

March 29, 2011 - t.A.T.u. release their double album Waste Management Remixes (WMR). In the foreseeable future, this will likely be the group's last record as Lena Katina and Yulia Volkova part ways to work on their solo projects. The album of remixes is a logical conclusion to the journey set off by the release of the duo's most debatable album, Waste Management.

While the number of unofficial t.A.T.u. remixes is unknown, t.A.T.u.'s first official album of remixes was released 8 years ago. It featured remixed tracks of the group's debut album, **200 km/h in the Wrong Lane**. The tremendous success of **t.A.T.u. Remixes** led to the release of the album's deluxe edition.

WMR is the result of an online remix contest launched by **t.A.T.u.** and **kroogi.com**, a global online community of artists. The work on the album lasted approximately a year. The 14 final tracks were chosen among hundreds of remixes, which, for the most part, were created by little-known DJs and musicians.

"I'm very glad that the participants were able to take our songs and find ways to make them their own," says **Lena Katina**. "If our music will help promote these talented musicians, we can say that we are truly satisfied with the results." In addition to the chosen 14 remixes, WMR will feature two bonus tracks. One of the tracks was recorded by Chattanooga Ska Orchestra. The Moscow band presented its own original take on t.A.T.u.'s music in an upbeat ska-jazz potpourri. The other bonus track is a collaboration between two acclaimed dub music producers, Alex Theory (California) and Gaudi (Italy).

WMR will be available on **kroogi.com**, as well as in all major online stores (iTunes, Amazon and etc.). The album consists of two parts: the first part is a meditative mix of lounge, ska and dub music, while the second part is a lively combination of techno, trance, glitch and electronic music.
