# Arash Abadpour

### Biography

Arash Abadpour left Iran in September 2005 to continue his studies in Canada. He has a Ph.D. in Electrical and Computer Engineering and works as a professional researcher in the field of Image Processing and Machine Vision.

# Blogging

Arash started blogging in October 2004 in English under the pen name Kamangir (Archer). He started a Persian blog with the same name in May 2007. He now blogs at http://kamangir.net. English Kamangir was deactivated in 2012.

Based on different independent statistics, collected in 2012, Persian Kamangir is among the twenty most-read Persian blogs on the net. Posts from Persian Kamangir are widely shared on different social networks and are referenced by other Persian bloggers as well as Persian media sources. Several Persian-language news and media websites have reproduced or actively reproduce content from Persian Kamangir in their websites.

#### Media

Arash acts as a commentator for the media, both in English and in Persian, on the Persian blogosphere and its correspondence with the sociopolitical situation in Iran. He has been interviewed by Persian BBC, Persian DW-World, Aljazeera, Radio Farda, Voice of America, Washington Post, ZDF, and Radio France Internationale, among others.

# Writing

Arash writes, both in Persian and in English, about the Persian blogosphere. His writings have appeared in Persian BBC, DW-World, Article 19, and Pajamas Media, among others.

#### Panels and Presentations

Arash has been on panels and have presented on the use of the Internet in Iran on different occasions in conferences held in Canada, USA, Germany, and Denmark, among others.

# Community Building

Arash maintains active contact with the body of the Persian blogosphere located in Iran. He maintains active accounts on Facebook, Google+, Twitter, and other social networks, where he is among the most subscribed-to users. He has facilitated contact with Iranian bloggers as requested by the media and researchers in the field. He also facilitates publication of content produced inside Iran in media sources located outside the country. Arash provides technical and logistical support for Persian bloggers based in Iran and has been actively involved in several social campaigns.

Arash was the Persian-speaking jury member for the DW-World Best of Blogs international blogs awards in 2011, 2012, and 2013.

# Human Rights Activism

Arash actively supports the non-violent pro-human rights movement on the web through writing blog posts, signing open letters, and encouraging activism through different social networks.

### **Training**

Arash has provided training sessions and materials on the topics of data journalism, data visualization, effective content marketing on the web, use of social networks for social/political campaigning, and online security, in programs offered by Iran Media Program and Mianeh School of Journalism, among others.

#### Translation Services

Arash has worked with several different organizations on projects related to the translation of content from Persian to English and in reverse. Arash specializes in translation of Persian blog content into English as well as translation of surveys and questionnaires and technical documents from English to Persian. Arash has been involved in the translation of tutorials, documentations, and user interfaces for different filtering circumvention/assessment tools from English to Persian.
