ALL OUT FOR JUNE 30TH!

On June 30 nearly a million workers could be on strike together.

Workers are striking to stop changes to their pension schemes. Bosses and the government want workers to pay more and receive less. Some workers could lose tens of thousands of pounds that they have already paid in.

This is about more than just pensions though. This is the beginning of a concerted effort to co-ordinate industrial actions against government austerity measures.

The NUT & PCS have begun to ballot members for national strike action and this will close on Tuesday 14 June 2011. If the ballots are successful co-ordinated strike action will be called along with UCU and ATL members on Thursday 30th June.

In a separate development, members at both the CWU and NUJ annual delegate meetings voted overwhelmingly that the TUC should coordinate a 24-hour public sector general strike.

We encourage all public service union members to come out on strike on June 30th. We also encourage all others: unionised or not unionised, employed or unemployed, student or claimant to come out on strike in solidarity to show unity against the governments attacks on the public sector and its programme of austerity measures.

Bristol & District Anti Cuts Alliance is working together with the unions and Bristol Trades Union Council to make the day of action on June 30th a success. A demonstration is planned in



the city centre on the day along with other events highlighting the extent of the cuts and the fightback against them.

EVERY RIOT HELPS...

Anarchists profit from petrol bombs as hundreds descend on Stokes Croft for annual bookfair.

Saturday May 7th saw the fourth annual Bristol Anarchist Bookfair take place in Hamilton House, Stokes Croft. With over 60 tables packed with books, pamphlets and merchandise, five rooms of workshops, discussions, films and talks, a cafe and a creche, the bookfair did a fantastic job of showing Bristol that Anarchism is not all face masks and smashed windows. And with what must have been over 1000 people through the doors, clearly more and more people are taking an interest in radical ideas.

Of course the high foot fall must in part be to do with everyone's favourite vandal Banksy selling posters of a Tesco Value petrol bomb to commemorate the recent riots. Hundreds queued to get hold of one, proceeds of which went to local community groups. Others were not so keen however, city council leader Barbara Janke said: "What a sad, sordid way to thank Bristol for providing this talented, privileged but misguided young man with a springboard for his career as a graffiti artist."

Copies of the poster were given out

to stall holders and many were quickly sold on to dimwitted Banksyphiles. These posters were selling for anything from £5 to a whopping £190 with much of the proceeds going to support those arrested during the riots. Other groups have used some of the proceeds to fund further campaigns and actions. This very news sheet was paid for buy one such poster!

Of the riots, Stephen Williams, Lib Dem MP for Bristol West said: "These protests have been hijacked by extreme leftwing groups." Kerry McCarthy, Labour MP for Bristol West went to the Commons to ask Policing Minister Nick Herbert for financial help to replace the money spent. We can only assume they are fuming at the thought these "extreme left wing groups" are cashing in on the riots.

Speculation is already rife about how much a Banksy of Buckingham Palace on fire will sell for.

OFFICE DEVILS

Temping agency Office Angels coughs up unpaid wages after campaign threatens to go international.

On Thursday 12th May Office Angels' offices in Bristol were picketed as part of a national week of action organised by the Solidarity Federation. The campaign started after SolFed were contacted by an Office Angels employee Dan. He had worked three days for Office Angels in December but had only been paid for one. Despite substantial evidence to the contrary – Dan had sat next to the company manager at work on his third day – Office Angels refused to acknowledge he had worked beyond his first day. *continues page 2*

continued from page 1 The campaign started with a picket and delegation at the Wimbledon office where Dan had been employed. Office Angels responded by banning him from company premises. The delegation then went to the Oxford Street office, where management was spoken to and a demand for the wages to be paid in full laid down.

Picketing up and down the country, e-mails and phone calls continued to add more pressure. Finally, with the threat of the struggle becoming international as groups around the world prepared for a week of action against the parent company ADECCO, Office Angels paid up.

We are all facing increased casualisation and attacks on pay and conditions at work. It's important to remember when we act in solidarity with one another we can successfully fight back against our bosses. This campaign succeeded without courts, lawyers, industrial tribunals or even union reps. Direct action got the goods.

THE WHOLE ROTTEN BARREL

A life lived entirely inside a factory complex; every movement tracked by 24 hour electronic security; your living, eating and sleeping arrangements decided by your boss; your clothes colour coded by your department; and high suicides rates.

This may sound like a work of science fiction or a tale from the USSR but this is the grim reality for workers at the chinese factory of Foxconn: a multinational electronics company who produce all the worlds Apple iPads, iPods and the iPhone 4.

No that wasn't a misprint; Apple, the poster child of capitalism providing us with the shiny new things we 'need' and the trendy alternative to the evil Microsoft (who incidentally also work with Foxconn). At first glance it can be hard to reconcile these two images of the same company, but this is how capitalism functions. It's not surprising Apple gets away with treating people this way; in fact it's demanded by the capitalist system – lower costs with no regard to human life, whilst putting on a nice happy face to the customers.

Workers in the UK may be far better off than those in Chinese factories, but capitalist companies will always try screwing over the working class as much as they can. The latest 'economic crisis' has given them all the excuse they need to lower our wages, working conditions and safety. These things we often take for granted were won through hard fights, like those that are now being fought by a new generation of Chinese workers.

Whilst we must build international links and stand in solidarity with all those struggling against

DISABILITY IS NOT A CRIME

On Thursday 12th May from 3.30pm - 5.30pm the Social Care, Claimants and Welfare group (of Bristol and District Anti Cuts Alliance) organised their second picket of the ATOS testing centre, Government Buildings, Flowers Hill.

Atos Healthcare has secured a £300 million contract through the Department for Work and Pensions to conduct disability assessments for people claiming disability benefits.

As a result many claimants now face being moved onto the lower Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA), and losing a range of support. For some this will mean a drop of over £1,600 a year and all the insecurity that being on JSA bring.

The idea that claimants are work-shy scroungers is a vile and nasty myth. A myth being used to excuse treating some of the most vulnerable people in our society in a degrading and utterly disrespectful manner.

Atos is being given three hundred million pounds to test disabled peoples ability to work. Allegedly they will also receive a bonus of £14,000 for every person they send back to work. This will undoubtedly result in legitimate disabled people being taken off benefit just so Atos can profit.

If any evidence was needed of this, 40% of all appeals against Atos are upheld. That means at least 40% of the people they take of benefits should not have been. One of these cases even involved test results being forged to make someone fail.

In the case of George from Chesterfield, he died whilst appealing Atos' decision to declare him fit to work. Killed by a heart condition Atos had deemed not to be "uncontrollable or life-threatening". His widow is convinced the stress caused by this process contributed to his death.
