



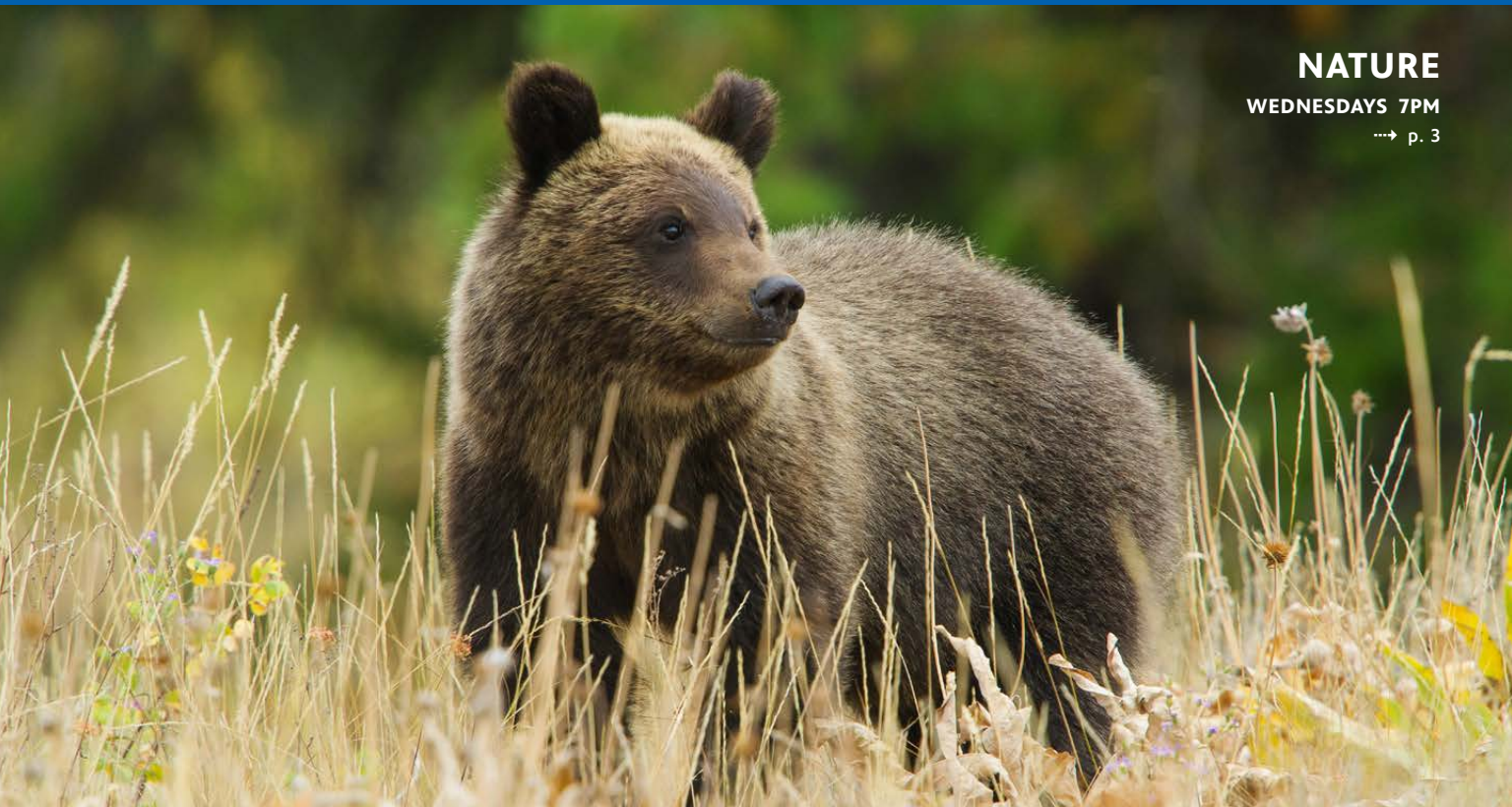

Horse competitions can be cutthroat, but we found one focused on good, old-fashioned family fun. Join us for a weekend of “O-Mok-See” in Canyon Creek, and meet the passionate family who built an arena on their property to ensure this 80-year tradition continues. Next, we’ll head to one of Butte’s most storied neighborhoods. Even though Meaderville is no longer physically accessible, we’ll get a taste of it through a sauce recipe that’s been preserved for generations. We’ll lace up our hiking boots to explore the Hole-in-the-Wall hike in the Mission Canyon on the Fort Belknap Reservation. Finally, we’ll meet a group of dedicated folks in far northeastern Montana who annually share performing arts with the community in Antelope, Montana. This spread of stories comes together as John Twigg hosts from the bustling Schmeckfest event, a German festival of tasting that fills the high school gymnasium every March in rural Lustre.

C. M. Russell and the American West: I Got the Cream At age 16 Charles M. Russell leaves his home in St. Louis to make his way as a cowboy in Montana. He meets mountain men, wranglers, and settles into a job as a nighthawk with the horses. His talents with drawing, sculpting and stories make him a popular companion at the campfire. A tough winter inspires a drawing that will make CMR famous. *Airs 5/5 11pm*

C. M. Russell and the American West: Sum of the Parts Charlie Russell gives up his spurs and lariat for brushes and paint. He also gives up the cowboy "sporting life" when he meets Nancy Cooper, a young woman who will make sure the world recognizes Charlie as a real artist. *Airs 5/12 11pm*

Higgins Ridge On August 4, 1961, the U.S. Forest Service sent 20 of its most elite firefighters - smokejumpers - to parachute into the Idaho wilderness to put out a wildfire burning on a mountain ridge. What looked like a routine fire from the air became a different story on the ground, as wind fueled the blaze into a blowup. The smokejumpers, many in their first season on the job, pivoted from battling the fire to fighting for their lives as the fire surrounded them. While they instinctively wanted to run to safety, they remembered the fate of 13 firefighters who unsuccessfully tried to outrun a fire in Montana's Mann Gulch 12 years earlier. With that tragedy in mind, the 1961 smokejumpers decided to shelter in place. Skilled backcountry pilot Rod Snider set out to find them in a Bell helicopter, but flying conditions were treacherous due to the wind, and visibility was poor due to the smoke. Now in his 90s, Snider revisits the unimaginable saga seared into his memory, revealing a story about bravery and brotherhood. *Airs 5/13 3am; 5/19 10am*

C. M. Russell and the American West: My Medicine is Strong Now Charles M. Russell's art expands in technique, color, storytelling and, thanks to Nancy, value. The American Indian point of view often dominates his canvases while he helps Hollywood build the myth of the West on film. *Airs 5/19 11pm*

Native Ball: Legacy of a Trailblazer A Native American girl from an isolated Blackfeet reservation uses her basketball skills as a ticket to a college education and the opportunity to give back to her people. Her chief described her as "a warrior." *Airs 5/30 7pm*

Story of Us: The Women Who Shaped Montana This documentary examines the extraordinary lives of three women who came from humble beginnings and achieved incredible feats despite obstacles and tragedies along the way. Women have always played important developmental roles in the history of Montana, but often have their contributions overshadowed. The stories of Sarah Bickford,

Maggie Smith Hathaway, and Susie Walking Bear Yellowtail are individually unique, but all feature a strong Montana woman aspiring to do better and be better. It is time to celebrate their achievements, understand their faults, be inspired by their determination, and applaud the spirit that drove them to help change and shape Montana. This is a production by North by Northwest and The Extreme History Project, with support from The Montana History Foundation, Humanities Montana, The Montana Film Office, and The Greater Montana Foundation. *Airs 5/30 7:30pm; 6/3 2:30am*

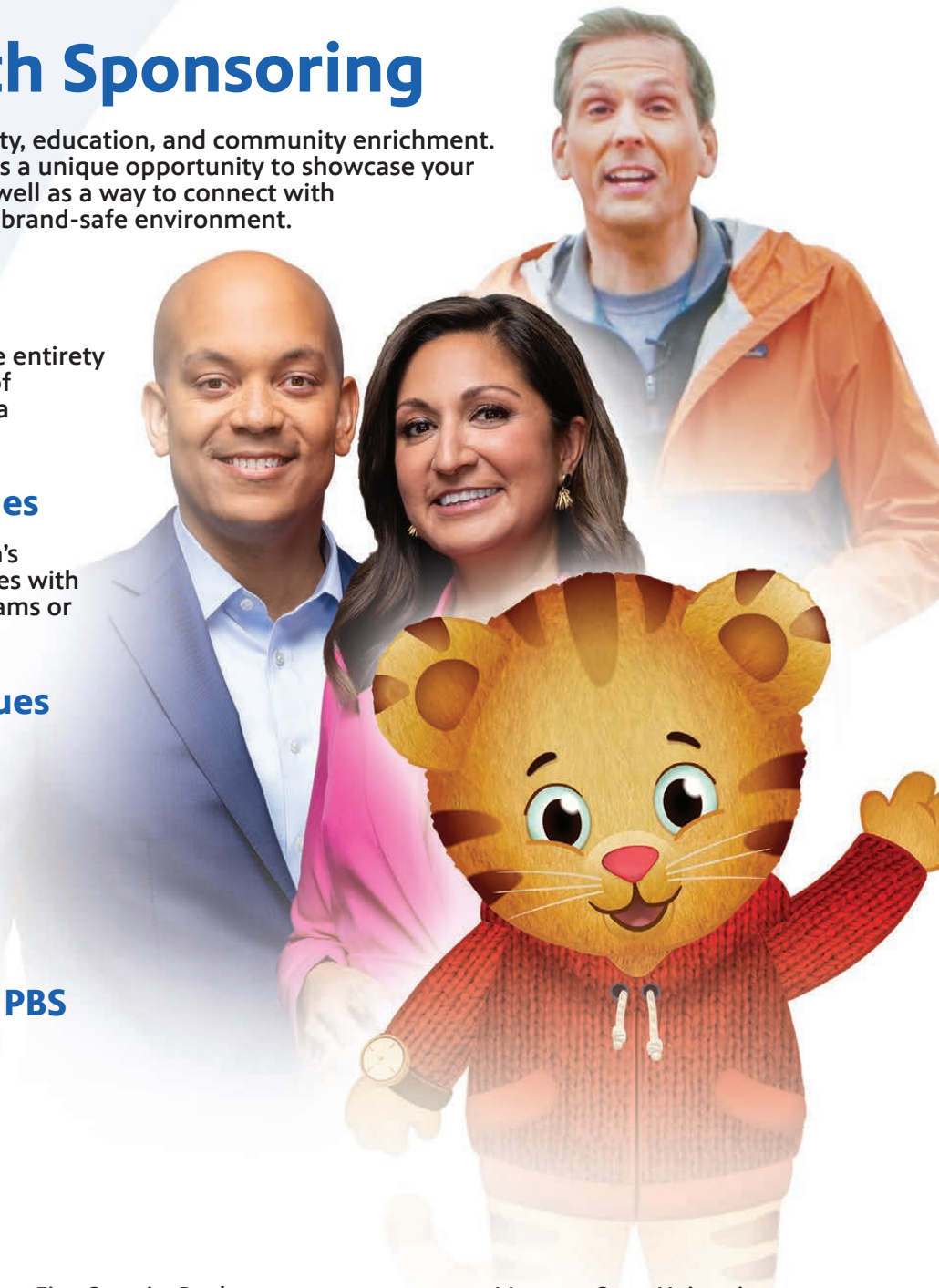
