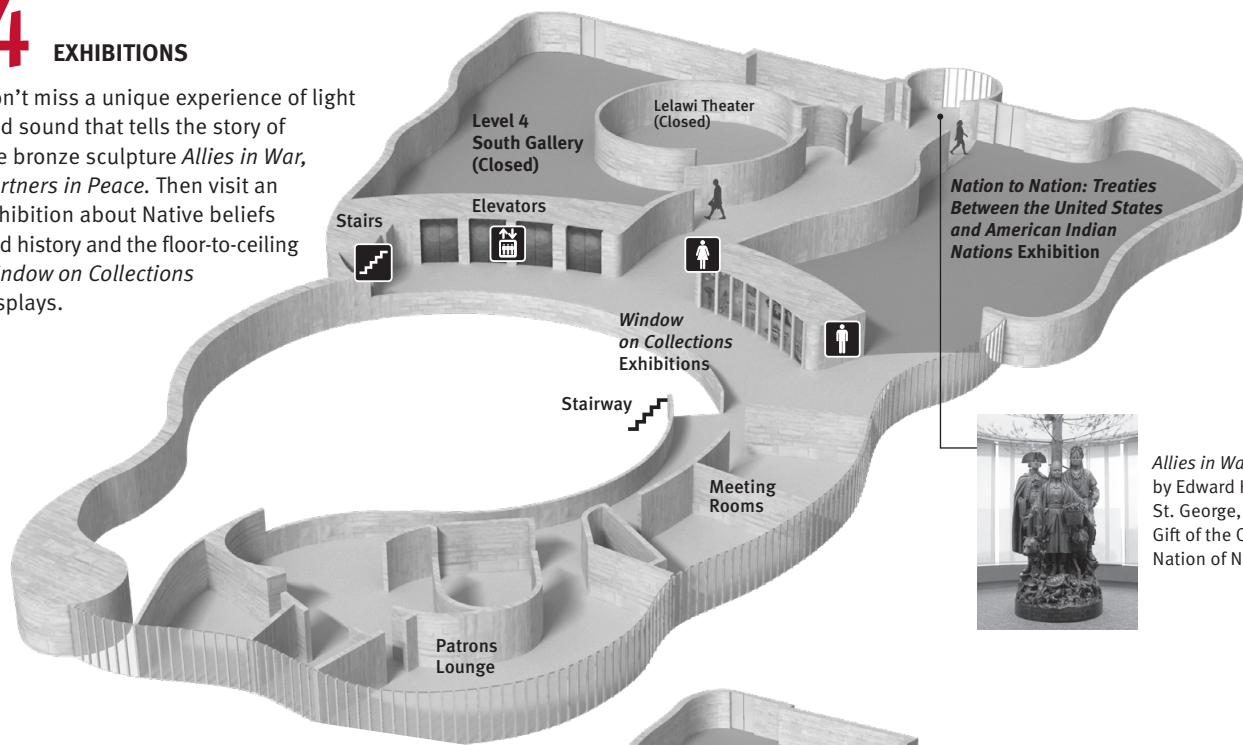

## 4 EXHIBITIONS

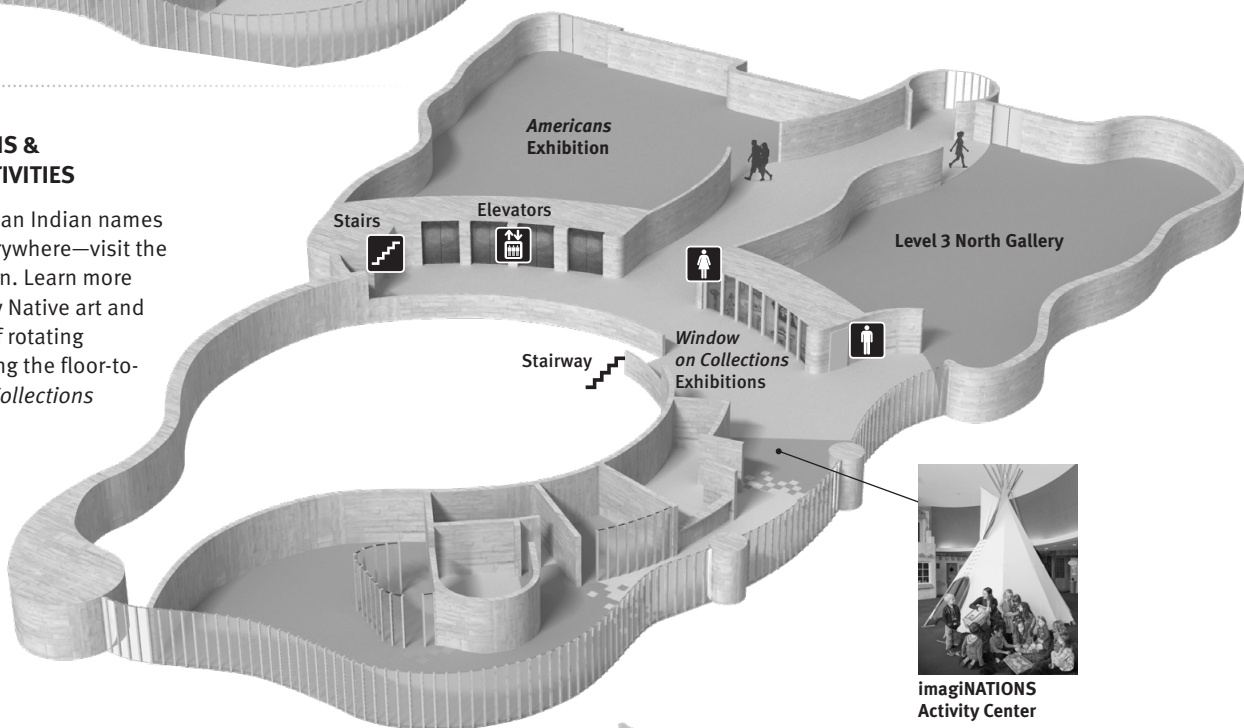

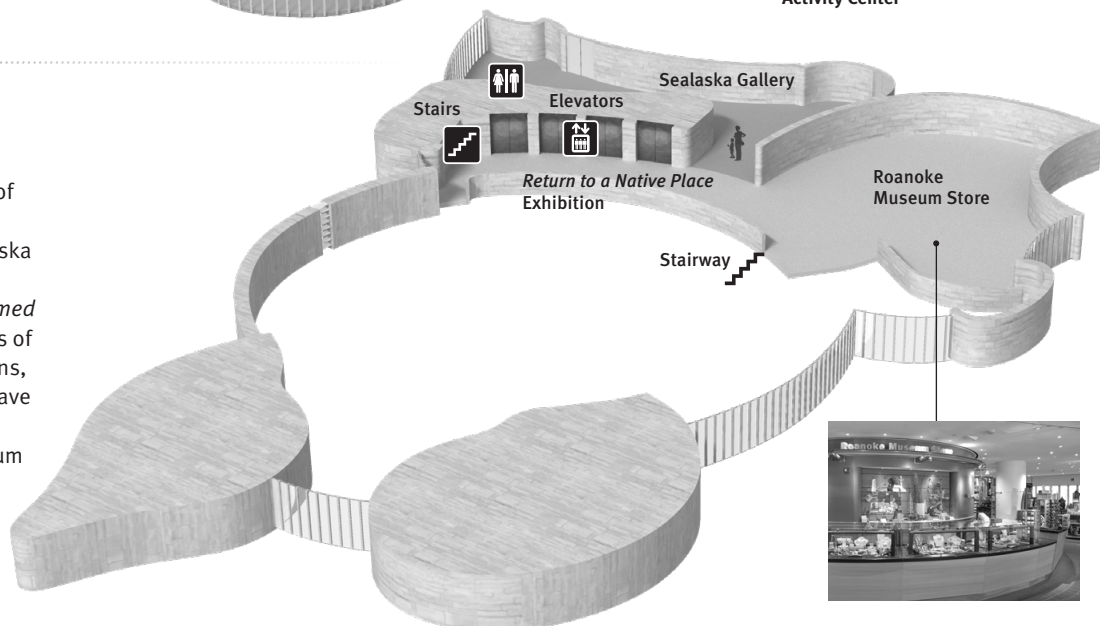

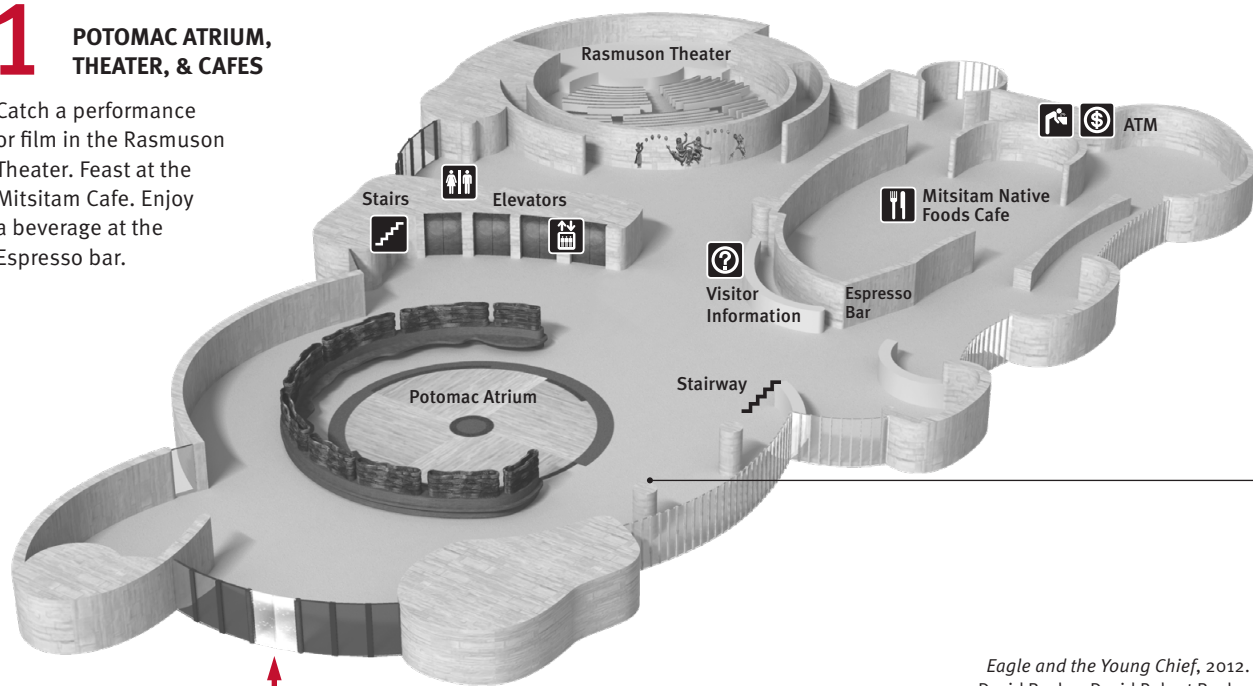
## 2 EXHIBITIONS & MUSEUM STORE
