In this class, we will explore the often-remarked on connections and resonances between the works of Schopenhauer, Nietzsche, and Freud--all of whom have been, at one point or the other, anointed founders of 'depth psychology' for their explorations of 'the unconscious.' We will read original works and selections from the philosophical and psychological literature that explores these connections.

Course requirements:

A 3000-word term paper on a topic of your choosing (but approved by me); due on the last day of class. (Incompletes are bad for your soul.)
