

A large percentage of our student population is classed as 'mature' (aged older than 21 in the first year of their course) and we pride ourselves on this diversity in our students.







Get set to join one of Australia's fastest growing sectors with a qualification in community services. Our courses range from community case work to community development, disability services, aged care, youth work, and alcohol and other drugs (AOD) support. Upon graduation you will be equipped to work in a variety of health related settings, including public and private hospitals; local councils; community health care; and home, community and residential care facilities.

If you're already in the industry, we can help you develop specialist knowledge to strengthen your capabilities and prepare for higher-level positions. Through our certificate in AOD, you will develop the skills required to provide a range of services and interventions to people with alcohol and other drug abuse problems.

With a qualification in disability services, you'll be equipped to provide support and training to people with disabilities, helping them to be more independent and self-reliant. If you want to start a career in ageing support, our certificate in individual support allows you to specialise and complete a practical work placement in aged care, home and community care or disability.



HOW MUCH WILL Your course cost?

The fees you pay as a TAFE student depend on a number of factors, including:

- whether the course is government funded
- your citizenship status
- when you commence the course
- your age
- your prior qualifications
- the units and course that you enrol in.

Some TAFE students may be eligible for a government subsidy (such as Skills First) to support tuition fees, depending on:

- citizenship status
- age at time of enrolment
- prior study completed.

STUDENT SERVICES AND AMENITIES FEE

TAFE students are also required to pay an annual Student Services and Amenities Fee.


In 2018 this amounts to \$205.80 for full-time government-funded students, \$102.90 for part-time government-funded students, \$44.10 for students studying off campus and \$88.20 for concession card holders. Students studying less than 25 hours are exempt from the fee.

VET STUDENT LOANS

VET Student Loans are available to assist eligible students studying higher-level vocational education and training (VET) qualifications to pay their tuition fees. Higher-level VET qualifications are at the diploma level and above. VET Student Loans can be used to pay all or part of an eligible student's tuition fees, but cannot be used for additional study costs such as accommodation or textbooks.





SUNSHINE





HOW TO APPLY



There are two ways to apply for a Victoria Polytechnic course: directly or via VTAC.

DIRECT APPLICANTS

You can you apply for the majority of our courses online, via the Victoria Polytechnic website. For most courses, you can apply at any time throughout the year. If you need any assistance give us a call or drop into any of our VUHQ centres that are located at all our campuses.

VTAC APPLICANTS

A range of our full time certificates, diplomas and advanced diplomas can be applied for through VTAC. If you are a year 12 student or a non-school leaver applying to multiple institutions please make sure you check what courses are available on VTAC before starting your application.

process for all Victoria Polytechnic courses you must complete a literacy, language and numeracy (LLN) assessment along with a pre-training review (PTR). APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINEESHIP APPLICANTS

The application process differs if you would like to complete an apprenticeship or traineeship through Victoria Polytechnic.

To apply for an apprenticeship or traineeship, follow these steps:

Find an employer in your chosen trade who will employ you as an apprentice or trainee. Employers often prefer to take on apprentices with pre-apprenticeship qualifications which you can undertake through Victoria Polytechnic.
Your employer will then need to contact an Australian Apprenticeship Centre and sign a training contract to register you as an apprentice.
Nominate Victoria Polytechnic as your

preferred registered training organisation (RTO).

Within six to eight weeks after successfully completing this process, your classroom training will commence.
