UN / UN Chief Urges Member States, Staff to Participate in MDG 1,000 Days of Action

The UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon rallied the United Nations community in a Call to Action, capping off a week of activities to spur accelerated progress in the 1,000 days to the end of 2015 — the target date for achieving the eight anti-poverty Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). The UN chief met with young people in Spain to discuss the urged need for action and have a ceremonial kick-off to the 1,000 Days at a Real Madrid football match. He then carried his 1,000-days message to Vatican City where he had an audience with Pope Francis, and more recently to the White House in a meeting with President Barack Obama. "Over the next 1,000 days, let us give 1,000 percent," Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon told delegates and UN staff gathered at the UN Headquarters in New York.

UN / Future Perspectives for Global Development: an Overview from Russia

We are facing a crucial moment for development, says the Presidential Aide Elvira Nabiullina. The deadline for meeting the Millennium Development Goals terminates on 2015. The worldwide society is elaborating a global agenda in the area of development after the year 2015. In practical terms, it will be a new paradigm of global development based on solidarity with a strong emphasis on welfare and preservation of our common heritage. This should be an inclusive process. And Russia is part of it.

UNDP / On Russia's Strengthened Role in Global Forums: International Development and Cooperation with the UN

Traditionally Russia plays an important role in global politics and in cooperation with international organizations. But particularly in 2013, when Russia assumed the chairmanship in G20 forum there is a critical shift in country's role – to demonstrate leadership in global priorities areas. Russia's chairmanship in G20 in 2013, in G8 in 2014 and in BRICS in 2015 provides Russia with a unique opportunity to demonstrate its emerging role as a serious donor for development initiatives, as well as to take part in a global process of formulating development goals for post-2015.

UNHCR / Simplified Procedures of Granting Russian Citizenship to Stateless Persons: Stavropol Experience

The results of 2010 all-Russia population census published in 2012 report about 178,000 persons identifying themselves as stateless. Federal Migration Service and its territorial bodies do their best to reduce the scope of statelessness, and due to their efforts during the last decade nearly 650,000 stateless persons were granted Russian citizenship. UNHCR supports NGOs and networks especially in "problem regions" that provide free and professional legal assistance to stateless persons and persons with unregulated status applying for citizenship in the Russian Federation. The article features life stories of two women going through all stages of assuming their legal status in Russia. This is not an easy process, although there are positive prospects for others.

UNIC / Shared Responsibility

Earlier in March 2013 the International Narcotics Control Board (INCB) presented its report for 2012. It was also launched at the UN Information Centre in Moscow with participation of Galina Korchagina from National Scientific Centre. The reports provides an analysis of the global drug control situation, and draws attention to gaps and weaknesses in national and international drug control, and makes recommendations to Governments and international and regional organizations. The drug problem is truly global and interconnected, necessitating a global solution, with action at all levels. At the national and regional levels, shared responsibility means that drug control should be included in economic and social development plans.
