HALDIMAND COUNTY REQUESTS FEDERAL AND PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENTS TO STOP FURTHER NEGOTIATIONS WITH SIX NATIONS

The Council of Haldimand County, at its Council in Committee meeting of June 12, 2006 proposed a resolution which requests the Federal and Provincial Governments to cease further negotiations with Six Nations until such time as all barricades are removed and the rail line opened, and all Native occupiers are removed a safe distance (to be determined by the County) on the Douglas Creek Estates property, from the perimeter of properties along Thistlemoor Drive, Sixth Line and Notre Dame School.

Council has indicated that it is strongly opposed to the escalating lawlessness that has been allowed to fester to the point of holding Caledonia in a grip of fear, despair and frustration through no fault of the community.
