PROVIDENCE IN MYANMAR

A delegation representing Providence travelled to Southeast Asia in November, where they visited with Providence Alumni and presented an honorary doctorate to 1999 alumnus Rev. Dr. Samson Hkalam. Samson is presently serving as President of the Kachin Baptist Convention (KBC). Travelling in Myanmar and Hong Kong were Dr. David Johnson (Providence President) and his wife Barb, Dr. Stan Hamm (Dean of Providence Theological Seminary) and his wife Bev, Gary Schellenberg (Director of Institutional Services), and Jerrad Peters (Creative Content Specialist).

While in Myitkyina, the capital of Myanmar's Kachin State, the delegation visited refugee camps and taught in Bible schools and at a pastors' conference. They also visited alumni in Yangon and Hong Kong.



NEW PROV.CA WEBSITE

On February 20 Providence launched a new website. PROV.ca is communicating the Providence experience to current and prospective students, parents, alumni and supporters, telling the Providence story in modern, mobile-friendly and easily navigable format. This modern, mobile-friendly website showcases the academic programs and elements of spiritual formation and community life that combine to make up the Christ-centred experience on the Otterburne MB campus.

All three Providence schools—the University College, Seminary and Mile Two Discipleship School—are unified at the new PROV.ca, Providence Athletics has its own, new-look website at PROV.ca/Athletics.

GRADUATION 2018

In April Providence University College and Theological Seminary conferred Doctoral, Master's and Bachelor's Degrees, Graduate and Undergraduate Certificates and Diplomas upon 175 students. Forty-three students graduated from Providence Seminary (fortyone MA and two DMin). Fifty-five students graduated from Providence University College (three MA and forty-six BA – one with a double major, six BBA and one BTh). Notably, 43 students from all over the world received TESOL certificates. Former Board member Peter J. Falk, Q.C., was recognized with the institution's Distinguished Christian Leadership Award. An honorary Doctor of Divinity was granted to Samson Hkalam in absentia. A video of the ceremony was shown at the graduation ceremonies. 'Alumni of the Year' awards were given to David Siemens (Seminary grad of 1994) and Kim Coursey (UC grad of 1995).

PROVIDENCE GUEST LECTURES Theme: The Reformation – Then, and Now

Providence marked a milestone anniversary of the Reformation with public lectures by noted Christian scholar, historian and author Dr. John G. Stackhouse, Jr. Themed "Reformation: Then – And Now?", the presentation drew an audience of more than 250 people on October 31–500 years after Martin Luther nailed his Ninety-Five Theses to the door of the Schlosskirche in Wittenburg, Germany.

A five-part public lecture series consisting of five separate topics addressed by five different Providence Seminary and UC faculty members took place during February and March. The series ran concurrently in Winnipeg, Steinbach, and on the Providence campus.







