The Reports of the Board of Education, for the last six years, have shown that the number of women are far better fitted for the office of instruction than men, and whenever any good improvement has taken place in the district, it has been the result of the influence of efficient female teachers. Those sent out to the West, although not always so highly qualified as we could have wished, have proved, on every occasion, to be more successful and exercised an influence over boys and young men of rough and lawless habits had credit. The fate of our republic rests upon the success of the cause of female education. In the year 1841, we came into personal contact with four hundred cases of pauperism in the city of Boston. We do not hesitate to say, that one half might have been entirely prevented, by a better selection of the women forming heads of families. At least forty of these families might have been placed upon a more comfortable footing, had we only had more women.
