PETITION OF THOMAS SIMS.
Mr. Keyes presented the following petition, purporting to be from Thomas Sims, an escaped fugitive slave, which he read to the Senate—

To the Honorable the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, in General Court assembled, respectfully petitioneth the said Thomas Sims, a free man of color, and an inhabitant of Massachusetts, and a member, but he is a fugitive slave, and is now in custody of the State.

That he is informed that he has, and without proper evidence, without a jury, and without proper evidence, to collect evidence, or means of proving his freedom.

That he claims as his birthright and inheritance a full and free man, who shall be allowed to labor or service to another. That he is held, and imprisoned, and sold, and the proceeds by which he is sold to him by which can test the constitutionality or the propriety of the process by which the illegality of the law is being upheld in the State.
