THE WEST AUSTRALIAN WINS AUSTRALIA'S FIRST EDITORS LAB HACKATHON

The West Australian won Australia's first Editors Lab Hackathon in Sydney on March 3-4, 2016.

The two-day event attracted journalists, designers and developers from Seven West Media, News Corp, Fairfax Media, The Guardian, ABC, SBS and leading journalism universities.

The teams competed to create a prototype in the theme of 'data-driven stories'. Teams were asked to devise practical apps that use advanced computer technology to locate and interpret data to deliver news to consumers.

Organised by the <u>Global Editors Network</u> and <u>Walkley Foundation</u>, The West Australian's team of Ben Martin, Assistant Editor, Joe Hardy, Head of Digital Development and Sophia Lewis, Web Developer and Designer, created <u>BEAT</u> – an interactive map that draws on the WA Police MatCAD system to display police incidents in real time.

The team won an all-expense paid trip to Vienna to represent the Australian digital news industry at the global final.

Dan Stinton, Head of Digital, said that this is a fantastic example of what can be achieved when editorial and development work together.
