## INDUSTRY ACCREDITED

Several of our law and justice courses are recognised by industry, including our Bachelor of Laws/Bachelor of Business accredited by CPA Australia, Institute Of Chartered Accountants Australia, Chartered Institute of Logistics and Transport, and Australian Marketing Institute; and our Bachelor of Laws/ Bachelor of Psychological Studies and Bachelor of Laws (Honours)/ Bachelor of Psychology, accredited by Australian Psychology Accreditation Council. All of our law programs deliver the required academic areas of knowledge (as set out under Schedule 1, Legal Profession Uniform Admission Rules 2015) required for admission as an Australian lawyer.

## LAW PLACEMENTS

Everything you learn with us has direct links to the workplace and your future career success. If you study law and justice with us, the following workplace programs are available:

### MAGISTRATES' COURT PROGRAM

Second and third-year students can join rosters at Melbourne, Sunshine and Werribee Magistrates' Courts — an opportunity provided through our partnership with Victoria Legal Aid (VLA).

## INTERNATIONAL MOOTING SUCCESS

We equip you for graduate success through our world-class moot program. The moot courts at our City Queen Campus give you an opportunity to simulate proceedings, draft written appellate submissions and present legal arguments. Our students have many opportunities to participate in moot competitions both locally and internationally.

VU holds the Hon. Michael Kirby Contract Law Moot Competition — a four-day annual competition for teams across Australia. In 2015, the VU team was the only Victorian team to advance to the semi-finals of the competition.

Our 2014 moot team received the coveted Champion of the Moot Shanghai 2014, defeating 28 teams from other law schools in 11 countries including the US and countries across Europe and Asia. This achievement placed VU at the top of participating law schools, which included Loyola University Chicago, Singapore Management University, University of Helsinki and the University of Cologne.

The international success of our moot program is testament to VU's commitment to enhancing your legal skills, such as advocacy, so you are better equipped for work in the real world.

## WESTJUSTICE SUNSHINE YOUTH OFFICE

Staffed by VU's third and fourth-year law students, WEStjustice Sunshine Youth Office provides young people with free legal advice and referrals. You'll gain hands-on experience with real cases.

## FAMILY LAW INTERNSHIPS

Through our partnership with VLA and WEStjustice, you have the opportunity to participate in a six-month work placement with the VLA's Family Law Division or WEStjustice Werribee Office, helping families resolve disputes and achieve safe and enduring care arrangements for children.

## PROSECUTIONS DIVISION OF VICTORIA POLICE

This program comprises a series of two-week placements in a variety of police prosecution specialist areas including Melbourne Prosecutions Unit, Research and Training Unit, Civil Advocacy Unit, Commissions and Inquiry Division and Police Coronial Support Unit.

# LAW AND JUSTICE RESEARCH

Our teaching staff undertake research that informs our courses and is widely recognised for providing real benefits to industry and the community – locally, nationally and internationally.

We provide expert research supervision for masters and doctoral programs. The breadth and depth of our innovative research specialisations creates an attractive range of postgraduate research options. We also welcome enquiries from prospective research students interested in developing new projects.

We offer many scholarships to assist postgraduate research and international research students with the costs of their study.

## RESEARCH FOCUS

# FACILITIES

## MOOT COURTS AND LAW LIBRARY

Our moot court at City Queen Campus presents an opportunity to participate in simulated proceedings, draft appellate submissions and present legal arguments. Mooting skills give you a significant professional advantage by equipping you for practical success in the real world court system.

The City Queen Law Library offers an extensive range of law books, journals and compendiums. The law librarians provide expert services to support staff and students in their learning and research endeavours. The Law library's online and physical collection is vast and current. You will also have access to a number of professional law libraries in Melbourne's legal precinct.

# HOW MUCH WILL MY COURSE COST?

## COURSE FEES AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Course costs vary between VE/TAFE and higher education courses, depending on whether you are a government-funded student or full-fee paying student, and the units you select.

Below you will find some important information and a general guide to costs.\* The latest information and a specific guide to study costs, including VU's Unit Fee Schedule, is available at:

### VE/TAFE FEES

The fees you pay as a VE/TAFE student depend on a number of factors, including:

- whether the course is government-funded
- your citizenship status
- when you commence the course
- your age
- your prior qualifications
- the units and course that you enrol in.

Some VE/TAFE students may be eligible for a government subsidy (such as the Victorian Training Guarantee) to support tuition fees, depending on:

- citizenship status
- age at time of enrolment
- prior study completed.

VE/TAFE students are also required to pay an annual Student Services and Amenities Fee. In 2016 this amounted to \$204 for full-time government funded students, \$102 for part-time government-funded students, \$42 for students studying off campus and \$84 for concession card holders. Students studying less than 25 hours are exempt from the fee.

VET FEE-HELP is available to assist eligible students studying higher level vocational education and training (VET) qualifications to pay their tuition fees. Higher-level VET qualifications are at the diploma level and above. VET FEE-HELP can be used to pay all or part of an eligible student's tuition fees, but cannot be used for additional study costs such as accommodation or text books.

### HIGHER EDUCATION FEES

The options available to students enrolled in higher education courses are:

- Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP) — course fees are shared between students and the Australian Government, which subsidises your course fees.
- Full-Fee Place (FFP) — you must pay the full cost of your course.

All domestic undergraduate students at Victoria University are enrolled in a Commonwealth Supported Place (CSP).

This table (below) shows the maximum student contribution and full-fee amount for 2016 admissions, per year of full-time study.

Higher education students are also required to pay an annual Student Services and Amenities Fee. In 2016 this amounted to \$290 for full-time students and \$145 for part-time students.

### POSTGRADUATE COURSEWORK DEGREE FEES

The University does not receive any government funding for postgraduate coursework student places, and students pay the full cost of their course. This is called a fee-paying place. Tuition fees are based on the units studied, rather than a fixed price for each course. Different units have different costs.

### POSTGRADUATE RESEARCH DEGREE FEES

If you qualify for an Australian government-funded place under the Research Training Scheme you will not be required to pay course fees.

If you are offered a full-fee paying place you can apply for FEE-HELP government assistance as outlined below.

### PAYING YOUR FEES

There are several options available to help you with the costs involved in studying at university.

### HECS-HELP

The Australian Government's Higher Education Loan Program, HECS-HELP, allows Australian citizens and Humanitarian Visa holders to borrow the amount of their student contribution and pay it back once in the workforce and earning a specified amount. You also have the option of paying some or all of your student contribution up-front and receiving a discount.

### FEE-HELP

FEE-HELP is a government loan program that enables eligible students to defer the payment of their tuition fees.

### FINANCIAL ADVICE

# HOW TO APPLY

There are several ways to apply for courses at VU, based on:

- your chosen course study level
- your residency status
- the time of year
- whether you are a current or recent student of VU (within the last six months).

## UNDERGRADUATE AND TAFE

Applications for undergraduate and vocational education (VE/TAFE) courses are either made through the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC), or by direct application to the University.
