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ROSSI'S LETTER TO LORD PALMERSTON.

My country has been despoiled from her king, the historical rights of her territory, her laws, her constitution, and her very independence.

Russia only has gained at this sanguinary game, has extended and increased her influence in the east of Europe, and threatens already, in a few months, with conquering the Turkish Empire.

My only prayer, my only wish, to commend to your Excellency the fate of my country, which the Turkish Government, at the suggestion of Russia, is about to impose upon its poor inhabitants.

The Government of Hungary, after having suffered, as a good citizen, to see the loss of my country, had no choice left me between the repose of the grave and the noise of the battle of Europe.
