TO THE WOMEN OF MASSACHUSETTS.
SISTERS AND FRIENDS:

As immortal souls, created by God to know and

Slavery, beneath which 2,000,000 of our Fellow-
immortals, of the same country, are crucified,
and sold and bought in the extreme of degrada-
