### TEAM NOTES

- The Toronto Raptors defeated the Phoenix Suns 112-105 on Wednesday evening and have now won a season-high three consecutive games at Scotiabank Arena. The Raptors have won their last two games when playing their second game of a back-to-back and improve to 2-2 on the season in such games.
- Toronto continues their three-game homestand (Nov. 29 - Dec. 6) by playing host to the visiting New York Knicks on Friday on Giants of Africa Night. To celebrate 20 years of dedication to the youth of Africa and their renewed commitment to the journey ahead, Giants of Africa will be bringing together their community of supporters for the 'Dream Big Weekend' which will include a youth basketball clinic (Saturday), a fundraising gala (Sunday), and the game tonight which will kick off the through a special night of live performances, activations and in-game presentations showcasing African culture. Learn more at giantsafrica.org.
- Precious Achiuwa** — who was one of the youngest athletes to ever attend a Giants of Africa camp in Nigeria — played his best game of the season on Wednesday recording season highs of 14 points (5-10 FG, 1-1 3PT, 3-4 FT) and 10 rebounds in an efficient 18 minutes off the bench. It marks his first double-double of the season. The Raptors improve to 11-6 all-time when Achiuwa records a double-double.
- Scottie Barnes** came in clutch in the fourth quarter against the Suns scoring 12 of his 23 points (7-15 FG, 1-3 3PT, 8-8 FT) in the final frame. Barnes also added seven rebounds, four assists and three blocks in a game-high 38 minutes. He has made five-or-more field goals in his last 10 games (Nov. 13-29) marking the second longest such streak of his career. Barnes was a perfect 8-for-8 from the free throw line on Wednesday which is the most free throws he has made without a miss in a single-game over his career. Through 19 games this season, Barnes is averaging career highs of 19.1 points, 9.1 rebounds and 5.5 assists.
- Pascal Siakam** scored 22 points (9-21 FG, 3-3 FT) on Wednesday and has now recorded 20+ points in eight of his last nine games against the Suns. It was the eighth time Siakam has scored 20-or-more points this season as the Raptors improve to 6-2 in those games. In his last 10 games (Nov. 13-29), Siakam is averaging a team-high 22.3 points per game and shooting .512 (86-168) from the field in that span.
- The Raptors set a new franchise record on Wednesday for most assists (530) within a 20-game span to start the season, passing the previous best of 515 assists to start the 2019-20 campaign. The Raptors have recorded 25+ assists in 17 of 19 games played this season averaging 27.9 assists (tied for 4th in the league).

- Finished with 13 points, three rebounds, three steals, one assist and one block in 34 mins on Wednesday.
- Shooting .475 (84-177) from the field, including a career-best .415 (39-94) from three-point range this season.
- Has six games of two-or-more steals this season (2nd on team); Had 36 games of 2+ steals last season.

**F - PASCAL SIAKAM #43** MIN: 34.3 REB: 7.1 AST: 5.1 STL: 0.79 TO: 2.6 BLK: 0.21 PTS: 19.9

- Recorded 22 points, nine rebounds, three assists and one steal in 36 minutes against the Suns.
- Has scored 20+ points eight times this season including 30+ twice; Raptors are 6-2 in those games.
- Averaged 28.5 pts, 9.3 rbs and 6.8 assists vs. NYK last season; Scored career-high 52 pts at MSG Dec. 21.

**C - JAKOB POELTL #19** MIN: 26.6 REB: 8.3 AST: 2.4 STL: 0.89 TO: 1.7 BLK: 1.00 PTS: 11.3

- Tallied 17 points, four rebounds, one assist and one block in 30 minutes of action on Wednesday night.
- Ranks first in NBA in FG% (.733); Has shot .600 from the field in 11 straight games (longest active streak).
- Made first six field goal attempts in a game for the third time this season; Only five others have two such games.

**G - SCOTTIE BARNES #4** MIN: 34.3 REB: 9.1 AST: 5.5 STL: 1.63 TO: 2.3 BLK: 1.32 PTS: 19.1

- Scored a team-high 23 points and added seven rebounds, four assists and three blocked shots vs. Suns.
- One of four players in the league to average 19/9/5 joining Joel Embiid, Nikola Jokic and Julius Randle.
- Has made at least one three-point field goal in a career-high nine consecutive games (Nov. 15-29).

**G - DENNIS SCHRÖDER #17** MIN: 31.3 REB: 3.1 AST: 6.9 STL: 0.95 TO: 1.7 BLK: 0.11 PTS: 16.2

- Recorded season-high 12 assists and added eight points, six rebounds and one steal in 34 minutes Nov. 29.
- Has led the team in single-game assists 10 times this season; Tied for ninth in the NBA in assists per game (6.9)
- Became the fastest Raptor to record 300+ points and 100+ assists in franchise history (19 games).

**TORONTO** — Scottie Barnes scored 12 of his 23 points in the fourth quarter, Pascal Siakam finished with 22 and the Toronto Raptors beat Phoenix 112-105 on Wednesday night to end the Suns' winning streak at seven ... Kevin Durant scored 11 of his 30 points in the fourth quarter for Phoenix after missing two games because of a sore foot, while fellow star Devin Booker had only eight points. The Suns lost for the first time since a Nov. 12 loss at home against Oklahoma City ... Durant made 11 of 30 attempts and shot 2 for 8 from beyond the arc. He has scored 30 or more points in six straight games, the longest active streak in the NBA ... Booker hobbled to the bench early in the second half after stepping on Dennis Schroder's foot, but was able to return ... Booker, who beat New York on Sunday night with a 3-pointer with 1.7 seconds left, missed a 3 that would have tied it with 50 seconds remaining ... Booker shot 2 for 12, going 0 for 4 on 3-pointers ... Jusuf Nurkic had 19 points and 14 rebounds for the Suns, who shot 7 for 26 from 3-point range, matching their fewest made 3-pointers this season ... Eric Gordon and Josh Okogie each scored 10 points but Phoenix lost despite outsourcing Toronto 28-14 on second-chance points ... Schroder had a season-high 12 assists to help the Raptors win for the first time in three games. Precious Achiuwa had 14 points and 10 rebounds, Jakob Poeltl scored 17 points, and O.G. Anunoby and Gary Trent Jr. each had 13.

**NEW YORK** — Spencer Dinwiddie scored 23 points to lead the Brooklyn Nets to a 115-103 win over the Toronto Raptors ... Dinwiddie was one of five players to finish in double-figure scoring for Brooklyn (9-8) ... Mikal Bridges scored 22 points, Cameron Johnson and Royce O'Neale had 18 apiece, and Nic Claxton chipped in with 15 ... Brooklyn entered the last day of tournament group play needing to win by at least 15 points and for the Celtics to beat Chicago by less than 21 in order to clinch Group C and advance to the knockout round of the inaugural tournament ... Boston routed Chicago 124-97 ... Despite having six players finish in double-figure scoring, Toronto dropped to 8-10 ... Pascal Siakam and Scottie Barnes had 17 each and Gary Trent Jr. finished with 15 off the bench ... Dennis Schroder added 14, Chris Boucher contributed 13 and OG Anunoby had 10 ... Trent tied the game at 94-all with a jumper in the lane with 4:30 remaining ... On the next possession, Bridges converted a floater and knocked down a free throw to give Brooklyn a three-point lead ... That was quickly cut to 97-96 on another Trent jumper ... After a timeout, Bridges knocked down a 3 from the left corner to extend Brooklyn's lead ... Two Johnson free throws stretched the advantage to six, before Barnes' tip-in allowed the Raptors to close to 102-98 ... The Nets went up by five on a Claxton free throw, only for Barnes to cut the deficit to three on a pair of free throws.

**TORONTO** — Pascal Siakam scored 26 points, Scottie Barnes had 22 points and a career-high 12 assists and the Toronto Raptors beat the Miami Heat 106-92 on Tuesday night ... O.G. Anunoby scored 22 points, and Precious Achiuwa and Fred VanVleet each had 12 as Toronto won for the 10th time in 11 home games ... The ninth-place Raptors evened their record at 38-38, reaching .500 for the first time since they were 13-13 on Dec. 9. Miami played without leading scorer Jimmy Butler, who sat because of a sore neck. Knocked out of the sixth spot by Sunday's 129-100 home loss to Brooklyn, the Heat fell a half-game behind the Nets. Toronto outscored the Heat and 23-10 on fast-break points and 62-36 on points in the paint. Tyler Herro scored 33 points and Bam Adebayo had 21 points and 12 rebounds as Miami lost its second straight. Former Raptor Kyle Lowry had six points and five rebounds in 24 minutes. The sellout crowd of 19,800 responded with a warm ovation when Lowry checked in to start the second quarter. Toronto won three of four against Miami, winning the season series for the first time since a 4-0 sweep in 2018-19.

## ADDITIONAL TEAM NOTES ...

- The Raptors set a new franchise record for most assists (530) within a 20-game span to start the season (Previous best: 515 assists; 2019-20).
- Toronto set a franchise record recording 25+ assists in 12 straight games (Nov. 1-24), averaging 30.2 assists over this span.
- The Toronto Raptors recorded a single-game franchise record 44 assists Nov. 19 vs. Detroit. Toronto became the first team since 1991-92 with 44-or-more assists and eight or fewer turnovers.
- The Raptors scored a season-high 142 points shooting .539 (55-for-102) from the field. It marked the fifth time in franchise history that the Raptors have scored 140-or-more points in a game and set a franchise-high for points at home.
- Gradey Dick** made his NBA debut Oct. 25 becoming the fourth youngest Raptor to play in a regular season game (19 years 339 days). Only Tracy McGrady (18 years 160 days), Bruno Caboclo (19 years 61 days) and Chris Bosh (19 years 219 days) were younger when making their Raptors debut.
- Toronto's opening night roster featured seven international players (Achiuwa - Nigeria, Anunoby - England, Boucher - Canada, Koloko - Cameroon, Poeltl - Austria, Schröder - Germany, Siakam - Cameroon) which is the second-most in the league along with San Antonio. Dallas and Oklahoma City featured a league-high eight.
- The Raptors re-signed **Jakob Poeltl** to a multi-year contract this offseason. Poeltl was originally picked ninth overall by Toronto in the 2016 NBA Draft, before being traded to San Antonio along with DeMar DeRozan and a protected 2019 first round draft pick in exchange for Kawhi Leonard and Danny Green in July 2018. Poeltl was reacquired from San Antonio at last year's NBA Trade Deadline (Feb. 9) for Khem Birch, a protected 2024 first round draft pick and second round draft picks in 2023 and 2025. Poeltl averaged 13.1 points, 9.1 rebounds and 27.2 minutes in 26 games (25 starts) with the Raptors last season. He shot .629 (389-618) from the field, which ranked ninth in the NBA.
- Rookie guard **Markquis Nowell** signed a two-way contract with Toronto on July 3 following a successful five-year collegiate career (2018-23). Nowell finished last season ranked second nationally in assists per game (8.3), total assists (297) and total steals (92) and was named the 2023 Bob Cousy Award Winner, which is presented annually to the top point guard in Division I men's basketball. Nowell also earned All-Big 12 First Team honours and was voted to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team for the second straight year.
- Free agent **Jalen McDaniels** signed a multi-year contract with the Raptors on July 6. McDaniels spent the 2022-23 campaign with Philadelphia and Charlotte, averaging 9.4 points, 4.3 rebounds, 1.6 assists and 23.9 minutes in 80 games (24 starts).

# DARKO RAJAKOVIĆ

## HEAD COACH

The passion Darko Rajaković (rye-AHK-oe-vich) has for the game of basketball has led him around the world. From Madrid, Spain to Tulsa, Oklahoma, each of these experiences have added to Rajaković's beliefs and philosophies, shaping him into the coach, father, and leader he is today.

Raised in Serbia during a civil war, Rajaković fell in love with basketball during a time of unrest in his homeland. The basketball court became his safe haven, a place where he and his friends could gather and play until the wee hours of the morning.

It was fitting Rajaković started his coaching career in his hometown of Cacak, Serbia. At just 16 years of age, he embarked on a life-long journey of teaching others a game that brought him such joy. This started with the local Borac Cacak Youth Team in 1996. After three seasons with the club, he was named the head coach of the U20 and U18 teams of Red Star Belgrade, leading Red Star to two Serbian Youth championships during his eight-year tenure (1999-2007).

Rajaković then ventured to Spain where he coached Espacio Torrelodones for three successful seasons (2009-12). In his first year with the franchise, he led the team to the championship of the Primera Division de Baloncesto in Madrid.

From 2004-11, Rajaković held his first formal job with an NBA team, serving as a European scouting consultant and NBA Summer League assistant coach for the San Antonio Spurs.

His time in Serbia, Spain and San Antonio ultimately led Rajaković to the Oklahoma City Thunder, where he spent seven seasons (2012-19). Rajaković joined the organization in 2012 as the head coach of the Tulsa 66ers – the franchise's then NBA G League affiliate, and became the first head coach born outside of North America in league history. Under his guidance, the team went 51-49 (.510) over two seasons and reached the 2013 G League semifinals. In 2014, Rajaković was honoured as one of Oklahoma City's assistant coaches at the NBA All-Star game in New Orleans.

Rajaković transitioned from the G League to the NBA at the start of the 2014-15 campaign, in what would be his first of five seasons as an assistant coach with the Thunder (2014-19). Oklahoma City averaged 49 wins during his time on the coaching staff and earned four playoff appearances - including a trip to the 2016 Western Conference Finals.

Rajaković also spent time in the NBA as an assistant coach with the Phoenix Suns (2019-20) and Memphis Grizzlies (2020-23), before being named the 10th head coach in Toronto Raptors history in June of 2023. This promotion made him just the second European-born head coach in the history of the NBA.

On the international stage, Rajaković was as an assistant coach for Serbia at the 2019 FIBA World Cup in China, helping his country to a fifth place finish at the tournament, which included a win over the United States in the classification round.

Rajaković prides himself on being a life-long learner. He earned a basketball coaching degree from the Belgrade Basketball Academy in 2004 and a degree in sports management from Alfa BK University in Belgrade in 2006.

He and his wife, Gaga, reside in Toronto with their five-year-old son, Luka.
