MVP House Recommendations 2018

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Movement Voter Project is currently recommending support for 78 organizations in 64 House Districts. We will update our recommendations weekly based on shifts in the political landscape, organizational priorities and budget gaps.

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2018 House Strategy - Overview

We are concerned that Democrats are overconfident about their chances for winning back the House of Representatives (we are also concerned that progressive donors are ignoring the Senate, Governors, and key 2020 Presidential swing states - but that's a story for another day). Back to the House: Democrats need to net 23 seats to regain control. Due to extreme partisan gerrymandering in 2011, and lower comparative Democratic base turnout in midterm cycles in general, Democrats will face a steep climb - even in a potential wave election year. There are 23 House seats won by Clinton but carried by a Republican - which sounds like good news. 23 is the magic number. But only three of those incumbents won by less than 5% in 2016. Another four won by less than 10%. A full sixteen of these 23 GOP incumbents won by double digits. Defeating them in 2018 is by no means a slam dunk.

Methodology, assumptions and scenarios: To create the House categorizations below, we began with a wide field of 113 districts including any DCCC or Swing Left target; and any race rated Likely, Lean, or Toss-up by the Cook Political Report and/or Larry Sabato's Crystal Ball. Our strategy factors in a degree of humility in determining which seats will ultimately be most winnable. Polls are often fallible - especially on down ballot races. There are myriad X factors that go into final results, and elections often have surprising twists and turns right up until the very end.

Toss-up races are obviously our top priority. But they aren't our only top priority. Protecting vulnerable Democratic seats is also a top priority - not to be taken for granted (it's usually easier to protect a Dem seat than to pick up a new one). And we can't depend solely on the Toss-up races to get us to 23. Inevitably, we're going to lose some of them. Let's assume a mid-sized wave scenario in which we win the following...

- 4 of the 5 Defend Dem seats
- 6 of the 8 Likely Dems seats
- **13** of the 28 Toss-ups.

This scenario would leave us six seats short of a majority. Thus we would still need to win six from the list of "stretch" races. "But why spend precious resources on stretch races?" you ask. "Wouldn't it make more sense to double down on the Toss-ups which are more likely to be winnable if properly resourced?" Yes and no. All things being equal, it generally does make sense to prioritize resources to Toss-ups over Stretch races. However, there are three caveats to take into consideration. One, categorization is a blunt instrument and ratings are fluid. For example, in the past week, Cook Report moved VA-7 from Lean R to Toss-up. And it moved PA-1 from Toss-Up to Lean R. As the cycle goes on, several of the races in each category could easily evolve or switch places. Official ratings changes often happen pretty slowly - there's a lag. By the time a ratings organization switches a race to Toss-Up, it might be too late to invest effectively in the district. So the first reason to invest in Stretch races is as an insurance

policy. The second reason is that we might have a huge wave, and then we'll be sorry we didn't try to pick-up 20 more seats. The third reason is that there are decreasing marginal returns in investing in race (and in a set of local groups working on that race) when a lot of money is already going there. By spreading our support more thinly, we increase the chance that our investments will produce the largest marginal gains and will have the biggest bang for their buck.

Below is a slate of groups recommended by Movement Voter Project for support in 66 of the most competitive districts. Every district and situation is different. Some districts have multiple strong vetted organizations. Some have emerging groups that are striving to develop new capacity. Roughly speaking, we believe that the constellation of local groups we are profiling in each district need an average of an additional \$100,000 - \$300,000 per district in order to run a strong independent field program that will significantly increase base turnout (of young people and communities of color) in each districts - in the range of making a 1-3 point difference. Most of the groups we are profiling are under-the-radar for national progressive donors and in many cases are not receiving any significant special funding for their work around these House races. The overall cost to adequately fund all of these groups is in the ballpark of \$15 - \$20 million.

To keep things in perspective, on average, a congressional candidate needs to raise \$2 million for a competitive general election. Candidates in expensive media markets such as Chicago, Los Angeles, New York, or Philadelphia need to raise substantially more. In 2014, Democrats spent close to half a billion dollars directly on congressional candidates and triple that on outside efforts. The 2018 election cycle is expected to break fundraising records - and outside spending could easily triple or quadruple that in some cases. So while \$20 million is a lot of money to ensure a robust local independent progressive field effort, it would represent less than 1% of total Congressional spending on the Democratic side.

This document is very much a work in progress which we expect to update in quasi real time (at least every two weeks) as polling and analysis evolves and as we continue to vet and add recommended groups in each district. We welcome your feedback, updates and contributions.





Background on Movement Voter Project and the Wave 2018 project

By popular demand from our clients, MVP is launching a new program to support the best local grassroots voter organizing in key US House districts - aiming to move funds grants in 60 of the most competitive House districts in up to 30 states. We have engaged consultants (Alexandra Acker-Lyons and Jamaa Bickley King) to help us analyze and track the top 100 most competitive House races in real time. We have matched most districts with MVP partner groups, and are preparing to make an initial round of at least \$300,000 in grants.

Supporting MVP groups working in House districts presents three challenges: One, many of them are in non-presidential swing states like CA, NJ, TX, UT, WA, etc. that haven't been the focus of MVP's previous research. Two, most of the districts are in outlying areas (suburbs, exurbs, and rural areas) where our MVP partners often have less presence). Three, they tend to be whiter areas with fewer communities of color and college towns where MVP organizations easily find fertile ground for organizing.

MVP is rising to the challenge in three ways: One, we are researching and finding local groups to recommend in these areas and in some cases, supporting nearby MVP groups to expand into these districts. Two, we are in conversation with constellations of MVP groups in key states who are making a collaborative push to build capacity in these districts. Three, we will be targeting many of these districts for VOTE MOB, deeper talent scouting, and mini-grants to smaller and more organic local efforts to register voters and run GOTV, in addition to our anchor MVP partners.

From our brief experiences this Spring in the special elections in PA-18, and AZ-8 (both of which are centered in heavily white exurban areas) and previous cycles, we have a decent sense of how to add value in these districts. We are circulating this list among progressive donors, in partnership with allies, as a resource on groups to fund in these districts. This is a major new addition to MVP's body of research. We are building our capacity to do a deeper level of talent scouting, mini-granting, VOTE MOB-ing, and mobilizing support from nearby volunteers and others to support the local work. This is a major new effort for MVP.

Movement Voter Project (MVP) works to create sustainable progressive power at all levels of government by funding local groups that get out unlikely voters in key states and districts – especially groups that organize young people and communities of color. To date, we have helped nearly 2000 donors to connect with and move more than \$6 Million to more than 170 local groups in 35 states.
