18 The Court, having considered these submissions and hearing oral argument of the
19 parties, now ORDERS, ADJUDGES, AND DECREES that:

20 Plaintiffs' Motion for Summary Judgment is **GRANTED**. Plaintiffs present a
21 justiciable controversy and have standing to bring this action. RCW 43.135.034(1)'s
22 supermajority vote requirement violates the simple majority provision of Article II, § 22
23 of the Washington Constitution, rendering that provision of the statute unconstitutional.
24 Further, RCW 43.135.034(2)(a)'s mandatory referendum requirement violates Article II, §
25 1 and Article II, § 1(b) of the Washington Constitution, rendering that provision of the
statute unconstitutional.
