PROPOSED TERMS FOR BILL TO REPEAL THE MARRIED WOMEN TEACHERS AND LECTURERS DISMISSAL ACT.

Dear Madam:

We intend to approach Parliament after the elections to repeal the Married Women Teachers and Lecturers Dismissal Act. The following are the proposed terms.

- 1) All teachers who left the service on account of the Act, to be eligible for re-instatement.
- 2) All teachers re-instated to rank as if they had never left the service, in order to become eligible for superannuation.
- 3) That re-instated teachers re-fund the total super-annuation money paid to them when they left the service, or take out appropriate number of units for their age.
- 4) Any teacher who left the service on account of the Act, who was paid for long service leave, shall be considered as having taken all leave due to her to the date of her dismissal. All further leave due to her to date from the date of her dismissal.
- 5) That re-instated teachers be entitled to retain that amount of compensation paid them that would be equivalent to half the salary they were earning when they left the service for the period covering the date of leaving the service to the date of re-instatement, provided that no additional payments be required to be made to any re-instated teacher.

Please give this matter your consideration and let us have your opinion on these suggestions in writing before the next meeting of the Married Women Teachers' Committee.
