WORKERS' ART CLUB.

A new organisation entitled "The Workers' Art Club," with headquarters at 273 Pitt-street has been formed. "with the object of bringing within the reach of the working classes various advantages in the way of lectures, musical recitals, art classes, and exhibitions of pictures." The president of the movement is Mr George Piney; and the committee includes a number of artists. The organisers have laid down for themselves a wide and ambitious programme. They have begun by providing a cheerfully furnished clubroom and a small library, where members may meet and hold discussions on various questions related to arts and crafts. Workers' clubs of a similar character in other countries have been taken as a model. It is intended eventually to add to the cultural activities already indicated a summer camp where members may enjoy discussions in holiday surroundings. So far, activities have not progressed past occasional lectures; though classes in French and German are in process of formation.
