THREATS to send toll and fine dodgers to jail appear to be hollow with just two offenders being sent to prison in the past five years.

The State Penalties Enforcement Registry (SPER) has the power to arrest and imprison people who refuse to pay their debts as a last resort.

But SPER has only exercised that right once in 2012 and again in 2014, according to data obtained by The Courier Mail from the State Treasury's office. Instead SPER is using other tactics to recoup more than \$1.172 billion in unpaid fines, including a wheel clamping initiative which started in June last year.

Clamped down

As of February 23, it had recouped more than \$1.16 million from people who hadn't paid their fines.

SPER recouped \$563,494 from 61 customers who had their "vehicles clamped" and 68 customers "who were subject to vehicle immobilisation operations."

A further \$493,246 was recovered from 39 seized vehicles and 19 vehicles sold at public auction.

A department spokesman said "we've acknowledged the problem with the ballooning debt following the LNP's decision to automatically transfer all tolling debts to SPER.

"We're stepping up to fix it which is why we commenced wheel clamping last year to target the worst offenders – people with outstanding fines in excess of \$5000."

Fine dodgers will also need to watch out for a new \$58.9 million IT system being rolled out later this year which will be "faster" and more "effective" at collections.

But those who genuinely can't afford to pay will be offered the chance to "work off" their debts under a new government scheme,





BACKGROUND – NOT FOR RELEASE: Contrary to Public Interest

INFORMATION ON ENFORCEMENT:

- The State Penalties Enforcement Registry (SPER) has powers under the State Penalties Enforcement Act 1999 (SPE Act) to arrest and imprison people who refuse to pay their debts. These powers have only been used in exceptional cases as a last resort where SPER considers that a person can but refuses to pay, and no other enforcement action has worked or will work.
- Under the Act, SPER can issue an arrest and imprisonment warrant. This can be used either to arrest and imprison an individual or to extend the sentence for someone already incarcerated who applies to voluntarily serve further time in custody to satisfy their debts. The last warrant for a person to serve further time in custody was issued in November 2014, while the last warrant to arrest and imprison was issued in October 2012.

RTI Document No.436

- Imprisonment as the punishment of last resort is a longstanding policy of the Queensland Government. Section 9(2)(a) of the Penalties and Sentences Act 1992 gives legislative force to this longstanding policy and binds the courts. The SPER charter, under section 9(d) of the SPE Act, similarly binds SPER to ensure that imprisonment is the punishment of last resort. SPER uses its enforcement powers to prioritise the collection of the debt owed, over imprisonment. Therefore, SPER must always attempt collection first, including through voluntary payments by the debtor and then through enforcement action.
- The SPER Registrar has substantial enforcement powers including the power to suspend the debtor's driver licence, immobilise their vehicle, seize and sell that vehicle or other property of the debtor, and collect the debt directly from their wages or bank accounts.
- SPER has invested in new programs targeted to recover debt, like the highly successful Vehicle Immobilisation, Seizure and Sale Program, which has recovered more than \$1 million since being introduced last year. SPER has also instigated successful outbound call campaigns to remind people of the consequences of not paying their fine on time and to encourage payment.
- These initiatives and others have seen SPER collect over \$150 million in the first six months of the 2016/17 financial year, off the back of last financial year's record collection of \$298 million.



In the past five years one person has been issued a warrant to arrest and imprisonment, while a warrant for a person to serve further time in custody was also issued.

If someone is told that the person ordered to pay restitution is said to be "in compliance" does that mean no other enforcement action is being taken by SPER, or could you be in compliance if some other action is being taken? **Answer**

The term 'in compliance' indicates that the debt is not currently subject to enforcement action.

Question

The table is said to show details of debts registered with SPER and debts finalised with SPER, for court-ordered restitution for 2014-15, 2015-16 and 2016-17. I'm confused about that. Does that mean all those figures are for finalised debts relating to restitution in those years, in other words, in 2017, more than \$9 million worth of restitution has been paid, as a result of 10,517 referrals to SPER this year, or there were 10,517 new referrals regarding restitution?

Answer

The total value of compensation and restitution order referrals relates to the amounts referred to SPER during the Financial Year.




