Aviation Emissions – Too Hot to Handle?

For the past year, the issue of emissions from aviation has been one of the hottest topics in the industry. In November 2012 the EU agreed to suspend application of its Emissions Trading Scheme to aviation for one year, awaiting an ICAO global solution. The ICAO General Assembly is meeting during this conference, and there are significant concerns whether a near-term solution will emerge. This panel will discuss the current emissions impasse, including the legal issues underlying it, and will offer ideas on what the future will bring, including a possible reinstatement of the EU ETS and its effect on domestic and international aviation law.
