Learning about creative thinking

I t is the challenge of our age to build resilience in the face of constant change. More than ever, the development of transferable knowledge and skills such as creative thinking is critical to negotiating this state of flux, with increasing demand for an interdisciplinary approach to creative thinking learning. Students are responding and seeking out these learning opportunities as we see enrolments in The Creative Process, a General Education course offered at the University of Auckland, more than double in the last year. Developed in association with the Creative Thinking Project, the course examines creativity through a variety of disciplines, such as the arts, biology, psychology, sociology, philosophy and education.

Creative thinking draws on capabilities that have always been core to making and performing disciplines such as architecture, art, creative writing, dance, design and music, but is not contained solely in those fields. It is also relevant across a range of future-focused disciplines.

across a range of future-focused disciplines.

Creative thinking capacities are human capacities: collaboration, communication, criticality and creativity which are increasingly recognised to be of critical importance across society as all communities experience

radical change. What differentiates New Zealand's current

experience from prior ones is not just the scale or the breadth of that change but its pace.

A key area of most rapid change is digitisation, which has completely upended the way we communicate and work. This leads to a fundamental change in employment and employment expectations across all sectors.

As we face this unpredictable future, we need to increase our capacity and flexibility to draw on those things that make us human; the intellectual, emotional and social characteristics that make each of us unique and each of us part of broader communities of interest. These are urgent issues to address, from intimacy of individual identity to the wellbeing of the planet we cling to.

It is at this moment then that the inherent capacity of creative thinking to link disparate areas of inquiry and imagination is its greatest strength and our greatest asset. creativethinkingproject.org.nz




Graduate members of RAD Collective
