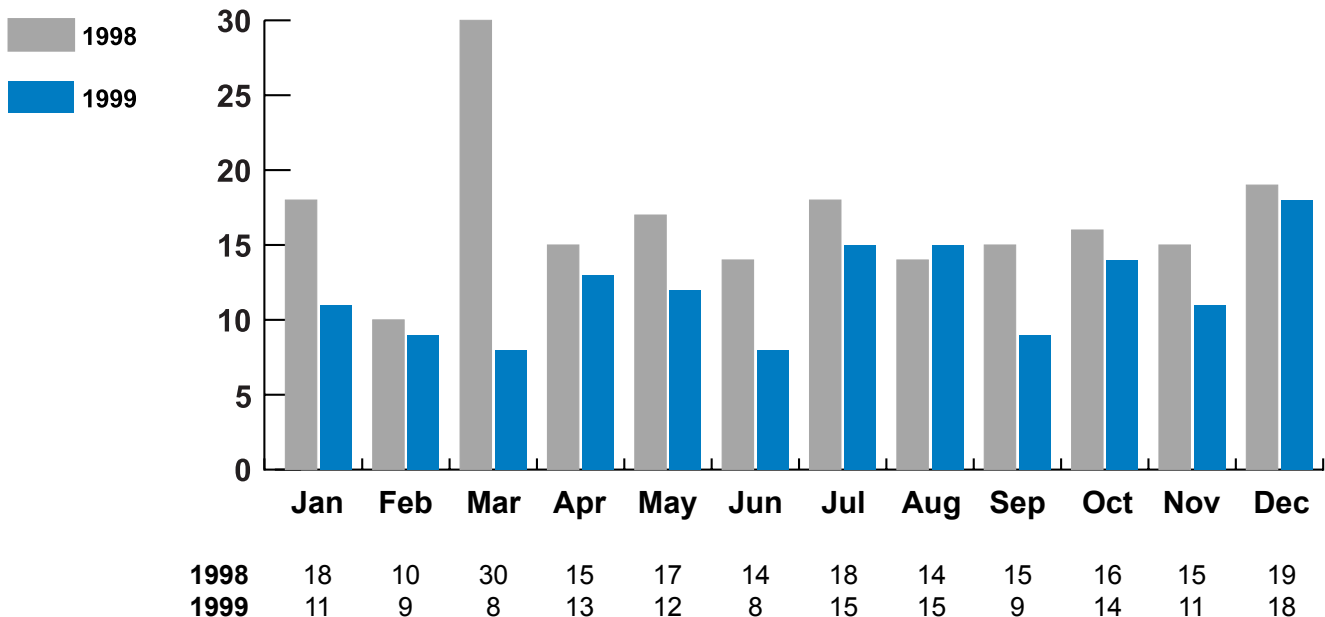
The willful (nonnegligent) killing of one human being by another.

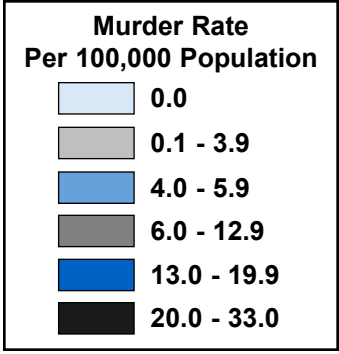
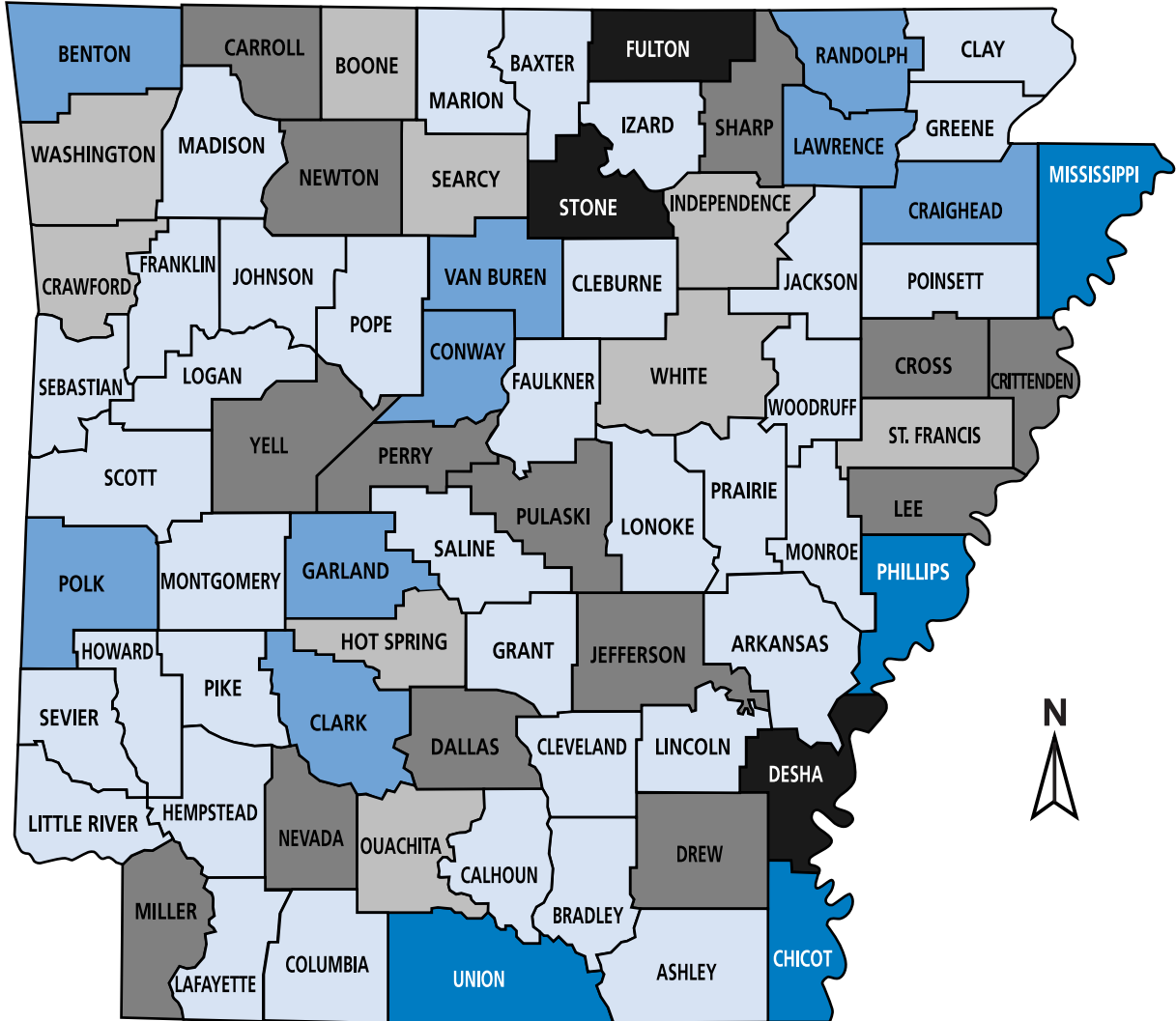

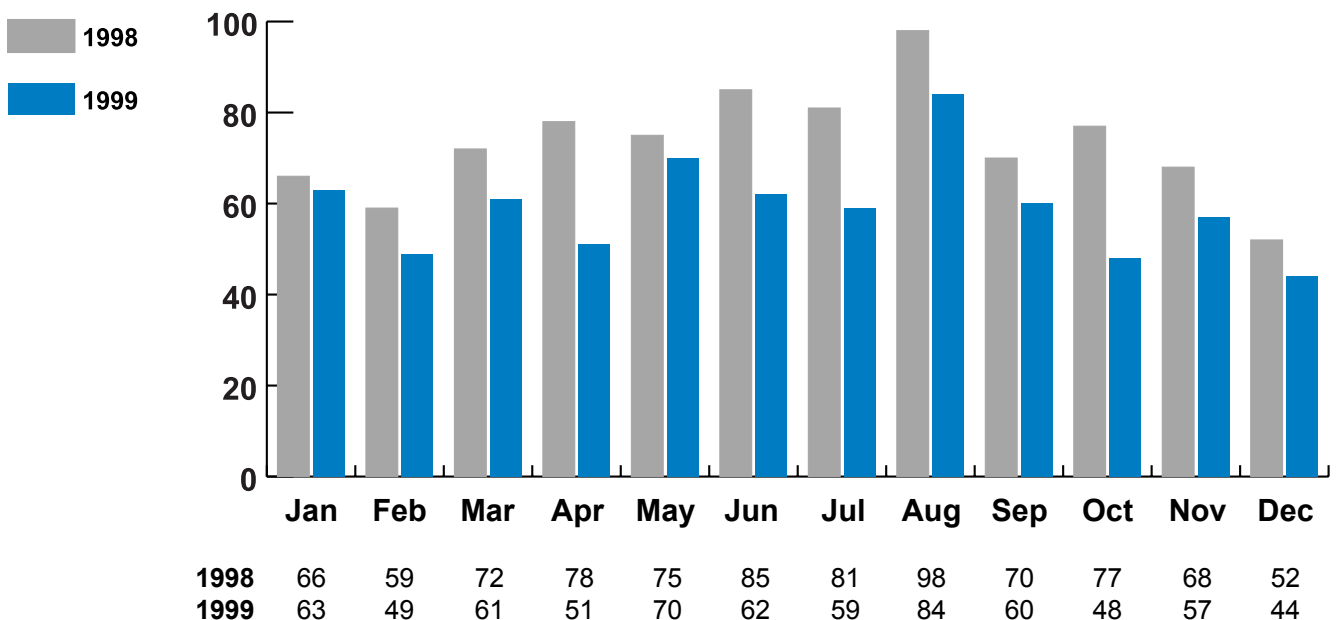
The carnal knowledge of a female through the use or threat of force. Assaults to commit forcible rape are also included.

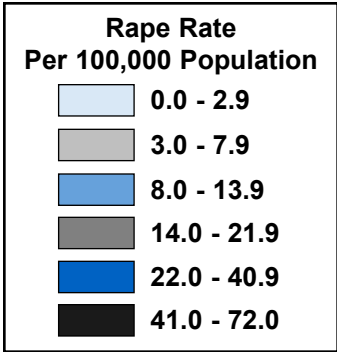
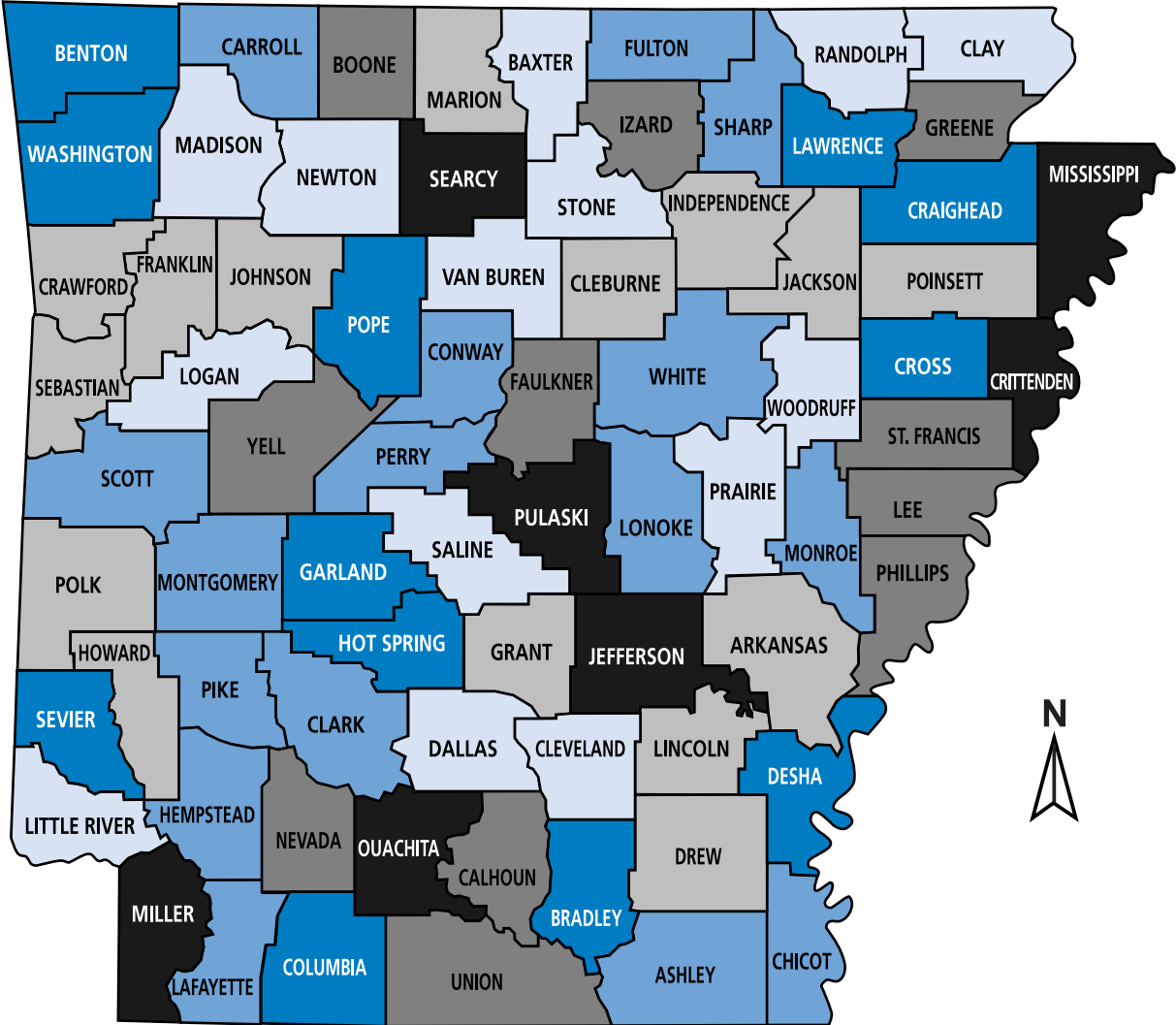

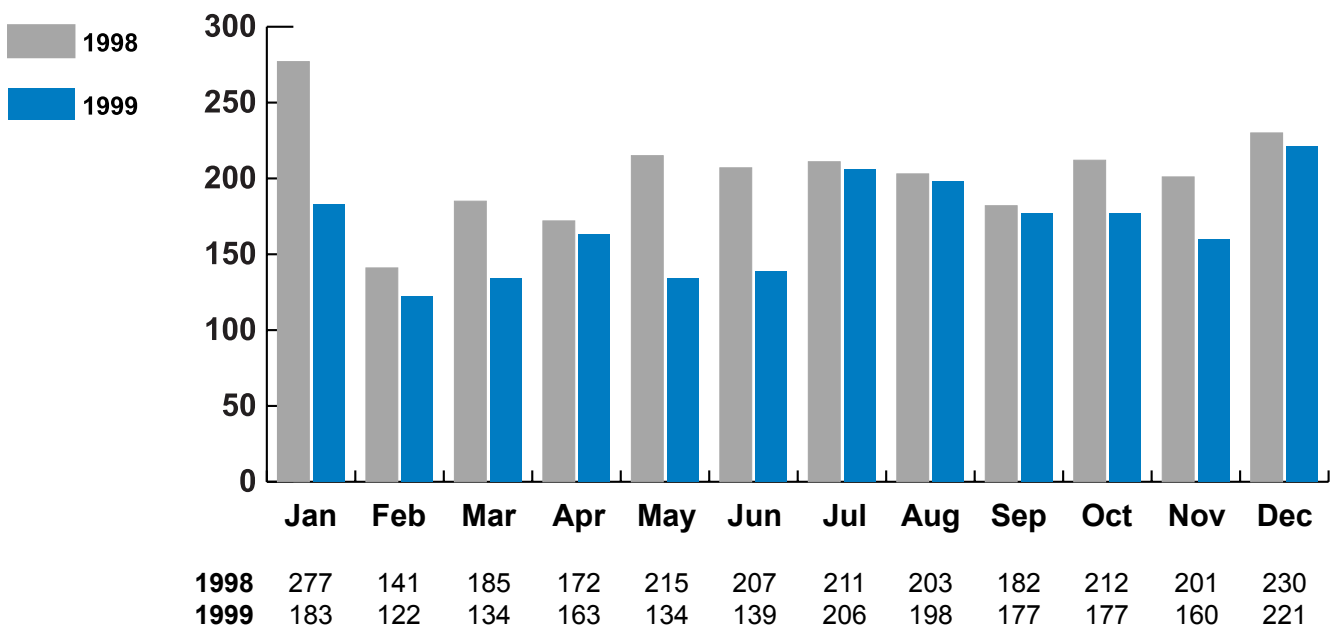
The taking, or attempting to take, anything of value under confrontational circumstances from a person by use of force, threat of force, or by putting the victim in fear of immediate harm.

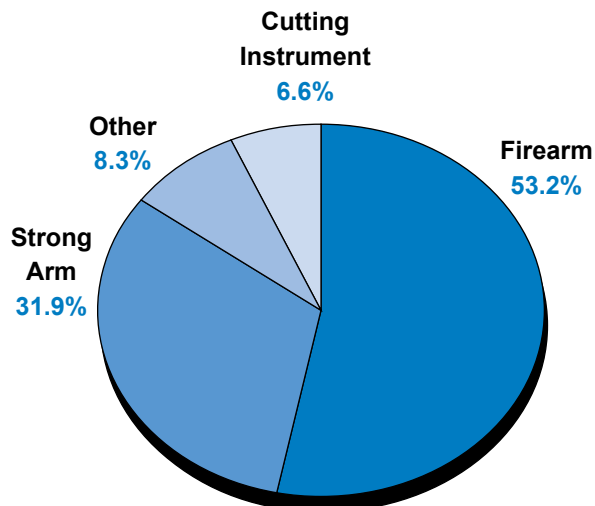

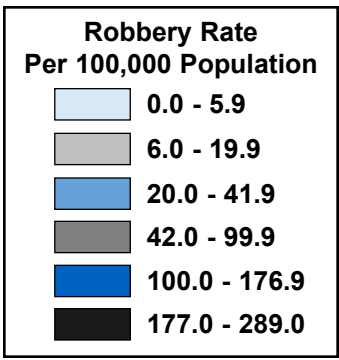
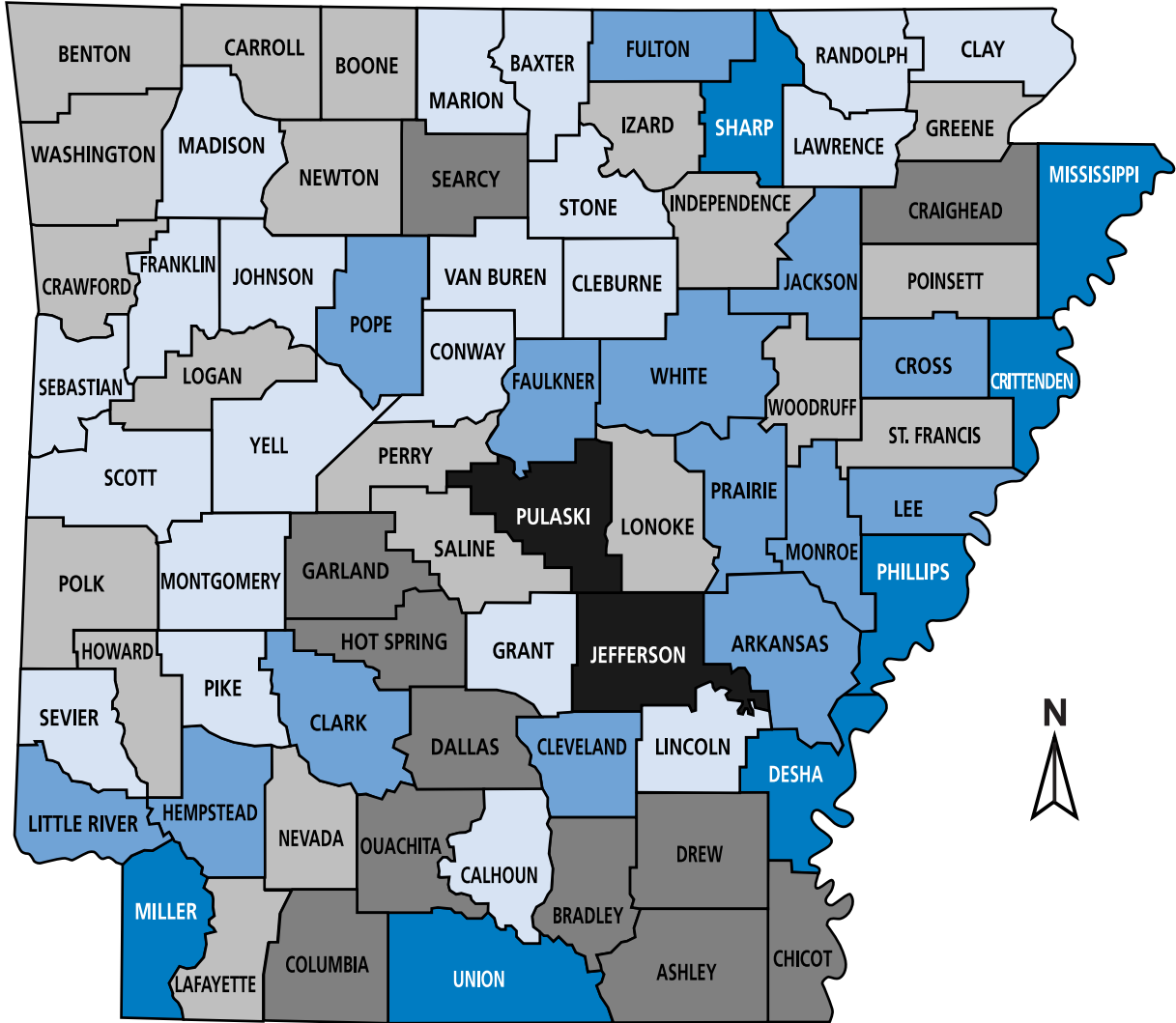

# Aggravated Assault

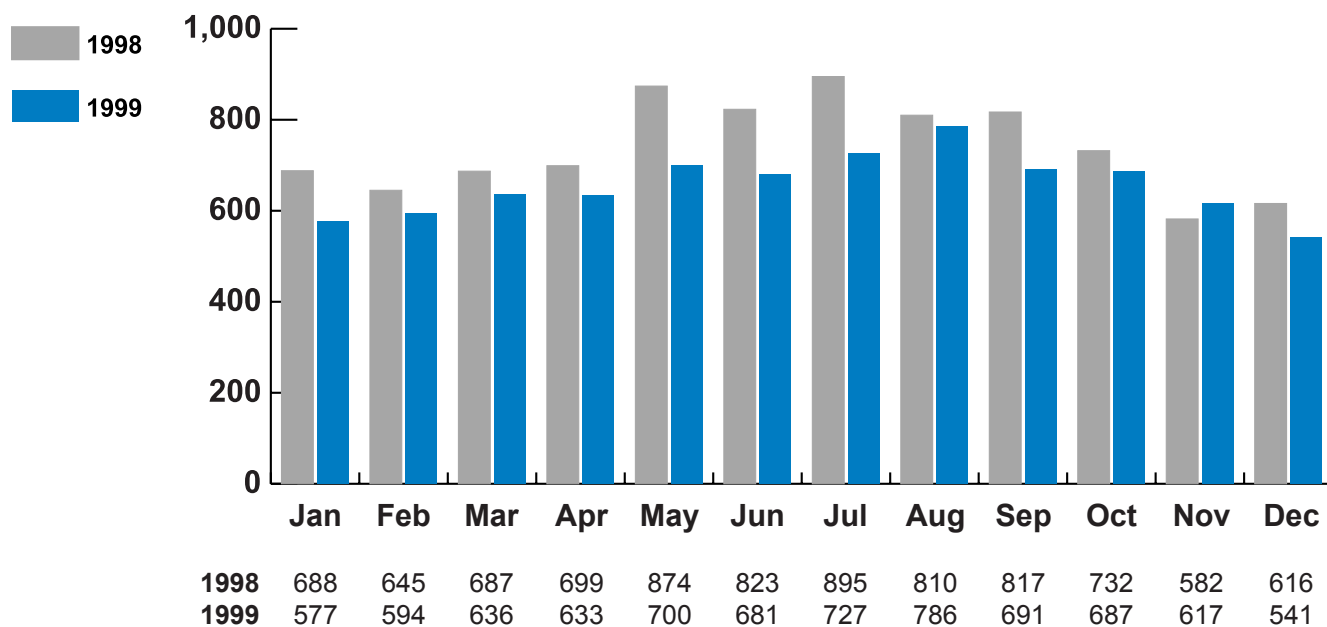

Aggravated assaults accounted for 8 percent of the crime index and 73 percent of violent crimes. The eight largest law enforcement jurisdictions accounted for 37 percent of aggravated assaults in the state.

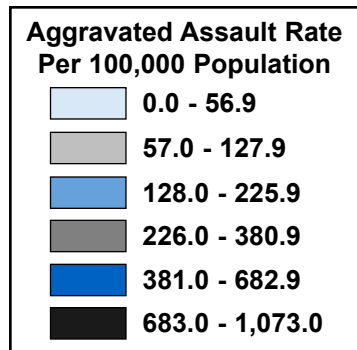
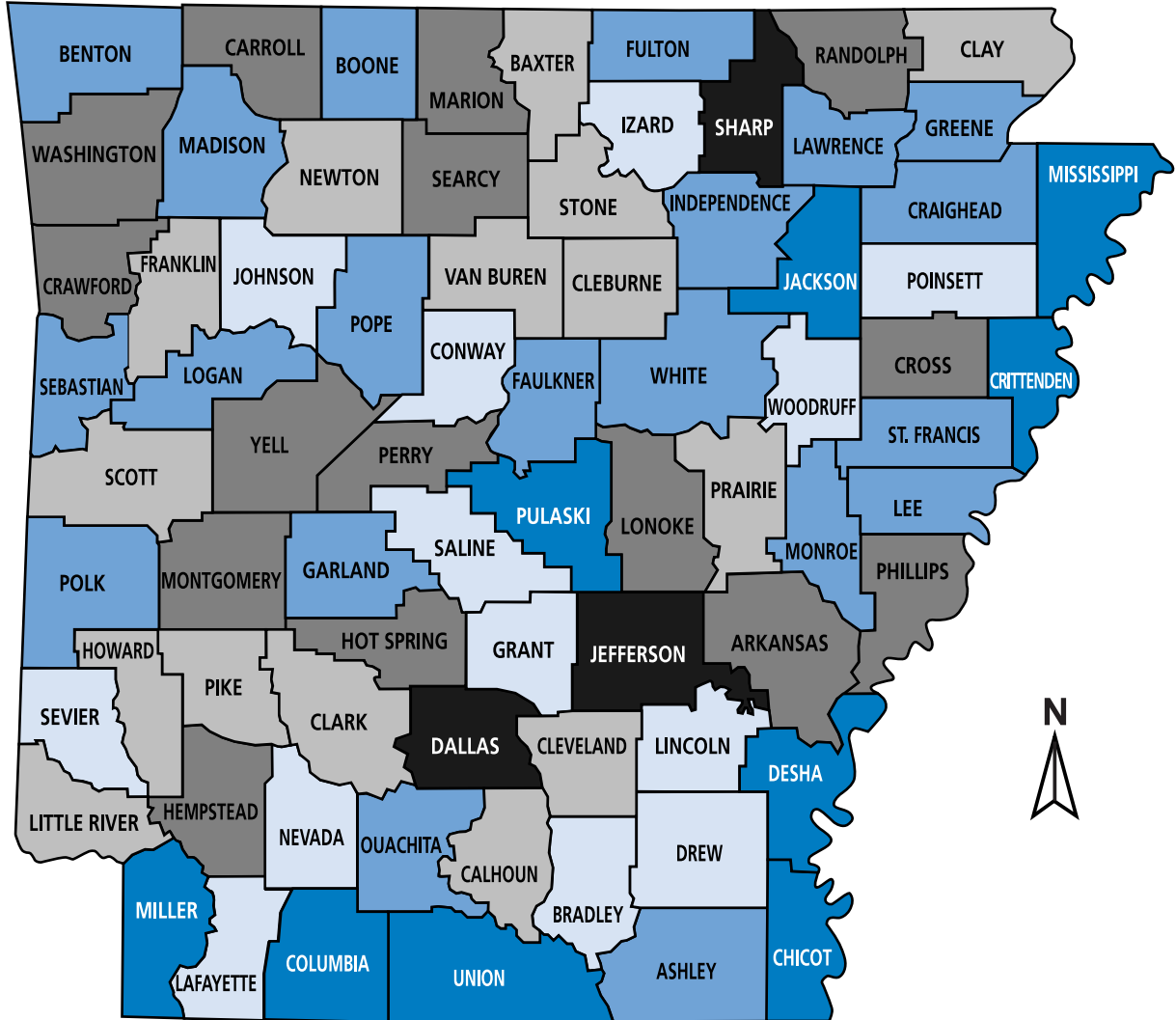

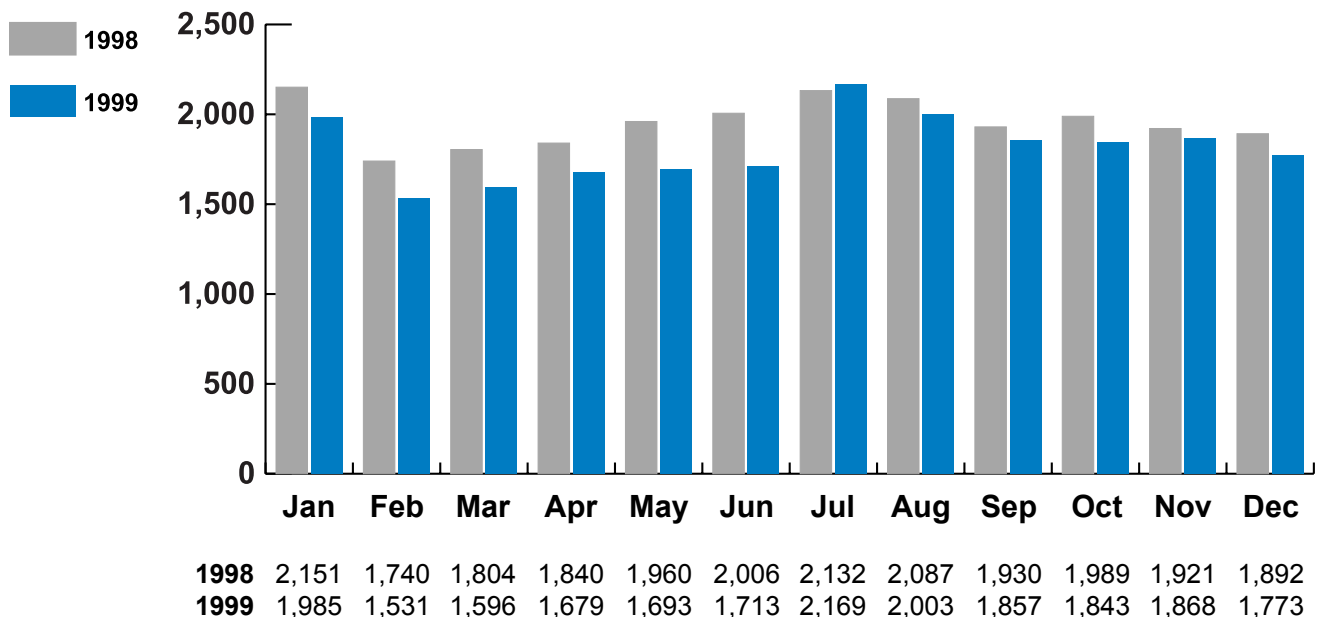

## Burglary by Month 1998 - 1999



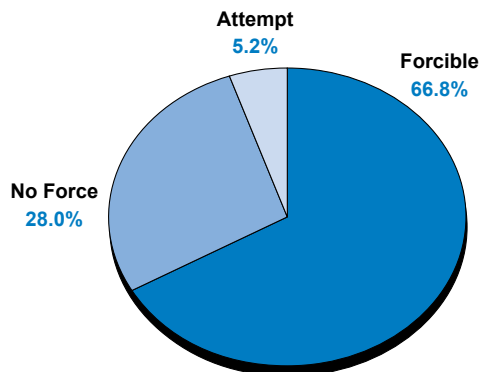

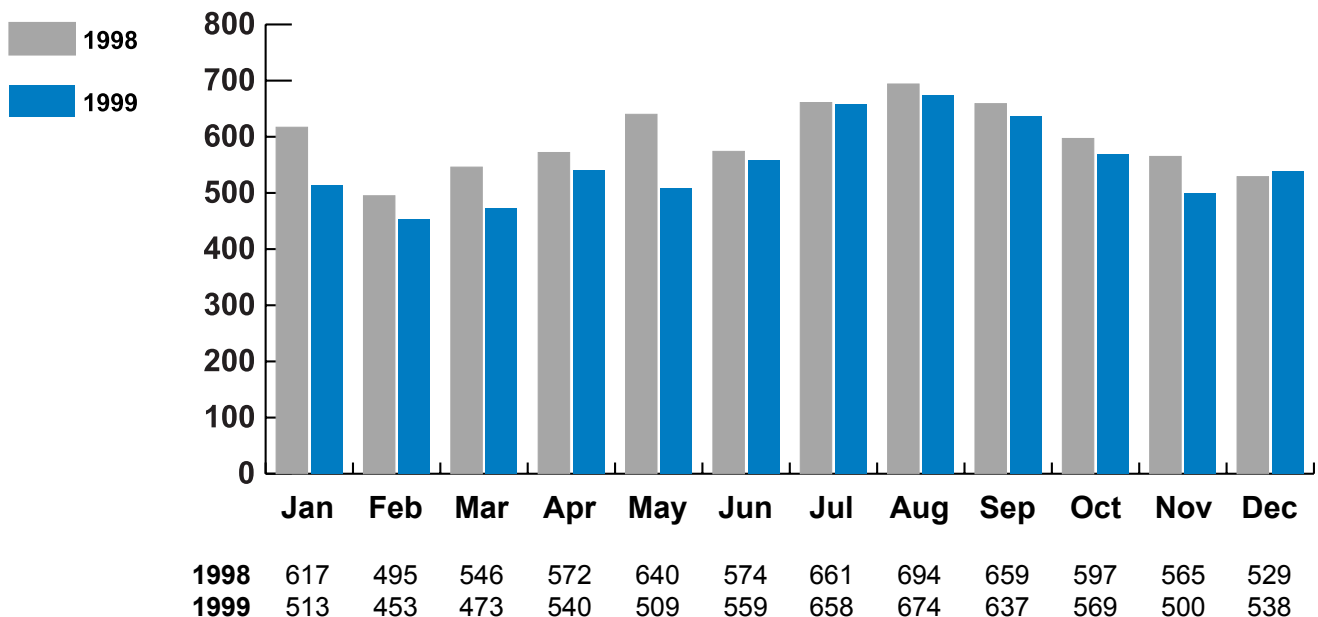
