FAREWELL ADDRESS TO GEORGE THOMPSON, BY M. P.

PROFESSOR OF THE LAW, NEW YORK.

DELIVERED AT THE ANNUAL MEETING OF THE AMERICAN ANTI-SLAVERY SOCIETY, HELD AT NEW YORK, ON THE 15TH OF DECEMBER, 1851.

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My friend, there were two courses plausibly set before George Thompson when he landed on the shores of this Republic, in the autumn of 1840. He was a free man. He was not constrained to adopt any given course. There are men, many of them, who are bound, by virtue of their very organization, to a limited and contracted sphere of action. In them the ability which is present, but the ability to do absent. George Thompson belongs not to this class. Long before he came to this country, his philosophy, his intellect, his industry, and spiritual genius, had been the whole civilized world a light of surprising brightness—a gem greatly to be coveted—a prize worth a little of the sufferings of the world.

He had heard a great deal of sympathy expressed for the family of my honorable friend, betrayed by his dishonest, far that sabbath consisting of the Tower, Haines, sitting in sackcloth and ashes, and refusing to be comforted because their representative is not there—(great laughter and applause)—for the slave who is in his hands in vain for their tried friend.
