Dr. Samir Meghelli serves as Chief Curator at the Smithsonian Anacostia Community Museum (ACM). He is a historian, writer, educator, and has more than a decade of experience documenting, preserving, and curating community histories. Prior to joining ACM, he was a professor at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.

Dr. Meghelli is co-author of *The Global Cipha: Hip Hop Culture and Consciousness* (2006), co-editor of *New Perspectives on the History of Marcus Garvey, the U.N.I.A., and the African Diaspora* (2011), and author of book chapters in *The Global Sixties in Sound & Vision: Media, Counterculture, Revolt* (2014) and *Translating Hip-Hop* (2012). His writings have also appeared in The New York Times, Black Arts Quarterly, and The Western Journal of Black Studies, among other places.

He received his B.A. (magna cum laude) from the University of Pennsylvania and his M.A., M.Phil., and Ph.D. in History from Columbia University.
