ANYONE FOR A PEACEFUL RIOT?

Tomorrow (Tuesday) at 10.00 a.m., 15 people will appear in the Prahran Court, Chapel Street, under committal proceedings for rioting arising out of the July 4th demo. These 15 were chosen from the 55 odd people arrested on that night. They represent Monash, La Trobe and Melbourne students, unionists and "outsiders".

Although the government is trying to make out that these are ordinary prosecutions for "hooligan" behavior it is obvious that these are political charges. You don't find the Prime Minister and the federal Attorney-General holding hurried conferences over telephone box vandalism - although it costs the Federal government as much every day as the July 4th riot did in a year. When anti-communists demonstrators broke windows in the Russian Embassy burn a Russian flag and set fire to the Embassy's hedge this year only one was charged (and fined four dollars).

It is the mistaken belief of men like Gorton and Boite that if a few dissenters are severely and savagely victimised then no-one will be prepared in future to stand up to the government (rather like "run the bastards over").

For this reason it is of vital importance that as many people as possible are there at Prahran Court on Tuesday to demonstrate to the government that we are not prepared to submit to police state activities.

UNDUE EMPHASIS

Brisbane's radical student organisation, Students for Democratic Action has received the following letter from the Customs Department.

As stated in my formal Notice of Seizure, the publication, 'American Crimes in Vietnam' was seized under Regulation 4(A) of the Customs (Prohibited Imports) Regulations on the grounds of undue emphasis on horror and violence.
