

**“But if you nevertheless want to know what I feel when I release a bomb, I will tell you: I feel a light bump to the plane as a result of the bomb’s release. A second later it’s gone, and that’s all. That is what I feel.”**

General Dan Halutz ordered the indiscriminate bombing of Lebanon last summer, killing over 1,000 civilians. His jets bombed houses and hospitals, ambulances and airports, refineries and roads. The atrocities his forces committed were condemned worldwide as war crimes.

Halutz resigned as head of the Israeli military in January.

Now he’s hiding out and padding his resume in an executive education program at Harvard Business School.
