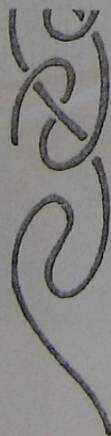
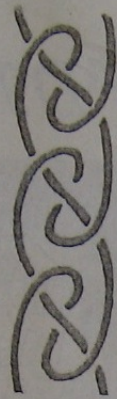

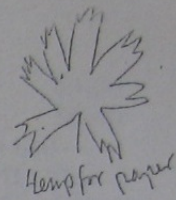

LET IT GROW!

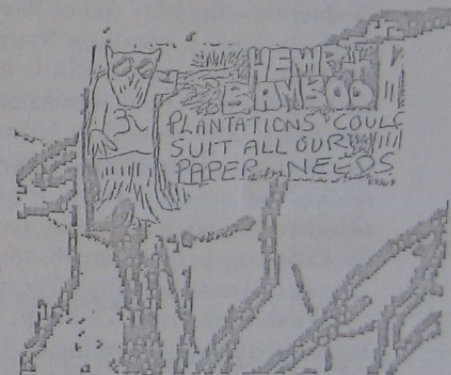

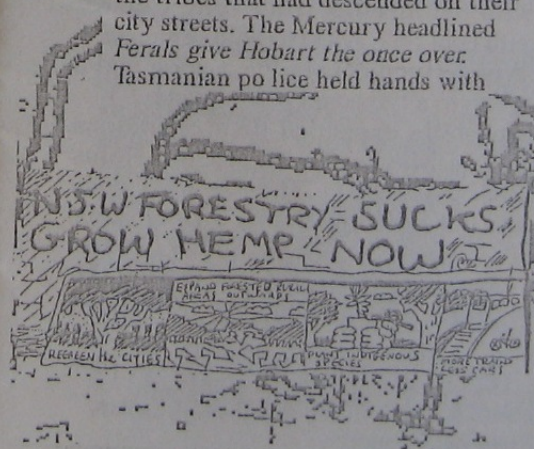

US not U.S.

At easter 93 about 700 people travelled to the Sth Aust desert, 7000 km from Sydney to a place called Nurrungar. This place was taken from the Kokatha people and labelled "prohibited area" for the sake of the U.S. military, its Australian parasites and global military "security". The Nurrungar base is officially a "joint" communications facility but in reality it serves the interests of the U.S. spy machine by tracking messages from and spying on satellites over Australia and the Asia-Pacific region.

The people of Aust. and more importantly the traditional landowners of the region, the Kokatha, aren't allowed into the area and aren't even told what exactly goes on at the base or what the message it picks up are used for. We do know that in the Gulf War the base was used to interrupt Scud missiles, however its success rate in doing this was pretty pathetic and just shows how pointless and wasteful the uses of high technology for military purposes really are.

what looked like leftovers from the Mad Max movies struggling with police and other authorities.

Anyway, this story of land theft, secrecy and militarism is basically what got these 700 people pissed off enough to go to the base and let their steam out, their hair hang down and their buttocks flash (among other things).

The media dismissed the group as a bunch of Anarchic public nuisances, the Nurrungar Nasties, enemies of the state and wasters of the taxpayers money (!?!). They must have conveniently missed out on hearing the great grannies for peace, the construction, forestry, mining, engineering union (CFMEU), the spokeswoman for the Kokatha people, the representatives of peace movements in Bougainville, the Philippines and Cuba, or seen all the families and Christians that turned up.

In fact the Mainstream media missed the whole point. They didn't mention the fact that \$20 million is spent annually on U.S. bases in Australia and that the protestors are tax payers themselves!

A whole range of actions took place, most of them colourful and peaceful. The most inspiring action was the break-in to the Woomera rocket range. The police arrived embarrassingly late - a bunch of people had already climbed the fence, gone for a stroll and decorated the buildings with spraypaint. The lack of predictable authority figures, the Australian protective (sic) services, ASIO, mounted police, german shepards, motorbikes and police confronting protestors was very refreshing.

The fact that protests always seem to rely on the media for maximum effect means that police are always notified and a part of it. This is pretty depressing because it means that the protestors enemy number one becomes the police, when really the pigs are only a small part of a big fucked up political construct. I think the police get their photos taken much more than they are worthy of.

The next bit is taken out of Leigh Sharp's article in Thurunka (UNSW paper); The military is the biggest multinational company in the world. The richest, the most untouchable, the most resource intensive, the most destructive and the best networked. It has its head office in the American Pentagon and Australia (like many other countries) has become a minor customer, sales outlet and around convert. Like any sensible multinational it ensures a continuing supply and demand for its products by whatever means necessary - by selling equipment to countries that may then be promoted as a possible threat in their region. Where does this money come from? Housing, Education, Welfare etc, all in the name of national security.

Every hero needs an enemy and America has been at a bit of a loss since the Soviet Union declined the honour.

○ NCE again, the American base at Nurrungar is to be invaded by protesters and how lucky they are to be living in a country which is free enough to allow them to protest.

Anyway, what the overall outcome of the Nurrungar protest was, is hard to say. In terms of media coverage a few sensational headlines and disgusted letters to the editor may have made "Nurrungar" a household name for a few days. Although this kind of effect isn't all bad, it's a bit like a mozzly bite which comes with an itch and goes with a sign of relief. For the people who went, it was definitely a less short-lived experience. We saw the raydomes, we saw the fence absurdly placed in the middle of nowhere, we talked to the Kokatha people and met heaps of good folks. This kind of knowledge isn't trivialised or forgotten by the time you reach the crossword or pass the expiry date. Hopefully it will linger, inspire and be shared with people for some time to come.

Look out for actions against U.S. military bases in the future - the next major campaign will be at Pine Gap spy base (near Alice Springs). The military-industrial complex also rears its ugly head in June with a "defence opportunities for industry" conference in Melbourne and Sydney.

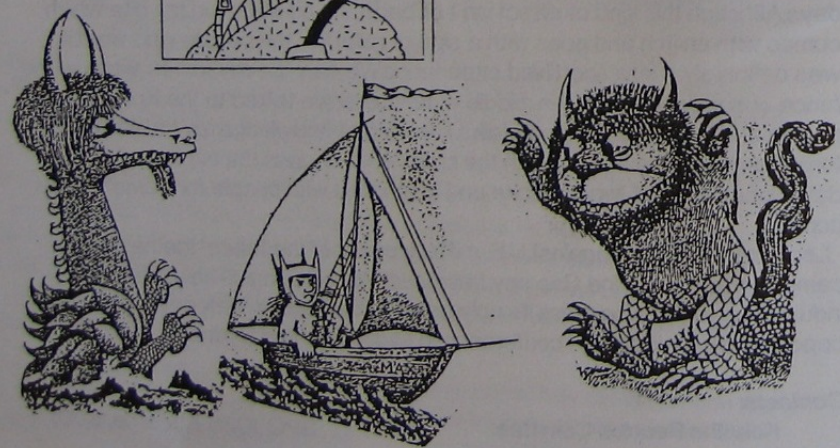

By sorting in such a way, we hope to have as complete a collection as possible of alternative periodicals so that anyone can see at a glance a whole history of peoples and their struggles and ideas that have evolved, which would otherwise go unreported and possibly refuted by the waste of paper that is the mainstream press.

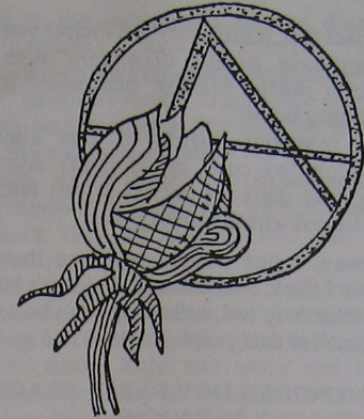

Did it feel the pressure and decide to get the fuck out? (ha ha)

No, seriously, was Oppenheimer just curious about what would happen or was he aware that metaphorically he was digging the graves of millions?

You don't have to be a genius to work out that the motives behind science and universities aren't always as innocent as they are made out to be. Academia, science and technology are dressed up in elitism and fancy words that hide the fact that it all affects us in a very real way. It's important to criticize the emphasis and priorities of science and technology - it doesn't mean that you have to be anti-technology.

Because they are interrelated, a priority in one will be reflected in the other. The priority of technology is military, so the priority of science is also military. That's why over half the scientists in the world work directly or indirectly for or with research grants from the department of defence.

That's why US\$1 trillion is spent on the global military budget each year - and the channels in which this flows is determined by the forces which drive the market or determine the priorities of the state budget - enter big business, student sponsorship by the army and techno. parx.

Military interests in scientific research lie in fields like com-munications, biotechnology and genetic engineering, of which all can have a pretty scary impact if they are used with dodgy motives.

Although genetic engineers say their priorities are human health and wellbeing, things like genetic screening are becoming more common. Genetic screening is a useful discrimination tool for the elite because it puts people into categories of "clean genetic makeup" or "dodgy genetic makeup".

In 1982, 17 out of the biggest 399 companies in the US already thought genetic screening was an ordinary procedure when employing new people and 5% of others were currently introducing it.

The fact that, legally they can't reject people if they have genetic *disorders* doesn't guarantee much, because otherwise, why would they bother?

The potential misuse of this kind of technology by cops, etc is pretty scary - "Hey, why don't we get rid of this bitch - she's loaded with **criminal genes!**"

Anyway, I just wanted to bring that up because I think, that although it doesn't have to be inherently bad, technology can be a lot less harmless than people think.

ADV. TECHNOLOGY PARK - PLAGUE GROUND FOR THE RICH!



Universities are made out to be pretty innocent in our time - they are the providers of "education for all", the path to success for the working class, etc.

However behind this friendly notion and myth lurks the dubious relationship between universities, arms companies and the department of defence, cooperating on research projects and maintaining informal contact.... For example the uni of NSW carried out guided weapon evaluation as part of a research contract for the military in 89/90.

It is the universities role to desensitize students and mould their innocence/ignorance into a marketable image of "australia's future" to sell to the cabbos.

It's no coincidence that students in applied science or engineering aren't given room to learn social subjects - or the ability to extrapolate the effects of scientific research which they are part of into real social consequences.

The priorities of science and technology have to change before we give them more room and money and freedom to play around with funny little test tubes and things- especially if it means taking funds away from things like housing etc!

That's why the proposed advanced technology park should not be welcomed in Redfern, nor anywhere else.

Universities in our backyard are paving and financing the way for technocrats and big business to keep brewing up their bigger and better techno-fix - more knowledge, more power, bigger habits, keep the money flowing and inject university curriculums and society with assurances that science is pure and technology is for the good of the people. If technology is really for the benefit of people, then why is any information regarding things like the ATP kept as far away from the community as possible?

Even though the workload was a little overbearing at times and the cleaning up a little tedious, the beauty and pure lust for ideas into action which engulfed us all far outweighed the negative.

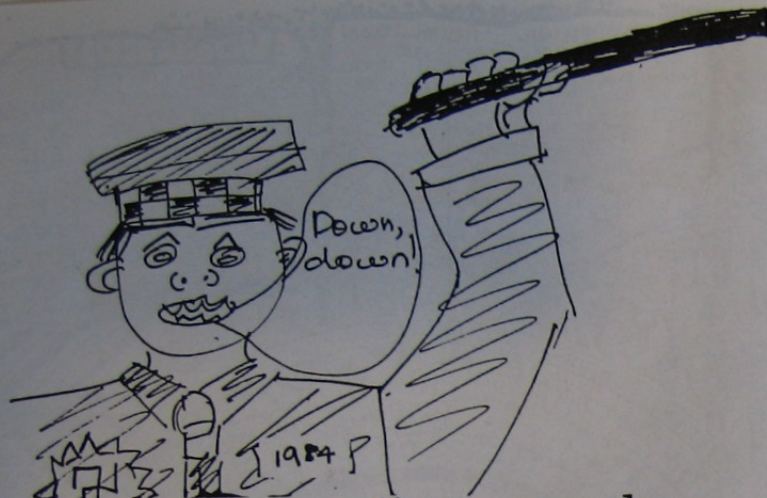

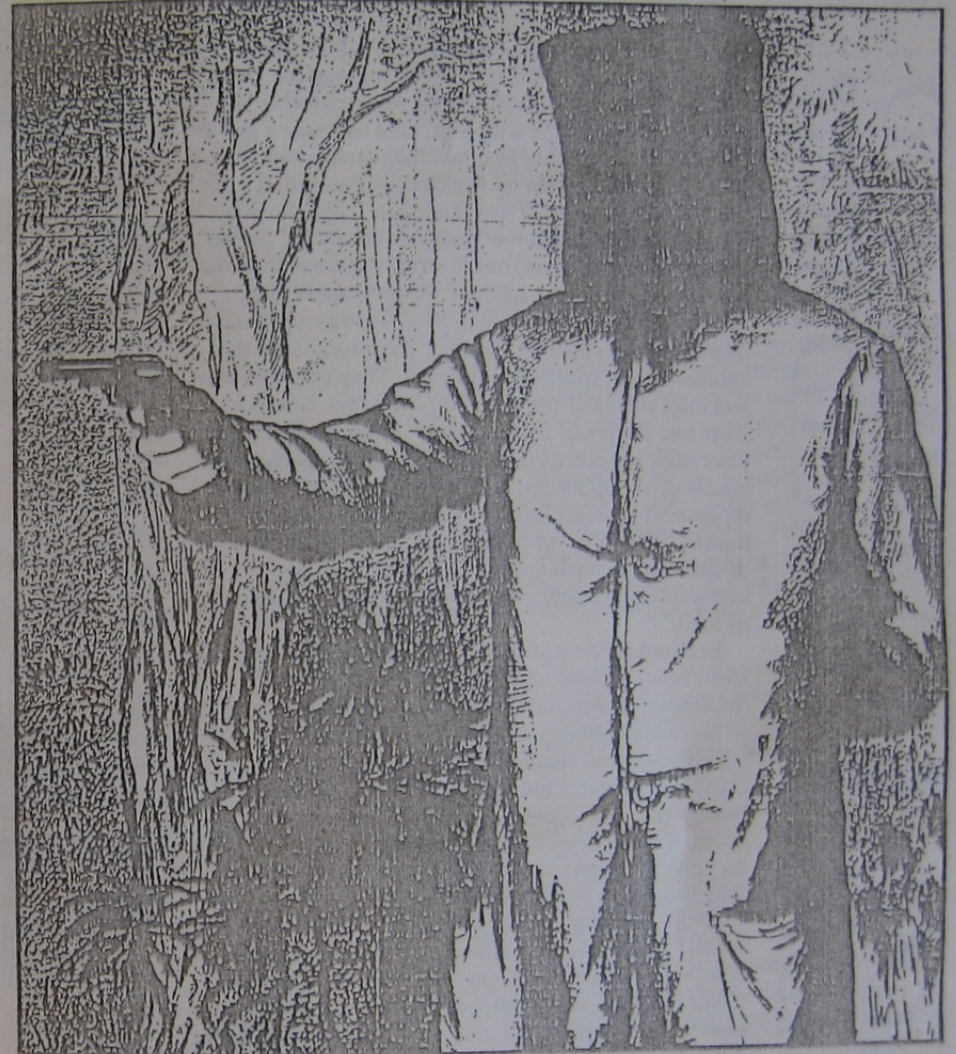

WELCOME TO THAILAND HOLIDAY IN PARADISE???

In Thailand there is no illusion about freedom of speech, suppression of information by the police and military is blatant and often brutal. They censor all news programs to 'provide correct and updated news and info'. It is very dangerous for people to write or speak anything that is anti-govt. Late last year a group of artists from Chaing Mai had their studio and work destroyed, were beaten and evicted by the military police because their work was 'anti-govt'. Despite this a group of people called the 'Bangkok Outsiders' put on regular events with art, music street theatre and propaganda to carry on the spirit of the uprising of the people against the military in May '92. The military in Thailand have ruled for much of the 60yrs since the monarchy was overthrown in 1932. They own and control huge sectors of the economy including Thai Airways and the postal system. Most of the civilian govts have been puppets of the military - the people had the choice of voting for fat, corrupt civilian politicians or fat corrupt generals. When in March 92 General Suchinda Kraprayoon 'reluctantly' appointed himself prime mincer, having to step down as military supreme commander - the people had just about had enough.

In Bangkok the students led demonstrations to parliament house and out onto the streets demanding Suchinda's resignation, reform of the govt, and an end to corruption. More and more people came out onto the streets to support them and set up camp at the democracy monument - there were so many people it seemed they couldn't lose. This was the biggest anti-govt uprising since 76 which was followed by 10 yrs of military rule. The govt and military refused to negotiate, they brought in soldiers from the country so that they wouldn't be facing friends or family in the Bangkok streets. They moved in with tear gas and water cannons on the unarmed people with orders to disperse the crowd. The people left, but came back with greater anger, determination and numbers. They went down to the police station on Koh San road (were most travellers stay) and demanded the release of five local people taken hostage. The soldiers opened fire with machine guns killing anyone in sight, they chased people thru the buddhist monastery to the river where they kept on killing people trying to escape. Hundreds were shot. Later they went to the hospitals to stop anyone treating the protesters. Some govt buildings were burnt down and some people say the soldiers did it to make the crowd look 'out of control'.

THE traffic has finally beaten me. Much through I love Bangkok, and much through I adore Thailand, I have finally and sadly come to the conclusion that I cannot cope with the traffic in the streets of Bangkok any longer.

There is nothing very much to do in Songkhla

This last because they are, without exception, fake and there is no come-back, no possible recompense.

The local inhabitants will always smile back at you. After all, they do not have to face the traffic of Bangkok.

Please understand I do not mean that some of the loose gemstones sold on the street and in a few of the shops are fake. I mean all of them are fake and are worth, at the most, a dollar or two.

It's no wonder the govt calls for a policy of 'non-interference' and they seem to get it. Other SE Asian countries like Burma, Malaysia and Laos refused to comment. The Aust govt expressed 'deep regret' and called for the withdrawal of the Aust troops training with the Royal Thai Special Warfare Command. The US cancelled joint military projects, but failed to condemn the massacre. All this comes as no surprise when you see the vested interests rich countries have in Thailand's industrial stability as a source of cheap labour and land use.

When travelling outside Bangkok you pass the new 'Industrial Cities', ugly grey sprawling monstrosities which are self contained living and work places for millions of Thai people. These places are built by rich capos in countries like Japan, Amerika, Germany and Australia to exploit cheap labour. People there earn about A\$50 a week for 40-60 hrs work. Lots of them come from villages and are forced by shortages to live in these industrial nightmare prisons. There are no unions, award wages, or compensation. Unrest is simmering, with workers attacking security and police, burning their bikes, and threatening to sabotage the factories.

Whereas in Aust, now lots of ads are more subtle, in Thailand consumer advertising is really in ya face - blatant and ugly. Lots of people seem really sucked into the dream of ideal western consumer life. Young people in Bangkok are really into US culture, Levis, Rebox, junkfood and tv. A fat pink Colonel Sanders stands outside the KFC shops, a frightening image of the benevolent patriarchal pig.

Tourism is the biggest profit making sector in Thailand, so any harrasment and brutality is kept well hidden. But the anger and frustration is plain to see on the faces in the street. Sometimes things like human rights abuse in other countries seem a long way away and the images on tv of soldiers killing people somehow hard to comprehend and absorb for what it really is. For me it wasn't really till I talked with friends about the repression in Thailand that the reality started to sink in.
