Pursuant to our mutual understanding, this letter serves as confirmation by the Royal Embassy of Saudi Arabia of the extension of the Agreement between Hogan Lovells US LLP (formerly Hogan & Hartson LLP) and the Royal Embassy of Saudi Arabia.
