At Crypto.com Arena, the Lakers are 26-18 against the Trail Blazers all-time in the regular season ... L.A. defeated Portland in the 2018-19 season (11/3/18) to end a 16-game losing streak to the Trail Blazers ... Since 1989, the Lakers have won just six season series against the Trail Blazers, (2019-20, 2012-13, 2011-12, 2010-11, 2004-05 and 1992-93) ... In recent series history, during the 2011-12 season (2/20/12), the Lakers held the Trail Blazers to seven first-quarter points, Portland's lowest first-quarter point total in their then-3,363-game history in the NBA ... That mark also matched the second-lowest point total allowed by the Lakers in the first quarter since the team moved to Los Angeles prior to the 1960-61 season

The Lakers and Trail Blazers met for the fourth time of the season as Portland evened the season series with a win, 127-115, on Monday night. The Lakers built an early nine-point lead in the first quarter, but the Blazers exploded for 10 triples in the frame to pull ahead. Portland finished the night with 23 3-pointers compared to just 12 such shots by the Lakers. Anthony Davis notched his 25th double-double of the season with 19 points, 20 rebounds, one assist and three blocks. Malik Beasley led the second unit with 22 points (6-12 3FG), two rebounds, one assist and two steals. D'Angelo Russell had 16 points, three rebounds and four assists, while Troy Brown Jr. tallied 13 points, one rebound, two assists and one steal. Austin Reaves also scored in double figures off the bench with 10 points, two rebounds and two assists. Damian Lillard guided the Blazers to the win with a game-high 40 points (8-14 3FG), six rebounds, five assists and one block.

In their first game of the In-Season Tournament Group Play, the Lakers stormed back in the fourth quarter to take down the Suns in Phoenix, 122-119. Los Angeles trailed by seven going into the final frame but used a 14-0 run in the fourth quarter to jump out to the lead and secure the road victory. LeBron James led the way for the purple and gold with a team-high 32 points (11-17 FG, 3-4 3FG, 7-11 FT) to go with 11 rebounds, six assists, one steal and one block in 36 minutes. Anthony Davis also recorded a double-double, his sixth of the season, with 18 points (5-14 FG, 8-8 FT), 11 rebounds, four assists and one block in 36 minutes. Cam Reddish, starting in place of Austin Reaves, hit five triples and dropped 17 points to give LA the spark they needed. Kevin Durant paced the Suns with 38 points (13-27 FG, 4-6 FG, 8-10 FT), nine rebounds and five assists in 39 minutes. The Lakers improved to 1-0 in Tournament play.

LeBron James led the way for LA with a team-high 32 points (11-17 FG, 3-4 3FG, 7-11 FT) to go with 11 rebounds, six assists, one steal and one block in 36 minutes, while Anthony Davis also recorded a double-double, his sixth of the season, with 18 points (5-14 FG, 8-8 FT), 11 rebounds, four assists and one block in 36 minutes. Cam Reddish, starting in place of Austin Reaves, hit five triples and dropped 17 points to give LA the spark they needed and snap their three-game losing streak. The Lakers sit at 1-0 in Western Group A, which consists of the Grizzlies, Suns, Jazz, and Trail Blazers. Each team will play four designated Group Play games – one game against each opponent in its group, with two games at home and two on the road.

CONQUERING LA: The Lakers ended their cold streak against their cross-town rivals LA Clippers with a dramatic overtime victory, 130-125. The win marked the purple and gold's first win over the Clippers since July 30, 2020, with eleven consecutive losses coming prior to their most recent matchup on Nov. 1, 2023 at Crypto.com Arena.

TWO DECADES: The Lakers vs. Kings matchup on Oct. 29 marked 20 years to the day since LeBron James played his first regular season NBA game. James made his long-anticipated NBA debut on Oct. 29, 2003 against the Sacramento Kings. The 18-year-old ended the night with 25 points, six rebounds, nine assists and four steals, good for his first of many 25-point games in his career. On the day that was 20 years since his debut, James recorded 27 points (11-19 FG, 3-8 3FG), 15 rebounds and eight assists in 39 minutes. James has scored 25+ points more times than any player in NBA history.

LOCKED DOWN THE BROW: On Aug. 6, the Lakers and eight-time NBA All-Star Anthony Davis agreed to a contract extension, keeping the 2020 NBA Champion with the purple and gold. Davis, who was originally acquired by Los Angeles on July 6, 2019, as part of a three-team trade before re-signing with the team on Dec. 3, 2020, has appeared in 194 regular season games (192 starts) across four seasons with the Lakers, averaging 24.6 points (52.4 FG%), 10.1 rebounds, 3.0 assists, 1.3 steals and 2.1 blocks in 34.0 minutes. During the recent 2022-23 season, Davis appeared in 56 games (54 starts) for the Lakers, averaging 25.9 points on a career-best 56.3 percent shooting from the floor, a career-high 12.5 rebounds, 2.6 assists, 1.1 steals and 2.0 blocks in 34.0 minutes per game. The 30-year-old became the first Lakers player since Shaquille O'Neal in 2000-01 to average at least 25.0 points, 12.0 rebounds and 2.0 blocks in a campaign.

CAN'T SPELL AUSTIN WITHOUT USA: After re-signing with the Lakers during the offseason, Austin Reaves was named to the 12-member USA Men's National Team that competed in the 2023 FIBA World Cup. Reaves averaged 13.8 points, 2.8 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 1.3 steals in 21.9 minutes across eight games for the red, white and blue. He scored a total of 110 points off the bench, the most by any reserve player in the tournament.

RUN IT BACK: The Lakers finished the 2022-23 season on a high note as they advanced to the Western Conference Finals as the seventh seed in the conference. Building on that momentum, Los Angeles retained key members of their core during the offseason. Rui Hachimura, Austin Reaves and D'Angelo Russell all re-signed with the purple and gold during free agency. After joining Los Angeles via trade from Washington on Jan. 23, Hachimura appeared in 33 games (nine starts) and averaged 9.6 points (.485 FG%) and 4.7 rebounds in 22.4 minutes per contest to end the 2022-23 regular season. In the 2022-23 campaign, Reaves appeared in 64 games (22 starts) for the Lakers, averaging 13.0 points (.529 FG%, .398 3P%), 3.0 rebounds and 3.4 assists in 28.8 minutes. Reaves joined Kevin Durant and Kawhi Leonard as the only players in the league to shoot at least 50.0 percent from the field, 39.0 percent from 3-point range and 85.0 percent from the free-throw line (min. 200 FTM). After joining Los Angeles via trade from Minnesota on Feb. 9, Russell appeared in 17 games (all starts), posting averages of 17.4 points (.484 FG%, .414 3P%), 2.9 rebounds and 6.1 assists in 30.9 minutes per game.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK: In addition to re-signing key members of last season's squad, the Lakers added to their core during free agency by signing Jaxson Hayes, Taurean Prince, Cam Reddish, Gabe Vincent and Christian Wood. Vincent returns to California after spending four seasons with the Miami Heat, most recently as their starting point guard en route to the NBA Finals. Prince will add another sharp-shooter to the roster as he has shot 37.2 percent from beyond the arc across seven seasons in the NBA. Hayes (8th overall) and Reddish (10th overall) were both selected in the lottery of the 2019 NBA Draft and will provide youth and depth to the Lakers roster. Wood is coming off a season with the Dallas Mavericks in which he averaged 16.6 points, 7.3 rebounds, 1.8 assists and 1.1 blocks per game while shooting 37.6 percent from 3-point range.

SUMMER STAR: Second-year guard Max Christie started his sophomore campaign during the 2023 Summer Leagues in Sacramento and Las Vegas and was named to the NBA 2K24 All-Summer League Second Team. Christie appeared in three games for the Lakers at NBA 2K24 Summer League in Las Vegas, averaging 19.0 points (45.7 FG%, 50.0 3P%, 100.0 FT%), 6.3 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 2.3 blocks in 32.2 minutes per game. Prior to Las Vegas, Christie appeared in two games for the Lakers at the 2023 California Classic in Sacramento, averaging 21.0 points (54.2 FG%, 62.5 3P%, 91.7 FT%), 5.0 rebounds, 4.0 assists and 1.0 steals in 31.2 minutes.

LEBRON LATEST

PLENTY OF TWENTY: LeBron James achieved yet another milestone in his 20th season as became the NBA's all-time leader in games with 20+ points. James recorded the 1,135th 20-point performance of his career on 10/28/22 at Minnesota, passing Karl Malone for the most such games in NBA history. James tallied a 37-game streak of 20-point games (11/6/22-2/15/23), good for the third longest streak of his career and longest since he had 38 straight 20-point games from April 15, 2012 through Jan. 8, 2013.

OH 3-0 MY: In addition to climbing the ranks of 20-point games, LeBron James is also approaching the all-time leaders in 30-point games. James passed Wilt Chamberlain for the second-most 30-point games in NBA history with a 33-point performance on 12/13 vs. Boston. Michael Jordan is now the only player in league history to have more 30-point outings than James.

DAILY DOUBLE DIGITS: LeBron James opened his 21st season in the NBA with two consecutive 21-point performances, ensuring that his double-digit scoring streak would continue.

- With a 26-point performance on his 36th birthday on Dec. 30, 2020, James extended his double-digit scoring streak to 1,000 consecutive games, becoming the first player in league history to reach that mark.
- James's double-digit scoring streak – which began on Jan. 6, 2007 – has far eclipsed Michael Jordan's previous NBA record of 866 consecutive 10-point performances from 1986-2001.
- James has finished with 10+ points in all but eight regular season contests in his career.
- In league history, there have only been seven streaks in which a player has finished in double figures in 500+ consecutive contests (see chart).

LEBRON IN THE NBA'S TOP-10 REGULAR SEASON WINS LIST: With a 133-129 in Milwaukee on Dec. 2, Lakers forward LeBron James tallied his 900th career regular season win, ranking seventh on the NBA's all-time victories list. James passed Dirk Nowitzki on Feb. 23, 2023 for sixth place on the list. The Akron, OH, native sits 25 wins away from moving past NBA legend Karl Malone for fifth all-time. The active leader in wins, James is one of seven players in NBA history to achieve the 900 career wins milestone.

LAST SEASON'S GAME NOTES

40 IN YEAR 20: LeBron James scored a game-high 40 points (15-25 FG, 4-7 3FG, 6-7 FT) to go with 10 rebounds, nine assists and two steals in 48 minutes in Game 4 against the Nuggets. James notched the 29th 40-point game of his postseason career, good for the second-most such games in NBA history (Michael Jordan, 38) and he became the oldest player in NBA history to score 40+ points in a playoff game (38 years, 143 days).

- James scored 31 points (11-13 FG, 4-4 3FG, 5-5 FT) in the first half, good for the most points he has scored in any half throughout his playoff career. It is tied for the most points scored by a Lakers player in a postseason half since Anthony Davis notched 31 points in the second half on August 29, 2020, vs. Portland. Since 1997, Davis and James are the only Lakers players to have 30+ points in a single half of a postseason game.

SERIES DUB: The Lakers notched their 42nd trip to the Western Conference Finals in franchise history as they beat the Golden State Warriors, 4-2, in the second round of the playoffs. Los Angeles became the second seven seed to ever make the Western Conference Finals and the first team to do so since the Seattle SuperSonics in the 1986-87 season. Darvin Ham is the 10th Head Coach in Lakers history to take the team to the Conference Finals in his first season with the franchise.

- LeBron James scored a team-high 30 points (10-14 FG, 2-3 3FG, 8-11 FT) to go with nine rebounds, nine assists, two steals and one block in Game 6. With the victory over the Warriors, James has now won 41 playoff series throughout his career, good for the most by any player in NBA history.
- Anthony Davis tallied 17 points (5-9 FG, 7-10 FT), 20 rebounds, three assists, two steals and two blocks in 40 minutes. Davis joins Ben Wallace as the only players to have 15+ points, 20+ rebounds, 2+ steals, 2+ blocks and zero turnovers in a playoff game.

PURPLE AND GOLD STANDARD: Anthony Davis finished with 30 points, 23 rebounds, five assists and four blocks in the Lakers' Game 1 win at the Warriors on Tuesday, May 2. Davis became the first Lakers player since Shaquille O'Neal (6/13/04) to tally at least 30 points and 20 rebounds in a playoff game.

- Davis is just the fifth Lakers player to do so in the postseason, joining Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Elgin Baylor, Wilt Chamberlain and O'Neal. Davis joined Tim Duncan as the only players in NBA history to have a game with 30+ points, 20+ rebounds, 5+ assists and 4+ blocks.
- Davis scored 23 points in the first half, good for the most points he has scored in the first half of a playoff game in his career.

POKED THE BEAR: The Lakers beat the Memphis Grizzlies by 40 points on April 28 to advance to the second round of the NBA Playoffs. The Lakers became just the sixth 7-seed in NBA history to beat a 2-seed in round one of the NBA Playoffs and the first to do so since San Antonio defeated Dallas in 2010.

- D'Angelo Russell notched a postseason career-high 31 points (12-17 FG, 5-9 3FG) to go with two rebounds, four assists, one steal and one block in 30 minutes. He scored 10 points (5-8 FG) in the first quarter and 14 points (5-6 FG, 4-5 3FG) in the third quarter, marking the seventh and eighth time he has posted 10+ points in a postseason quarter in his career.
- LeBron James recorded 22 points (9-13 FG, 2-5 3FG), five rebounds, six assists and one steal in 31 minutes. With the win, James has now won 40 playoff series in his career, tying Derek Fisher for most of all time.
- Anthony Davis posted 16 points (6-9 FG, 4-4 FT), 14 rebounds, one assist and five blocks in 28 minutes. Davis joined Kareem Abdul-Jabbar and Shaquille O'Neal as the only Lakers players to have at least 25 blocks in a six-game span in the postseason.

LEBOARDS: In Game 4 against the Grizzlies, LeBron James recorded 22 points, 20 rebounds, seven assists and two blocks in 45 minutes. The performance marked the first time that James has recorded 20 rebounds in any game throughout his NBA career.

- James became the first Lakers player to record 20+ points and 20+ rebounds in a playoff game since Shaquille O'Neal had 36 points and 20 rebounds on June 13, 2004. James also became the fifth Lakers player in the Los Angeles era to tally 20+ points and 20+ rebounds in a playoff game, joining Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, Elgin Baylor, Wilt Chamberlain and Shaquille O'Neal.
- James (38 years, 115 days old) is now the oldest player in NBA history to record 20+ points and 20+ rebounds in a regular season or postseason game, surpassing Wilt Chamberlain (36 years, 262 days old) who previously set the record on May 10, 1973.

HOME COOKING: The Lakers played in front of a sellout home crowd of 18,997 people for the first time in the playoffs since April 28, 2013, vs. San Antonio as they beat the Memphis Grizzlies, 111-101, in Game 3 of the first round.

- Los Angeles held a 35-9 lead after the first quarter. The 26-point lead is tied for the largest lead at the end of the first quarter in NBA Playoffs history and just the third time it has happened. It is the largest lead through one frame since Milwaukee held a 46-20 lead over Miami on May 24, 2021.
- Anthony Davis recorded a team-high 31 points (11-24 FG, 8-10 FT) and 17 rebounds to go with two assists, two steals and three blocks. Davis is the first Lakers player since Pau Gasol (March 20, 2008 vs. DEN) to have 30+ points, 15+ rebounds and 3+ blocks in a playoff game and is the first Lakers player to tally 15 blocks within three playoff games since Shaquille O'Neal in 2004. Davis joined Tim Duncan, Hakeem Olajuwon and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar as the only players since 1973 to have 65+ points, 35+ rebounds and 15+ blocks over their first three playoff games of a postseason.
- Rui Hachimura notched 16 points (6-10 FG, 2-2 3FG, 2-2 FT), five rebounds and one steal in 22 minutes off the bench, becoming the first Lakers player since Luke Walton (2008) to score 15+ points off the bench in three straight playoff games.

ROARING START: The Lakers started the 2023 NBA Playoffs with a statement 16-point victory over the Memphis Grizzlies on the road on April 16. Four Lakers players scored 20+ points in a playoff game for the first time since May 15, 1988 vs. Utah as Los Angeles took an early 1-0 series lead.

- Rui Hachimura scored 29 points (11-14 FG, 5-6 3FG) with six rebounds and one assist in 30 minutes off the bench. Hachimura's 29 points were tied for the most scored by a Lakers player off the bench in a playoff game with Mychal Thompson (5/1/88).
- Anthony Davis had 22 points, 12 rebounds, three assists, three steals and a playoff-career-high seven blocks in the win. Davis is the first player to have at least seven blocks and three steals in a playoff game since Draymond Green on May 9, 2016 and the first player to have 20+ points, 10+ rebounds, 7+ blocks and 3+ steals in a playoff game since Tim Duncan did so on June 6, 2003.
- LeBron James finished with 21 points, 11 rebounds, five assists, two steals and three blocks. The performance marked his 119th playoff game with 20+ points and 10+ rebounds, passing Shaquille O'Neal for the most-such games in NBA playoff history.

ENDING THE SEASON STRONG: Anthony Davis was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Month for games played in March and April, after averaging 26.2 points (.569 FG%), a league-leading 12.5 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 1.9 blocks in 35.5 minutes as the Lakers finished with a league-best 14-6 record.

- Davis scored in double figures in 17 of his 18 appearances, including 11 games with 20+ points, eight games with 30+ points and one 40-point performance. The eight-time NBA All-Star tallied 11 double-doubles in that span, including two games with 20+ rebounds.
- For the 2022-23 season, he recorded a league-leading 20 games with at least 15 rebounds and led all players with seven games of 35+ points and 15+ rebounds. Davis became the first Lakers player since Shaquille O'Neal (2000-01) to average at least 25.0 points, 12.0 rebounds and 2.0 blocks.

LAST SEASON'S GAME NOTES

ANOTHER DOMINANT WEEK: Anthony Davis was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for games played from Monday, March 27 to Sunday, April 2 after averaging 38.7 points (.652 FG%, .806 FT%), 11.7 rebounds, 1.7 assists, 1.0 steals and 2.0 blocks in three games as the Lakers finished the week 3-0 with road victories over Chicago, Minnesota and Houston.

- Davis recorded 38 points (13-20 FG, 11-14 FT), nine rebounds, four assists, two steals and two blocks in a 121-110 win at the Bulls on March 29. In a 123-111 victory over the Timberwolves on March 31 in Minnesota, Davis finished with 38 points (15-26 FG, 8-10 FT), 17 rebounds, one steal and two blocks, good for his league-leading seventh game of the season with 35+ points and 15+ rebounds.
- Davis closed out the week with 40 points (15-20 FG, 10-12 FT), nine rebounds, one assist and two blocks in a 134-109 victory at the Rockets on April 2. In the win, Davis became the first Lakers player since Shaquille O'Neal on March 21, 2003, to score 40+ points while shooting at least 75 percent from the field. Davis joined Gail Goodrich as the only Lakers players to accomplish the feat in 30 minutes or less.

cAREER HIGH: Austin Reaves scored a career-high 35 points (9-14 FG, 16-18 FT) to go with six rebounds and six assists in 31 minutes off the bench against the Magic on March 19. Reaves' 35 points is the most points by a Lakers player off the bench since Kentavious Caldwell-Pope scored 35 points on March 19, 2019 at Milwaukee. Reaves made a career-high 16 free throws on the night (16-18 FT), joining Lou Williams as the only Lakers players to make 16 free throws off the bench. Reaves and Williams are the only two Lakers players to tally 35+ points, 5+ rebound and 5+ assists off the bench, and Reaves is the first undrafted player in Lakers history to score at least 35 points in a game.

MORE THAN A SCORER: Amid his quest for the all-time scoring title, LeBron James moved into fourth place on the NBA's all-time assists list, passing Mark Jackson and Steve Nash with a 11-assist performance against the Knicks in Madison Square Garden. James is the only player to be in the top five of all-time scoring and assists in NBA history.

CROWNING ACHIEVEMENT: With his 12th field goal of the night against the Oklahoma City Thunder on Feb. 7, LeBron James passed Kareem Abdul-Jabbar to become the NBA's all-time leading scorer. James passed the Lakers Legend with a 14-foot turnaround fadeaway shot with 10.9 seconds remaining in the third quarter to reach the milestone and finished the night with 38 points, seven rebounds, three assists and three steals in 34 minutes. Abdul-Jabbar held the scoring record for 14,187 days (April 5, 1984 – Feb. 7, 2023), equivalent to 38 years, 10 months and two days.

ALL-TIME ALL-STAR: For the seventh consecutive season and the 10th time overall, LeBron James led all players in All-Star voting as he was named an All-Star for the 19th time in his career. His 19th straight selection passes Kobe Bryant for most all-time and his 19th overall selection ties him with Kareem Abdul-Jabbar for most selections in NBA history. A three-time NBA All-Star Game MVP and the contest's all-time leading scorer, James has started an NBA-record 19 straight All-Star games and has been named a captain in every year since the NBA switched to the current format, holding a 5-1 record as the team captain. James tallied 13 points, one rebound and four assists in this year's contest.



40 FOR 30: LeBron James scored a team-high 46 points (16-29 FG, 9-14 3FG, 5-5 FT) to go with eight rebounds, seven assists, two steals and one block in 33 minutes against the Clippers. With his 14th field goal of the night, James became the first player in NBA history to record a 40-point performance against all 30 NBA franchises. James made a career-high nine 3-pointers on 14 attempts from distance. With his career-high ninth 3-pointer of the night, LeBron James tied Jamal Crawford for ninth place on the NBA's all-time list of triples made (2,221).

BEST WESTERN REWARDS: LeBron James was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for the second time this season for games played Jan. 16 to Jan. 22 after averaging 35.0 points (.510 FG%), 9.0 rebounds, 7.0 assists and 1.3 blocks in four games as the Lakers finished the week 3-1 with victories over Houston, Memphis and Portland. The 18-time NBA All-Star owns a league-record 67 career weekly awards, including six weekly honors with Los Angeles. This marks his second weekly award of the season and first since Jan. 9 of 2023.

- To begin the week, James scored a season-high 48 points (16-26 FG, 5-10 3FG, 11-12 FT) with eight rebounds and nine assists in a win over the Rockets on Jan. 16, good for his third 40-point game of the season.
- In a home victory over the Grizzlies on Jan. 20, James recorded 23 points, nine rebounds, six assists, two steals and two blocks as the Lakers snapped the Grizzlies' franchise-best 11-game winning streak. James closed out the week with 37 points (14-24 FG), 11 rebounds, four assists and two blocks in a 121-112 win at the Trail Blazers on Jan. 22, overcoming a 25-point halftime deficit, tied for the second-largest halftime deficit overcome to win a game in Lakers' history. James passed Byron Scott for fourth place on the Lakers' all-time list of 3-pointers made in franchise history.

TWO TO'S: In a 140-132 win over the Houston Rockets on Jan. 16, the Lakers recorded a franchise-low two turnovers and became the eighth team in NBA history to commit two or fewer turnovers in a game. It is the first time a team had two or fewer turnovers since the Hawks on Dec. 31, 2021 and is the fewest turnovers in a game by the Lakers since they had three on March 14, 2011 vs. Orlando.

KING OF THE COAST: LeBron James was named NBA Western Conference Player of the Week for games played Jan. 2 to Jan. 8 after averaging 35.0 points (.548 FG%), 8.7 rebounds and 7.7 assists in three games as the Lakers finished the week 4-0 with victories over Charlotte, Miami, Atlanta and Sacramento.

- To start the week, James recorded 43 points (16-26 FG), 11 rebounds, six assists and one steal in a win at the Hornets on Jan. 2, good for his second 40-point game of the season. James joined Michael Jordan as the only players in NBA history to record consecutive 40-point games at age 35 or older.
- In a home win over the Hawks on Jan. 6, the 38-year-old recorded his 11th double-double of the season with 25 points, seven rebounds and 10 assists. James then recorded 37 points, eight rebounds, seven assists and one steal in a 136-134 road victory over the Kings on Jan. 7, extending the Lakers' current winning streak to five consecutive victories.

GOT FIVE ON IT: The Lakers picked up their first five-game winning streak since the end of the 2020-21 season as they beat the Sacramento Kings, 136-134, on Jan. 7 in Sacramento. Four different players scored 20+ points in the win, the first time that four Lakers players have scored 20+ in the same game since March of 2022, led by 37 points from LeBron James.
